11	Miss and Giant Quarterback Charlie Connerly; and
12	WHEREAS, the son of former Ole Miss famed quarterback, Archie
13	Manning, and brother of the Indianapolis Colts quarterback, Peyton
14	Manning, Eli has continued the long-standing family tradition of
15	athletic excellence; and
16	WHEREAS, in the 2004 SBC Cotton Bowl Classic, Eli was
17	selected Offensive Player of the Game, and Eli also earned first
18	team All-American honors as well as being named to first team
19	All-SEC; and
20	WHEREAS, Quarterback Eli Manning received the Maxwell Award
21	as the nation's top player, the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award as
22	the nation's top senior quarterback and the Conerly Trophy as
23	Mississippi's Player of the Year. He was also a finalist for the
