REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MADAM PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 2302: Salary supplements for licensed school counselors and school speech-language pathologists and audiologists; clarify.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

22	SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
23	amended as follows:
24	37-19-7. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited
25	as the Mississippi "Teacher Opportunity Program (TOP)." The
26	allowance in the minimum education program and the Mississippi

75 Education and subject to specific appropriation therefor by the 76 Legislature, the State Board of Education shall revise the salary 77 scale to provide an additional one percent (1%) across the board 78 increase in the base salaries for each type of license. 79 It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the 80 funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall 81 82 be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal 83 and compensation system implemented by the State Board of Education. The State Board of Education shall have the authority 84 85 to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to establish, administer and maintain the system. 86 87 All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a 88 minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no school district shall receive any funds under this section for any 89 90 school year during which the local supplement paid to any individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that 91 92 paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties 93 from local supplement during the immediately preceding school 94 year. For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Forty Dollars (\$740.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of

170	that the certificate was received before October 15 in order to be
171	eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school
172	year, or the licensed school nurse shall submit the documentation
173	to the State Department of Education before February 15 in order
174	to be eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the
175	second term of the school year. Provided, however, that the total
176	number of licensed school nurses eligible for a salary supplement
177	under this paragraph (ii) shall not exceed twenty (20).
178	(iii) Any licensed school counselor who has met
179	the requirements and acquired a National Certified School
180	Counselor (NCSC) endorsement from the National Board of Certified
181	Counselors and who is employed by a local school board or the
182	State Board of Education as a counselor and not as an
183	administrator. Such licensed school counselor shall submit
184	documentation to the State Department of Education that the
185	endorsement was received prior to October 15 in order to be
186	eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school
187	year, or the licensed school counselor shall submit such
188	documentation to the State Department of Education prior to
189	February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary
190	supplement beginning with the second term of the school year.
191	However, any school counselor who started the National Board for
192	Professional Teaching Standards process for school counselors
193	between June 1, 2003, and June 30, 2004, and completes the
194	requirements and acquires the master teacher certificate shall be
195	entitled to the master teacher supplement, and those counselors
196	who complete the process shall be entitled to a one (1) time
197	reimbursement for the actual cost of the process as outlined in
198	paragraph (b) of this subsection.
199	(iv) Any licensed speech-language pathologist and
200	audiologist who has met the requirements and acquired a
201	Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American

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Speech-Language-Hearing Association and who is employed by a local
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     school board. Such licensed speech-language pathologist and
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     audiologist shall submit documentation to the State Department of
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     Education that the certificate or endorsement was received prior
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     to October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary
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     supplement in the current school year, or the licensed
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     speech-language pathologist and audiologist shall submit such
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     documentation to the State Department of Education prior to
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     February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary
     supplement beginning with the second term of the school
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     year. * * *
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               (b) An employee shall be reimbursed one (1) time for
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     the actual cost of completing the process of acquiring the
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     certificate or endorsement, excluding any costs incurred for
     postgraduate courses, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars ($500.00)
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     for a school counselor or speech-language pathologist and
     audiologist, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in
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     the award of the certificate or endorsement. A local school
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     district or any private individual or entity may pay the cost of
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     completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement
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     for any employee of the school district described under paragraph
     (a), and the State Department of Education shall reimburse the
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     school district for such cost, regardless of whether or not the
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     process resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement.
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     If a private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing
     the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an
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     employee, the local school district may agree to directly
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     reimburse the individual or entity for such cost on behalf of the
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     employee.
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                    All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process
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     reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid
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directly by the State Department of Education to the local school

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district and shall be in addition to its minimum education program 234 235 allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations 236 promulgated by the State Board of Education, and subject to 237 appropriation by the Legislature. Local school districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any employee receiving 238 such salary supplement, and the employee shall receive any local 239 supplement to which employees with similar training and experience 240 241 otherwise are entitled.

The State Department of Education may not pay any process reimbursement to a school district for an employee who does not complete the certification or endorsement process required to be eligible for the certificate or endorsement. If an employee for whom such cost has been paid in full or in part by a local school district or private individual or entity fails to complete the certification or endorsement process, the employee shall be liable to the school district or individual or entity for all amounts paid by the school district or individual or entity on behalf of that employee toward his or her certificate or endorsement.
