14	leading manufacturer of upscale kitchen appliances for the home,
15	which serves the North American market, as well as over 70 other
16	countries throughout the world. Prior to founding Viking, Mr.
17	Carl was a fourth generation building contractor, having been a
18	design/build general contractor throughout his entire adult
19	career. Mr. Carl is a member of the National Kitchen & Bath
20	Association Hall of Fame and was selected as the Mid-South
21	Entrepreneur of the Year in 1996. He is a member of the Advisory
22	Board of Directors of Trustmark National Bank of Greenwood,
23	Mississippi; and
24	WHEREAS, in the late 1970s Mr. Carl noticed that more and

more upscale consumers, and especially celebrities and serious

gourmets, were installing commercial restaurant ranges in the

kitchens of their homes. When Mr. Carl and his wife, Margaret,
