- district, county, city or town thereof, nor any teacher or trustee 14
- of any public school, shall be interested in the sale, proceeds or 15
- profits of any books, apparatus or furniture to be used in any 16
- 17 public school in this state. Penalties shall be provided by law
- for the violation of this section. 18
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this amendment shall be 19
- submitted to the qualified electors at an election to be held on 20
- the first Tuesday after the first Monday of November 2004 as 21
- provided by Section 273 of the Constitution and by law. 22
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of the amendment 23
- 24 for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed
- constitutional amendment repeals the provision which prohibits 25
- teachers, school board members and other local officials from 26
- 27 having an interest in profits from the sale of textbooks,
- apparatus or furniture to be used in any public school in this 2.8
- 29 state."
