SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 51

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE AND LEGACY OF PUBLIC SERVICE
2 OF MR. JOHN H. LEE, PRESIDENT AND FOUNDER OF MISSISSIPPI PRODUCTS,
3 INC., AND EXPRESSING THE SYMPATHY OF THE SENATE.

4 WHEREAS, Mr. John H. Lee, President and Founder of
5 Mississippi Products, Inc., has passed away; and

6 WHEREAS, Mr. Lee was a graduate of Alcorn State University,
7 with a degree in Industrial Management, and earned a Master's
8 Degree in Business Administration from Mississippi College. Mr.
9 Lee had an auspicious career in manufacturing and human resources.
10 His employment history started at Ford Motor Company as a member
11 of the Manufacturing Management Team. He also served a
12 fourteen-year tenure as a Human Resources Manager at Siemens
13 Entergy and Automation, and as Corporate Human Resources Manager
14 and Plant Manager at Multicraft Enterprises; and

15 WHEREAS, in May 1988, Mr. Lee helped establish Craft-Co, a
16 minority owned venture that manufactures electrical assemblies for
17 the automotive industry. Mr. Lee served as Craft-Co's President
18 and General Manager until starting his own company, Mississippi
19 Products, Inc. (MPI); and

20 WHEREAS, in November 1992, Mississippi Products, Inc., began
21 operation in Pearl, Mississippi, with one employee, John H. Lee.
22 Approximately one year later, MPI moved to Jackson, Mississippi,
23 and located in the Jackson Enterprise Center as an incubator
24 tenant. In 1999, the company moved to its own building,
25 increasing office and warehouse space from 4,000 square feet to
26 more than 14,000 square feet. In 2002, Mississippi Products,
27 Inc., soared to greater heights by operating an additional

28 location in Gulfport, Mississippi. MPI currently employs 11
29 full-time employees with annual sales of approximately \$3 Million.
30 Mississippi Products, Inc., is a full service distributor of
31 medical, surgical and janitorial supplies, laboratory equipment,
32 safety products and industrial products. MPI serves a diversified
33 group of customers across the Southeastern United States; and

34 WHEREAS, Mr. John H. Lee served in many capacities within the
35 Greater Metropolitan area of Jackson, Mississippi: Chairman of
36 the Mississippi Minority Business Alliance; Member of the Jackson,
37 Mississippi, Rotary Club; Chairman of the Small Minority-Owned
38 Business Council Metro Jackson, Mississippi, Chamber of Commerce;
39 Board member of the Andrew Jackson Council Boy Scouts, U.S.A.; and

40 WHEREAS, his honors and awards are well documented: 2002
41 U.S. Small Business Administration Minority Small Business Person
42 of the Year; 2000 Mississippi Minority Business Alliance Pioneer
43 Award; 1998 Mississippi Fast 40 Fastest Growing Private Companies;
44 1997 Atlanta Regional Minority Supplier Distributor Firm of the
45 Year; 1997 Metro Jackson Chamber of Commerce Outstanding Small
46 Business. In addition, Mr. Lee was nominated for the following
47 awards: 2003 Inner City 100 Award presented by Mayor Harvey
48 Johnson, Jr., City of Jackson, Mississippi; 2002 Ernst & Young,
49 Entrepreneur of the Year Award, New Orleans, Louisiana; and

50 WHEREAS, Mr. Lee's dedicated public service was an
51 inspiration to the citizens of his community and the State of
52 Mississippi:

53 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
54 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commend the life and legacy of
55 public service of Mr. John H. Lee, President and Founder of
56 Mississippi Products, Inc., and extend to his surviving family the
57 sympathy of the Senate on his passing.
