## REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

## MR. SPEAKER AND MADAM PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1832: City of Jackson; create convention center commission and levy taxes to construct, operate, promote and maintain a convention center.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 20 **SECTION 1.** As used in this act, the following words shall
- 21 have the meanings ascribed to them in this section unless
- 22 otherwise clearly indicated by the context in which they are used:
- 23 (a) "Commission" means the Capital City Convention
- 24 Center Commission.
- 25 (b) "Convention center" means the Capital City
- 26 Convention Center and other related and ancillary facilities.
- 27 (c) "Caterer" means an entity that sells food/beverages
- 28 and/or other products to or at the convention center or has the
- 29 franchise rights to provide food/beverages and/or other products
- 30 at the convention center.
- 31 (d) "Governor" means the Governor of the State of
- 32 Mississippi.
- (e) "Hotel" or "motel" means and includes a place of
- 34 lodging that at any one time will accommodate transient guests on
- 35 a daily or weekly basis and that is known to the trade as such,
- 36 and which is located within the city limits of Jackson,
- 37 Mississippi.
- 38 (f) "Mayor" means the Mayor of the City of Jackson,
- 39 Mississippi.

- 40 (g) "Restaurant" means and includes all places where
- 41 prepared food is sold and whose annual gross proceeds of sales or
- 42 gross income for the preceding calendar year equals or exceeds One
- 43 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00), and which are located
- 44 within the city limits of Jackson, Mississippi. For the purpose
- 45 of calculating gross proceeds of sales or gross income, the sales
- 46 or income of all establishments owned, operated or controlled by
- 47 the same person, persons or corporation shall be aggregated.
- 48 **SECTION 2.** (1) There is hereby created and established in
- 49 the City of Jackson, Mississippi, a convention center to be named
- 50 the "Capital City Convention Center."
- 51 (2) The commission shall be domiciled in the City of
- 52 Jackson. It shall have the authority to promulgate and enact all
- 53 rules and regulations necessary or advantageous to the purpose of
- 54 the commission.
- 55 **SECTION 3.** (1) The commission shall be composed of nine (9)
- 56 members who shall be known as commissioners appointed as follows:
- 57 (a) Two (2) hotel/motel members representing hotel or
- 58 motel properties located within the city limits of Jackson,
- 59 Mississippi, appointed by the mayor, from a list of four (4)
- 60 nominees submitted by the Central Mississippi Chapter of
- 61 Mississippi Lodging Association, for initial terms of one (1) and
- 62 three (3) years, respectively.
- (b) Two (2) restaurant members representing restaurants
- 64 located within the city limits of Jackson appointed by the mayor,
- 65 from a list of four (4) nominees submitted by the Jackson Chapter
- of the Mississippi Restaurant Association, for initial terms of
- 67 two (2) and four (4) years, respectively.
- (c) Two (2) members representing the business community
- 69 in the City of Jackson appointed by the mayor, from a list of four
- 70 (4) nominees submitted by the Metro Jackson Chamber of Commerce
- 71 for initial terms of one (1) and five (5) years respectively. The

- 72 members appointed pursuant to this paragraph shall be persons who
- 73 represent businesses located within the city limits of Jackson,
- 74 Mississippi.
- 75 (d) Two (2) members shall be appointed at large by the
- 76 mayor for initial terms of two (2) and three (3) years
- 77 respectively. All appointments made by the mayor pursuant to this
- 78 paragraph shall be residents of the City of Jackson.
- 79 (e) One (1) member shall be appointed at large by the
- 80 Governor for an initial term of four (4) years. All appointments
- 81 made by the Governor pursuant to this paragraph shall be residents
- 82 of the City of Jackson.
- 83 (2) The terms of all appointments made subsequent to the
- 84 initial appointment shall be made for five (5) years. Any vacancy
- 85 which may occur shall be filled in the same manner as the original
- 86 appointment and shall be made for the unexpired term. Each member
- 87 of the commission shall serve until his successor is appointed and
- 88 qualified.
- 89 (3) The mayor shall designate a chairman of the commission
- 90 from among the membership of the commission. The vice chairman
- 91 and secretary shall be elected by the commission from among the
- 92 membership of the commission for a term of two (2) years. The
- 93 vice chairman and secretary may be reelected, and the chairman may
- 94 be reappointed.
- 95 (4) The commissioners shall serve without compensation.
- 96 (5) Any commissioner shall be disqualified and shall be
- 97 removed from office for either of the following reasons:
- 98 (a) Conviction of a felony in any state court or in
- 99 federal court; or
- 100 (b) Failure to attend three (3) consecutive meetings
- 101 without just cause.

