THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Forty Dollars (\$740.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$675.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$770.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Five Dollars (\$705.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Forty Dollars (\$640.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$480.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-four (24) years of teaching experience.

The level of professional training of each teacher to be used in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current school year.

The following employees shall receive an annual (2) (a) salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00), plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other compensation to which the employee may be entitled:

153	requirements and acquired a Master Teacher certificate from the

176	(iii) Any licensed school counselor who has met
177	the requirements and acquired a National Certified School
178	Counselor (NCSC) endorsement from the National Board of Certified
179	Counselors and who is employed by a local school board or the
180	State Board of Education as a counselor and not as an
181	administrator. Such licensed school counselor shall submit
182	documentation to the State Department of Education that the
183	endorsement was received prior to October 15 in order to be
184	eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school
185	year, or the licensed school counselor shall submit such
186	documentation to the State Department of Education prior to

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     February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary
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     supplement beginning with the second term of the school year.

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                    (iv) Any licensed speech-language pathologist and
     audiologist who has met the requirements and acquired a
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     Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American
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     Speech-Language-Hearing Association and who is employed by a local
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     school board.
                    Such licensed speech-language pathologist and
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     audiologist shall submit documentation to the State Department of
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     Education that the certificate or endorsement was received prior
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     to October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary
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     supplement in the current school year, or the licensed
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     speech-language pathologist and audiologist shall submit such
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     documentation to the State Department of Education prior to
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     February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary
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     supplement beginning with the second term of the school
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     year. * * *
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                    An employee shall be reimbursed one (1) time for
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     the actual cost of completing the process of acquiring the
     certificate or endorsement, excluding any costs incurred for
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     postgraduate courses, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars ($500.00)
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     for a school counselor or speech-language pathologist and
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     audiologist, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in
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     the award of the certificate or endorsement. A local school
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     district or any private individual or entity may pay the cost of
     completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement
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     for any employee of the school district described under paragraph
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(a), and the State Department of Education shall reimburse the

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222 school district for such cost, regardless of whether or not the

223 process resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement.

224 If a private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing

225 the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an

226 employee, the local school district may agree to directly

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(c) All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process

230 reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid

231 directly by the State Department of Education to the local school

232 district and shall be in addition to its minimum education program

allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations

234 promulgated by the State Board of Education, and subject to

235 appropriation by the Legislature. Local school districts shall

236 not reduce the local supplement paid to any employee receiving

such salary supplement, and the employee shall receive any local

supplement to which employees with similar training and experience

239 otherwise are entitled.

240 (d) The State Department of Education may not pay any

241 process reimbursement to a school district for an employee who

242 does not complete the certification or endorsement process

243 required to be eligible for the certificate or endorsement. If an

244 employee for whom such cost has been paid in full or in part by a

245 local school district or private individual or entity fails to

complete the certification or endorsement process, the employee

247 shall be liable to the school district or individual or entity for

248 all amounts paid by the school district or individual or entity on

249 behalf of that employee toward his or her certificate or

250 endorsement.

251 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

252 and after July 1, 2004.
