At the 18 time of her death, she was the organization's High Priestess; and 19 20 WHEREAS, very active as a community volunteer, Mrs. Cockrell had served as Chairman of the Board of the Boys and Girls Club of 21 22 Jackson and was a volunteer in several successful local and 23 statewide political campaigns; and WHEREAS, Mrs. Cockrell was the daughter of the late Houston 24 25 J. Jones and Mossie Oatis Jones of Shivers and the sister of the late Victor Jones of Slidell, Louisiana, and the late Beulah Mae 26 Campeer of Shivers. She is survived by her husband of 58 years, 27
