SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 30

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES SENATORS OF THE 1 STATE OF MISSISSIPPI TO SUPPORT A FLOOR VOTE FOR PRESIDENT BUSH'S 2 3 JUDICIAL NOMINEES. WHEREAS, Article II, Section 2 of the United States 4 Constitution states, "the President shall nominate, and by and 5 with the Advice and Consent of the Senate, shall appoint 6 Ambassadors, other public Ministers and Consuls, Judges of the 7 8 Supreme Court, and all other Officers of the United States"; and WHEREAS, the Administrative Office of the United States 9 Courts has classified 22 judgeships as "judicial emergencies"; and 10 WHEREAS, forty-three of President George W. Bush's judicial 11 12 nominees are pending before the United States Senate; and 13 WHEREAS, sixty-three percent of President Bush's Court of Appeals nominations have been to fill seats classified as judicial 14 15 emergencies; and 16 WHEREAS, forty-two percent of President Bush's District Court nominations have been to fill seats classified as judicial 17 18 emergencies; and WHEREAS, a minority of Senators have used dilatory tactics to 19 20 prevent a Senate floor vote on six of President Bush's judicial 21 nominees, all of whom were reported favorably by the Committee on 22 the Judiciary; and WHEREAS, each of President Bush's judicial nominees reported 23 favorably by the Committee on the Judiciary enjoys the support of 24 a majority of the United States Senate, as is required by the 25

26 United States Constitution:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby request our United States Senators
in the United States Congress to work to allow a timely vote on
the floor of the United States Senate on all judicial nominations.
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be
transmitted to the Mississippi congressional delegation.
