House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3122

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

24	SECTION 4. The funds appropriated in this act for the aid

In the 3/5 Headcount Formula such Academic, Technical, and 43 Vocational funds shall be disbursed to such public community and 44 junior colleges on the basis of the full-time enrollment of each 45 46 such public community and junior college as of the last day of the sixth week of the fall semester, or its equivalent, of the 47 48 preceding year, counting only students who reside within the State 49 of Mississippi. Part-time academic, vocational, and technical credit courses may qualify on the basis of the prior year 50 51 full-time equivalency of part-time and summer students, counting 52 only students who reside within the State of Mississippi.

53 Virtual Community College hosted and provided courses may 54 qualify on the basis of the prior year full-time equivalency of 55 virtual community college hours generated during the summer, fall 56 and spring semesters that did not make a student full-time in the 57 fall semester.

In the 2/5 FTE Formula, such Academic, Technical, Vocational, 58 59 Associate Degree Nursing and Associate Degree Allied Health funds 60 shall be disbursed on the basis of prior year full-time equivalency (FTE) of hours generated during the summer, fall and 61 62 spring semesters for each public community and junior college as of the last day of the sixth week of each semester, or its 63 equivalent, counting only students who reside within the State of 64 65 However, associate degree nursing students who Mississippi.

66 reside outside the State of Mississippi may be counted for pay 67 purposes.

Virtual Community College hosted and provided courses may qualify on the basis of the prior year full-time equivalency of virtual community college hours generated during the summer, fall and spring semesters. Those semester credit hours being hosted and provided by one institution shall receive funding at the weight of 1.0.

Of the funds appropriated in the act for the aid and support of the public community and junior colleges, funds up to Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$900,000.00) are provided to be set aside as a mechanism to hold harmless those colleges that lose funding in the second year of a five year phase-in implementation period to a full-time equivalency (FTE) funding formula.

The Director of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, or his designee, shall audit each public community and junior college and shall determine who shall be counted in each college and shall certify the number to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.

If, pending determination of the enrollment of students at 85 86 the public community and junior colleges entitled to participate 87 in this appropriation, as provided for in this subsection, the 88 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall find and 89 determine that any such public or community junior college does 90 not have sufficient funds on hand for payment of the necessary expenses of its operation for the period commencing July 1, 2004, 91 92 until distribution of the funds appropriated hereby, then, in that event, the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges is 93 94 expressly authorized to make an advance to any such public 95 community or junior college or colleges not having sufficient operating funds for such period from the funds appropriated 96 97 hereby; provided, however, that the amount of any such advance to any one public community or junior college shall not exceed 98 thirty-three percent (33%) of the amount of state appropriated 99 100 funds received by such public community or junior college during

101 the preceding fiscal year; and provided, further, that the amount 102 of any such advance shall be deducted from the pro rata part of 103 the funds appropriated hereby accruing to said public community or 104 junior college when enrollment has been ascertained and 105 distribution of funds is made.

SECTION 5. No part of the amount herein appropriated shall be used by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for administrative or other purposes except in the manner and to the extent authorized in the act making an appropriation for the expenses of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.

111 **SECTION 6.** The funds disbursed under the provisions of this 112 act shall be accounted for through the State Board for Community 113 and Junior Colleges.

SECTION 7. The following public community and junior colleges which qualify shall participate in the funds provided by Sections 1 and 2 of this act:

Coahoma Community College, Copiah-Lincoln Community College, 117 118 East Central Community College, East Mississippi Community 119 College, Hinds Community College District, Holmes Community College, Itawamba Community College, Jones County Junior College, 120 Meridian Community College, Mississippi Delta Community College, 121 122 Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College District, Northeast 123 Mississippi Community College, Northwest Mississippi Community 124 College, Pearl River Community College, and Southwest Mississippi 125 Community College.

126 **SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature that none 127 of the General Funds appropriated herein shall be expended for the 128 purpose of paying salaries, wages, and fringe benefits of any 129 public community and junior college employee who is serving as a 130 member of the State of Mississippi Legislature.

SECTION 9. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purposes of hiring nursing and allied health teachers, awarding interest free nursing and 136 allied health student loans and providing instructional support 137 for the Rural Health Corps for the fiscal year beginning 138 July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005..... \$ 1,200,000.00. 139 The funds appropriated in this section shall be allocated as 140 follows:

141 (1) One-half (1/2) divided equally among the fifteen (15)142 public community and junior colleges.

(2) One-half (1/2) divided upon the basis of the number of full-time academic, technical and vocational public community and junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent of the preceding year counting only those students who reside within the State of Mississippi.

The public community and junior colleges shall prepare and make available to the Legislature and the Legislative Budget Office an accounting of expenditures and program accomplishments of the Rural Health Corps Program for each of the individual community and junior colleges in a format and manner prescribed by the Legislative Budget Office.

SECTION 10. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 155 156 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 157 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the aid of the public 158 community and junior colleges, to fund life and health insurance, 159 for all employees of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005. 160 161 16,808,282.00.

The funds allocated in this section shall only be used to participate in the State and School Employees' Life and Health Insurance Plan. Any funds appropriated in this section which are not expended during the fiscal year shall be carried forward for the same purposes during the next succeeding fiscal year.

167 **SECTION 11.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 168 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 169 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of 170 establishing and operating One-Stop Career Centers at each of the 171 public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning 172 July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005..... \$ 1,200,000.00.

SECTION 12. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of Sign Language Interpreter Training at the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005...... \$ 179,050.00.

SECTION 13. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of the Education Technology Program at the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005...... \$ 3,599,160.00.

SECTION 14. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of servicing the debt on bonds issued for the Education Technology Program at the community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending

195 The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from 196 Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Sections 197 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 15. A Mississippi Prepaid Affordable College Tuition (MPACT) program beneficiary shall be considered a Mississippi resident for the purposes of participating in this appropriation regardless of the beneficiary's residence on the date of enrollment, as set out in Mississippi Code Annotated, Section 37-155-5(d)(iii).

204 **SECTION 16.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 205 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of

206 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 207 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 208 intended mission of this agency. A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee for Fiscal Year 2006.

SECTION 17. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of the Golden Triangle Education Center for Manufacturing Technology, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005...... \$ 150,000.00.

SECTION 18. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of the Mississippi Delta Community College Industrial Training Program, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005...... \$ 150,000.00.

SECTION 19. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of the Holmes Community College Industrial Technology Complex, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005...... \$ 150,000.00.

SECTION 20. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 266 267 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 268 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 269 270 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 271 272 SECTION 21. This act shall take effect and be in force from 273 and after July 1, 2004.
