## **REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE**

## MADAM PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 2386: Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission; reenact and extend the date of repeal (RP).

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

28 SECTION 1. Section 55-15-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
29 reenacted as follows:

30 55-15-51. It is hereby found and determined by the 31 Legislature that many thousands of Mississippians have served in 32 the Armed Forces of the United States; that the Mississippi 33 veterans have not received the recognition and honor they deserve 34 for service to their country; and that an appropriate monument should be established and maintained as a symbol of the 35 recognition and appreciation of the State of Mississippi to 36 37 Mississippi veterans.

38 SECTION 2. Section 55-15-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
39 reenacted and amended as follows:

40 55-15-53. (1) From and after the effective date of Laws, 41 1997, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the present membership 42 of the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall cease 43 serving on the commission. From and after the effective date of 44 Laws, 1997, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the Mississippi 45 Veterans Monument Commission shall consist of the following seven 46 (7) members: 47 The Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans (a) 48 Memorial Commission, who shall serve as Secretary of the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission; 49 50 (b) The Executive Secretary of the State Veterans Affairs Board; 51 The Director of the Division of General Services in 52 (C) the Department of Finance and Administration; 53 54 (d) Three (3) members appointed by the Governor, one 55 (1) from each of the three (3) state Supreme Court districts as follows: 56 (i) One (1) veteran of World War II; 57 (ii) One (1) veteran of the Korean Conflict; and 58 59 (iii) One (1) veteran of the Vietnam Conflict; One (1) veteran of the Persian Gulf Conflict, 60 (e) appointed from the state at large by the Lieutenant Governor. 61 62 The initial meeting of the commission shall be called (2) and chaired by the Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans 63 64 Memorial Commission, until the monument commission shall choose a chairman from among its members. Thereafter, the commission shall 65 66 elect a chairman each year, and the commission may meet at the 67 call of the chairman once each month. Minutes of the meetings of 68 the commission shall be kept in a well-bound book and, along with 69 all other records and papers, shall remain in the custody of the 70 secretary of the commission. A majority of the commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. All actions 71 taken or rules and regulations adopted by the commission shall be 72 73 by resolution duly spread upon its minutes, showing yea and nay 74 votes of each member present. The signature of the chairman and 75 secretary, pursuant to a duly adopted resolution, shall be binding 76 upon the commission.

77 (3) The appointed members of the Mississippi Veterans78 Monument Commission shall receive per diem compensation in the

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89 (4) When the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission ceases
90 to exist, all records of the Mississippi Veterans Monument
91 Commission shall become the property of the Mississippi War
92 Veterans Memorial Commission.

93 (5) The Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission shall
94 have continuing oversight responsibility over all activities
95 pertaining to all Mississippi veterans monuments.

96 (6) The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall 97 continue in existence under the provisions of this chapter after 98 the design, construction and dedication of the Mississippi 99 veterans monument until July 1, <u>2006</u>, so that such commission can 100 provide for the design, construction and dedication of future 101 monuments to be located at sites designated by the Mississippi 102 Veterans Monument Commission.

103 SECTION 3. Section 55-15-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 104 reenacted as follows:

105 55-15-55. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is 106 hereby authorized and directed to cause to be constructed and 107 maintained an appropriate monument to honor Mississippi veterans 108 when adequate funds for the construction thereof are deposited in 109 the Veterans Monument Trust Fund herein created. 110 SECTION 4. Section 55-15-57, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
111 reenacted as follows:

112 55-15-57. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission 113 shall:

(a) Plan and provide for the design, construction and dedication of the Mississippi veterans monument. The actual design and site of the monument shall be selected with the approval of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History.

118 (b) Solicit private monetary donations for deposit into 119 the Veterans Monument Trust Fund.

(c) Report to the Legislature by November 15 of each year on the progress of such monument. In addition to the report required in the preceding sentence, the commission shall submit an annual report on its activities no later than November of each year to the Military Affairs Committees of both the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Mississippi Senate.

126 SECTION 5. Section 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 127 reenacted as follows:

55-15-59. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is 128 129 hereby authorized to accept gifts, grants and donations from 130 individuals and organizations, to be deposited in the Veterans 131 Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 132 The State Treasurer shall invest all monies in the Veterans 133 Monument Trust Fund and any interest earned shall be deposited 134 into the fund. All appropriated funds and funds deposited in the Veterans Monument Trust Fund shall be used exclusively for the 135 purpose of designing, erecting, maintaining and dedication of the 136 veterans monument, except that not more than Seven Thousand Five 137 138 Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) may be expended annually to pay the 139 administrative costs of the commission. Costs associated with the designing, erecting, maintaining and dedication of the veterans 140 141 monument are not considered commission administrative costs for

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(S)VM;AP (H)MA;AP G1/2 142 purposes of this section. Upon completion of the monument, money 143 in the trust fund shall be utilized by the Mississippi War 144 Veterans Memorial Commission for maintenance of the veterans 145 monument and memorials.

