1 2 3 4	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING COLONEL L.M. CLAIBORNE, JR., THE FIRST AFRICAN-AMERICAN TO BE APPOINTED ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND DIRECTOR OF THE HIGHWAY SAFETY PATROL.
5	WHEREAS, on January 11, 2003, Colonel L.M. Claiborne, Jr. was
6	appointed as the Interim Assistant Commissioner of the Department
7	of Public Safety/Interim Director of the Mississippi Highway
8	Safety Patrol. On February 3, 2000, he was appointed by
9	Commissioner David R. Huggins as the Assistant Commissioner of the
10	Department of Public Safety/Director of the Mississippi Highway
11	Safety Patrol and promoted to the rank of Colonel; and
12	WHEREAS, he has served with the Mississippi Highway Safety
13	Patrol for over 23 years. Colonel Claiborne is the first
14	African-American to be appointed Assistant Commissioner of the
15	Department of Public Safety/Director of the Mississippi Highway
16	Safety Patrol in the agency's 65-year history; and
17	WHEREAS, Colonel Claiborne graduated with honors from S.V.
18	Marshall High School in Tchula, Mississippi, in 1975. He then
19	served in the United States Army Infantry from 1975 to 1979.
20	Following his discharge from the Army, Colonel Claiborne served 22
21	years with the Mississippi Army National Guard, Troop A 98th
22	Calvary, Louisville, Mississippi, before retiring in 2001. He
23	continued his education while in the military by attending Fort
24	Stillcum Community College in Tacoma, Washington, and Holmes
25	Community College in Goodman, Mississippi; and
26	WHEREAS, Colonel Claiborne began his career with the
27	Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol in December 1980, as a Trooper
28	assigned to Troop H, Louisville, Mississippi. He was promoted to

the rank of Trooper First Class in December 1985 and in December
1987 to the rank of Staff Sergeant assigned as the Accident

31 Reconstructionist in Troops H and G. In March 1989, Colonel

32 Claiborne was among the first Highway Patrol Officers to attend

33 training for and become a Crime Scene Investigator with the rank

34 of Sergeant First Class; and

WHEREAS, in July 1994, Colonel Claiborne became a Master

36 Sergeant, Assistant Troop Commander, for Troop G in Starkville,

37 Mississippi. Throughout his career, Colonel Claiborne has served

38 as a Tactical Training Officer for several Mississippi Highway

39 Safety Patrol Cadet Classes. In April 1996, he was promoted to

40 the rank of Captain over the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol

41 Training Division. Many of the Officers he has trained continue

42 to serve the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol. Colonel Claiborne

43 also served as a member of the elite Mississippi Highway Safety

44 Patrol Honor Guard; and

WHEREAS, as the Assistant Commissioner for the Department of

46 Public Safety, Colonel Claiborne assists the Commissioner of

47 Public Safety in overseeing the operations of the Department of

48 Public Safety. In his capacity as the Director of Mississippi

49 Highway Safety Patrol, Colonel Claiborne appoints the directors of

50 and is responsible for the operations of the Office of Mississippi

51 Highway Safety Patrol, which consists of the Bureau of Uniform

52 Enforcement, the Mississippi Bureau of Investigations, the Driver

53 Services Bureau and various specialized divisions. He is also

54 responsible for the operations of the Office of the Mississippi

55 Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy. There are

56 approximately 500 sworn officers and approximately 290 civilian

57 employees under his command; and

58 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize the

59 singular achievement of this career law enforcement officer who

60 serves as a role model for his fellow troopers and brings honor to

61 the officers and civilians of the Mississippi Department of Public

- 62 Safety and the Highway Patrol, and to the State of Mississippi:
