- WHEREAS, each year President Bush has proposed and Congress
- 5 has enacted a tax cut designed to strengthen the American economy
- 6 and increase employment opportunities for working families; and
- 7 WHEREAS, tax cuts signed into law reduced income taxes for
- 8 all taxpayers, eliminated the marriage penalty and Death Tax,
- 9 increased the child credit rebate and business expensing, expanded
- 10 Individual Retirement Accounts and cut the double taxation of
- 11 dividends and capital gains; and
- 12 WHEREAS, economic growth stemming from the latest tax cut
- 13 accelerated at its fastest rate in 20 years in the third quarter
- 14 of 2003; and
- 15 WHEREAS, provisions set forth in the tax cut are set to
- 16 expire starting in 2005 and will be completely phased out by the
- 17 year 2012; and
- 18 WHEREAS, expiration of the existing tax cuts will increase
- 19 taxes by 50% for lower income families, the child credit will fall
- 20 by 50%, the marriage penalty will be reinstated, education savings
- 21 will be taxed, retirement savings will shrink, and every taxpayer
- 22 will face an income tax increase; and
- 23 WHEREAS, expiration of the existing tax cuts will result in
- 24 the largest tax increase in American history and stifle economic
- 25 growth; and
- 26 WHEREAS, making all the tax cuts permanent will allow
- 27 taxpayers to feel more confident investing in their children's

- 29 increased economic growth:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 31 MISSISSIPPI, That the Senate of the State of Mississippi requests

- 33 Congress support and vote to make President Bush's tax cuts