- If a commissioner is removed for any of the above reasons, the vacancy shall be filled in the manner prescribed in this section and shall be made for the unexpired term.
- 105 (6) Before assuming the duties of office, each commissioner 106 shall take the oath prescribed by law and shall enter into and 107 give bond, to be approved by the Secretary of State of the State 108 of Mississippi, in the sum of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00), conditioned upon the faithful performance of his 109 110 duties. Such bond shall be payable to the State of Mississippi, and, in the event of a breach thereof, suit may be brought by the 111 112 State of Mississippi for the benefit of the commission. The premiums on such bonds shall be paid from the funds received by 113 the commission under the provisions of this act. 114
- (7) A quorum shall consist of five (5) members of the commission. The commission shall adopt such rules and regulations as may govern the time and place for holding meetings, regular and special, and other rules and regulations to administer, operate and promote the convention center not inconsistent with the provisions of this act.
- 121 SECTION 4. (1) The commission shall have jurisdiction and 122 authority over all matters relating to the establishment, development, construction, furnishing, equipping, operating and 123 124 promoting of a convention center within the City of Jackson to be 125 connected to the Mississippi Telecommunication Conference and 126 Training Center located in the City of Jackson, including the authority to enter into such contracts and agreements as may be 127 128 necessary to carry out the intent of this act. The commission 129 shall adhere to the provisions of the public purchasing laws, 130 public works contracts laws and public bid laws as provided by the 131 laws of the State of Mississippi.
- 132 (2) The commission is authorized to contract for the 133 construction, furnishing, equipping, operation and promotion of a

- 134 convention center and to receive and expend, subject to the
- 135 provisions of this act, revenues from any source.
- 136 **SECTION 5.** (1) For the purpose of providing funds for the
- 137 acquisition, construction, furnishing, equipping, erection,
- 138 operation, maintenance and promotion of a convention center and
- 139 for the payment of any debt incurred for the acquisition,
- 140 construction, equipping and furnishing of a convention center,
- 141 there is hereby levied and assessed and shall be collected from
- 142 every person engaging in or doing business in the City of Jackson,
- 143 in addition to all other taxes currently being levied, assessed
- 144 and collected:
- 145 (a) A tax of one percent (1%) of the gross proceeds of
- 146 sales of restaurants and of sales of food and beverages in the
- 147 hotels and motels, including, but not limited to, sales of beer
- 148 and alcoholic beverages sold to be consumed on the premises;
- (b) A tax of three percent (3%) of the gross proceeds
- 150 of sales of hotel and motel rooms and lodging;
- 151 (c) A tax of three percent (3%) of the gross proceeds
- 152 of sales at the convention center by caterers.
- 153 (2) Persons liable for the taxes imposed in this section
- 154 shall add the amount of tax to the sales price or gross income
- 155 and, in addition thereto, shall collect, insofar as practicable,
- 156 the amount of the tax due by them from the person receiving the
- 157 services or goods at the time of payment therefor.
- 158 (3) The tax shall be collected by and paid to the State Tax
- 159 Commission on a form prescribed by the State Tax Commission, in
- 160 the same manner that state sales taxes are computed, collected and
- 161 paid; and the full enforcement provisions of Chapter 65, Title 27,
- 162 Mississippi Code of 1972, shall apply as necessary to the
- 163 implementation and administration of this act.

- 164 (4) The proceeds of the tax shall be paid to the City of 165 Jackson on or before the fifteenth day of the month following the 166 month in which they were collected.
- 167 (5) The proceeds of the tax shall not be considered by the 168 City of Jackson as general fund revenues and shall be placed into 169 a special fund. Money in the special fund shall first be used to 170 pay the debt service on any debt incurred by the city for the acquisition, construction, equipping and furnishing the convention 171 172 center. The proceeds of the tax shall be used by the commission
- 174 (a) First, to pay debt service on debt incurred 175 pursuant to this act;

for the following purposes in the priority set forth:

- (b) Second, to fund a trust fund to pay any deficit 176 177 that may occur with respect to the operation of the convention center, not to exceed the amount of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars 178 179 (\$500,000.00) per year; and
- 180 The remainder shall be used for the operation, 181 maintenance and promotion of the convention center.
- 182 (6) The provisions of this section shall be repealed upon 183 the payment in full of any debt incurred pursuant to the 184 provisions of Section 6 of this act.
- SECTION 6. The governing authorities of the City of Jackson, 185 186 Mississippi, are authorized to incur debt under any existing law 187 authorizing the issuance of bonds, notes or other evidences of 188 debt, for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, equipping and furnishing of a convention center in an amount not to exceed 189 190 Sixty-five Million Dollars (\$65,000,000.00). In the event that 191 the city elects to issue bonds pursuant to Section 21-33-301 et 192 seq., the bonds shall not be subject to the limitation on 193 indebtedness imposed by Section 21-33-303, to the extent that the 194 bonds are paid with the proceeds of the taxes authorized by this 195 act.

