## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 58

1	A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE BRAVERY OF MR. THOMAS HAMILL
2	WHILE A CIVILIAN PRISONER OF WAR AND DECLARING OUR GREAT PRIDE
3	UPON HIS ESCAPE.
4	WHEREAS, the United States' Military is in the process of
5	engaging in the war against terrorism both at home and overseas,

- 6 which includes hundreds of Mississippi Guardsmen and Mississippi
- 7 civilians; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Thomas Hamill of Macon, Mississippi, who was
- 9 abducted by a group of Islamic insurgents on April 9, 2004, when
- 10 his supply convoy came under attack, was found safe by the 2nd
- 11 Battalion, 108th Infantry of the New York National Guard, after
- 12 having escaped his captors on May 2, 2004; and
- 13 WHEREAS, a civilian contractor for Halliburton Company
- 14 subsidiary KBR who had undertaken the job to save his family
- 15 business, Mr. Hamill's release was conditioned by his captors upon
- 16 the withdrawal of United States Forces from Fallujah; and
- 17 WHEREAS, after 23 days of captivity, Mr. Hamill, remaining
- 18 steadfast in his faith that he would once again see his family,
- 19 pried open the doors of a locked building and ran a half mile to
- 20 catch up with a passing military convoy; and
- 21 WHEREAS, during the time of his captivity, Mr. Hamill's
- 22 bravery, resolve, resilience and intrepid spirit allowed him to
- 23 maintain his hope and determination for freedom and provided him
- 24 the strength for his daring escape; and
- 25 WHEREAS, suffering a gunshot wound to his left arm, Mr.
- 26 Hamill, rather than being consumed by the dangers of capture and
- 27 his own safety, remained more concerned about the health and

- 28 well-being of his family: wife, Kellie; children, Thomas and
- 29 Tori; parents, Leo and Phylis Hamill; and grandmother, Vera
- 30 Hamill; and
- 31 WHEREAS, "Tommy Hamill is free today because of his own wits
- 32 and the prayers of hundreds of thousands of his fellow Americans,"
- 33 Congressman Roger Wicker said. "This happy ending is a credit to
- 34 his determination. Simply put, a Mississippi country boy can
- 35 survive"; and
- 36 WHEREAS, the Legislature wishes to recognize and commend the
- 37 bravery exhibited by Mr. Hamill, whose experience as a hostage
- 38 greatly affected the emotions and evoked sympathy and spiritual
- 39 unity of the many citizens of Macon and the entire State of
- 40 Mississippi:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 42 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commend the bravery of Mr. Thomas
- 43 Hamill while a civilian prisoner of war and declare our great
- 44 pride upon his safe and daring escape, and we pray for the quick
- 45 and successful conclusion of the important mission of our military
- 46 and civilian personnel in Iraq and for their safe return home.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 48 the family of Mr. Thomas Hamill and be made available to the
- 49 members of the Capitol Press Corps.