146 SECTION 6. Section 55-15-61, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 147 reenacted as follows:

148 55-15-61. (1) In addition to the duties assigned to the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55, 149 150 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission shall plan and provide for the design, construction and dedication 151 of a Mississippi Confederate memorial at the Shiloh National 152 153 Military Park. In planning the design, construction and 154 dedication of the memorial, the commission shall consult with and 155 be advised by an advisory committee composed of three (3) 156 representatives from the Mississippi Department of the Sons of 157 Confederate Veterans. The Mississippi Department of the Sons of 158 Confederate Veterans shall designate such representatives and certify them to the commission. The commission shall solicit 159 160 private monetary donations for deposit into a Shiloh Confederate 161 Memorial Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 162 Private donations to the trust fund may be matched by the state 163 using any appropriations made for that purpose by the Legislature; 164 however, any state match shall not exceed One Hundred Fifty 165 Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) in the aggregate. The commission 166 is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust fund grants or donations made to it from any other source. All funds 167 168 deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for the 169 purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the monument. 170 (2) The board of supervisors of any county and the governing 171 authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any 172

173 available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the Shiloh 174 Confederate Memorial Trust Fund.

175 SECTION 7. Section 55-15-62, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 176 reenacted as follows:

177 55-15-62. (1) In addition to the duties assigned to the 178 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55, 179 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission is 180 hereby authorized, subject to any available funds, to plan and 181 provide for the design, construction and dedication of a monument recognizing Mississippi recipients of the Congressional Medal of 182 183 Honor. In planning the design, construction and dedication of the 184 monument, the commission shall consult with and be advised by the 185 State Veterans Affairs Board. The commission may solicit private 186 monetary donations for deposit into a Congressional Medal of Honor Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 187 188 Private donations to the trust fund may be accepted. The 189 commission is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust 190 fund grants or donations made to it from any other source. All funds deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for 191 192 the purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the 193 monument.

194 (2) The board of supervisors of any county and the governing 195 authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and 196 empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any 197 available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the 198 Congressional Medal of Honor Monument Trust Fund.

199 SECTION 8. Section 55-15-63, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 200 amended as follows:

55-15-63. Sections 55-15-51 through 55-15-62, Mississippi
Code of 1972, which create and empower the Mississippi Veterans
Monument Commission, are repealed from and after July 1, <u>2006</u>.

204 **SECTION 9.** Section 33-3-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 205 amended as follows:

206 33-3-17. (1) The Governor is hereby authorized and 207 empowered to decorate members and former members of the 208 Mississippi National Guard and members and former members of the 209 national guard of the several states and members and former 210 members of the armed forces of the United States, who he may deem worthy of such decoration, with such awards, medals or decorations 211 212 as he may prescribe by rules and regulations promulgated by him, 213 and the Governor is hereby authorized to promulgate suitable and 214 reasonable rules and regulations for such purposes.

215 (2) The Governor shall award posthumously the Mississippi 216 Medal of Valor to those members of the Mississippi National Guard 217 who gave their lives while in active service of the United States 218 as defined in Section 33-1-1(1).

219 (3) The Governor may award retroactively the Mississippi 220 Medal of Valor to a member or former member of the Armed Forces of 221 the United States if such member has been awarded the Medal of 222 Honor or the Purple Heart.

223 (4) The design of the Mississippi Medal of Valor is as 224 follows: A gold medal with the Great Seal of the State of Mississippi superimposed on a cross combined with crossed sabers 225 226 with the words "MEDAL FOR VALOR" inscribed around the seal. The 227 medal is suspended from a ribbon of navy blue background, with two 228 (2) wide, vertical white bands. The recipient's name and rank are engraved in the reverse side of the medal. The ribbon carries the 229 230 same colors as described for the medal.

231 <u>SECTION 10.</u> (1) The State Veterans Affairs Board is 232 authorized to establish, operate and maintain a Mississippi 233 veterans cemetery in this state, which shall be known as the 234 "Mississippi Veterans Memorial Cemetery." 235 (2) The State Veterans Affairs Board has the primary 236 responsibility for verifying eligibility for interment in the 237 veterans cemetery. Eligibility criteria for interment in the 238 cemetery is the same as required for interment in a national 239 cemetery as provided by federal law and rules and regulations applicable thereto. However, to be eligible for interment a 240 241 veteran must have been a legal resident of the State of Mississippi for two (2) years immediately prior to his death. 242

(3) The cemetery shall be under the control andadministration of the State Veterans Affairs Board.

(4) Applications for interment in the cemetery shall be
processed in accordance with rules and regulations promulgated by
the State Veterans Affairs Board.

(5) The State Veterans Affairs Board is designated as the 248 agency of this state to receive federal aid under Title 38 USC, as 249 amended, and is authorized to receive funds from the United States 250 251 Department of Veterans Affairs or any other agency of the United 252 States authorized to grant or expend funds to assist a state in 253 establishing, operating and maintaining a veterans cemetery. The board is authorized to receive gifts, contributions, bequests and 254 255 individual reimbursements from any source, the receipt of which shall not exclude any other source of revenue. All funds received 256 257 by the board pursuant to this subsection shall be deposited into a 258 special fund, hereby created and known as the "Mississippi Veterans Cemetery Fund, " and shall be expended to establish, 259 260 operate and maintain a veterans cemetery in this state. The State 261 Veterans Affairs Board is authorized to employ such personnel as 262 it may deem necessary to carry out its duties and responsibilities 263 under this section.

264 **SECTION 11.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 265 and after July 1, 2004.