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196	<b>SECTION 7.</b> (1) Before any tax authorized under this act may
197	be imposed, the governing authorities of the City of Jackson shall
198	adopt a resolution declaring its intention to levy the taxes,
199	setting forth the amount of such tax to be imposed, the date upon
200	which such taxes shall become effective and calling for a
201	referendum to be held on the question. The referendum shall be
202	held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2004.
203	Notice of such intention shall be published once each week for at
204	least three (3) consecutive weeks in a newspaper published or
205	having a general circulation in the county, with the first
206	publication of such notice to be made not less than twenty-one
207	(21) days before the date fixed in the resolution for the
208	referendum and the last publication to be made not more than sever
209	(7) days before the referendum. At the referendum, all qualified
210	electors of the City of Jackson may vote, and the ballots used in
211	such referendum shall have printed thereon a brief statement of
212	the amount and purposes of the proposed tax levy and the words
213	"FOR THE TAX TO FUND THE CAPITAL CITY CONVENTION CENTER" and, on a
214	separate line, "AGAINST THE TAX TO FUND THE CAPITAL CITY
215	CONVENTION CENTER", and the voters shall vote by placing a cross
216	(X) or check (v) opposite their choice on the proposition. When
217	the results of any such referendum shall have been canvassed by
218	the election commission and certified, the city may levy the taxes
219	beginning on the first day of the second month following the
220	referendum, only if at least sixty percent (60%) of the qualified
221	electors who vote in the election vote in favor of the tax. In
222	the event that sixty percent (60%) of the qualified electors who
223	vote at the referendum vote for the convention center tax and the
224	city elects to issue bonds pursuant to Section 21-33-301 et seq.,
225	the city shall not be required to comply with the provisions of
226	Section 21-33-307. No public funds shall be used for the purpose
227	of promoting the adoption of the referendum. No gity employee

- other than a city elected official, may promote the referendum during working hours. At least thirty (30) days before the effective date of the taxes, the governing authorities of the City of Jackson shall furnish to the State Tax Commission a certified copy of the resolution evidencing the taxes.
- 233 (2) If a referendum has been held under the provisions of 234 subsection (1) of this section, and the authority of the city to 235 impose the convention center taxes has been denied by the electors 236 of the city, a subsequent referendum on the issue may be held on 237 the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2006. 238 second referendum is held, and the authority to impose the 239 convention center taxes has been denied again by the electors of 240 the city, no further referendum may be held.
  - SECTION 8. Accounting for receipts and expenditures of the funds described in this act must be made separately from the accounting of receipts and expenditures of the general fund and any other funds of the City of Jackson. The records reflecting the receipts and expenditures of the funds prescribed in this act shall be audited annually by an independent certified public accountant, and the accountant shall make a written report of his audit to the council and the commission. The audit shall be made and completed as soon as practicable after the close of the fiscal year, and expenses of such audit shall be paid from the funds derived pursuant to this act.
- section 9. The provisions of this act shall be repealed in the event that two (2) referenda on the question of imposing convention center taxes have been denied by the electors of the city. If this event occurs, the Clerk of the City of Jackson shall notify the Chairmen of the Local and Private Committees of the House of Representatives and Senate of the Mississippi State Legislature.

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259	SECTION 10. The governing authorities of the City of Jackson
260	shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,
261	or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the
262	Attorney General of the United States or to the United States
263	District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the
264	provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and
265	extended.

SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from 266 267 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended. 268

## Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO CREATE THE CAPITAL CITY CONVENTION CENTER COMMISSION; TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE COMMISSION; TO PROVIDE THAT THE COMMISSION SHALL HAVE JURISDICTION AND AUTHORITY OVER ALL MATTERS RELATING TO THE ESTABLISHMENT, DEVELOPMENT, CONSTRUCTION, FURNISHING, EQUIPPING, OPERATING AND PROMOTING OF A CONVENTION CENTER WITHIN THE CITY OF JACKSON; TO AUTHORIZE THE б IMPOSITION OF A TAX ON THE GROSS PROCEEDS OF RESTAURANTS, HOTELS AND MOTELS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS FOR THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION, FURNISHING, EQUIPPING, ERECTION, OPERATION, MAINTENANCE AND PROMOTING OF A CONVENTION CENTER AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF ANY DEBT INCURRED FOR THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION, EQUIPPING AND FURNISHING OF A CONVENTION CENTER; TO AUTHORIZE THE 9 10 11 12 GOVERNING AUTHORITIES OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, TO 13 INCUR DEBT FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING, EQUIPPING AND FURNISHING OF A CONVENTION CENTER IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED 14 15 16 \$65,000,000.00; TO REQUIRE A REFERENDUM ON THE QUESTION OF THE 17 IMPOSITION OF ANY TAX AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED 18 PURPOSES.
