12	Reserve Sailor of the Year for 2004; and
13	WHEREAS, as leading Petty Officer of the 4th Force Service
14	Support Group, Detachment Nine, he has been awarded the Navy and
15	Marine Corps Commendation Medal for meritorious service rendered
16	from January 2003 through December 2003; and

18	Petty Officer Holcombe temporarily filled a gapped critical
19	Inspector Instructor Corpsman billet at a Marine Corps Reserve
20	artillery battery in Jackson, Mississippi, that he was mobilized
21	in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom, and that he was personally
22	selected as a member of the first Kuwaiti Shock Trauma Platoon;
