## House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3138

## TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

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7	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
8	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State
9	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
10	defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Emergency Management
11	Agency in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-15-1 et
12	seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning
13	July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005 \$ 911,711.00.
14	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
15	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
16	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi
17	Emergency Management Agency which is comprised of special source
18	funds collected by or otherwise available to the agency, for the
19	support and maintenance of the agency for the fiscal year
20	beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005
21	\$ 3,621,372.00.
22	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
23	Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized:
24	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:
25	Permanent: Full Time 49
26	Part Time 0
27	Time-Limited: Full Time
28	Part Time 0
29	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
30	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
31	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
32	Services" for Fiscal Year 2006 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2005
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- 33 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
- 34 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2006 budget by the
- Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 35
- 36 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
- determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 37
- 38 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
- 39 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure
- 40 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual
- cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2005 appropriation for "Personal 41
- Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 42
- 43 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
- Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 44
- 45 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
- projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2005 "Personal Services" 46
- 47 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
- 48 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
- requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 49
- 50 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- 51 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 52 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 53 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 54 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 55
- 56 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 57 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 58
- 59 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 60
- 61 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 62 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. 63
- 64 SECTION 4. The funds authorized herein shall be used to fund
- all operations of the agency with the following prohibitions: 65
- 66 (1) The agency shall not fill any current or future vacant
- 67 positions;

- 68 The agency shall not take any action to promote or
- 69 otherwise award salary increases through reallocation,
- 70 reclassification, realignment, education benchmark, career ladder,
- 71 or any other means to increase salaries of employees or positions
- 72 except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House Bill No.
- 73 1279, 2004 Regular Session;
- 74 The agency shall not expend funds for out-of-state (3)
- 75 travel except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House
- 76 Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Session;
- 77 The agency shall not expend funds for the purchase of or
- 78 contract for cellular phones, two-way radios or pagers, except for
- 79 support of employees in the Department of Public Safety and the
- 80 Bureau of Narcotics as recommended by Information Technology
- 81 Services or as allowed under the provisions set forth in House
- Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Session; 82
- 83 The agency shall not expend funds to publish or
- distribute any annual reports or other publications; 84
- 85 The agency shall not expend funds for public relation
- 86 activities regarding the functions, programs or services of the
- 87 agency except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House
- Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Session; 88
- 89 The agency shall not advertise the functions, programs
- 90 or services of the agency except that the Mississippi Development
- 91 Authority is authorized to expend funds for advertising to carry
- 92 out the purposes of key programs administered by the authority;
- 93 (8) The agency shall not expend funds for staff development
- 94 or training services;
- 95 (9) The agency shall not expend funds for the purchase of
- 96 new or replacement equipment or furniture, excluding lease
- 97 purchase payments on agreements in effect upon passage of this
- appropriation bill, except as allowed under the provisions set 98
- 99 forth in House Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Session.
- 100 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that none
- of the funds appropriated above shall be expended unless members 101
- of the Mississippi House of Representatives and Mississippi Senate 102

are notified at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony

announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public

announcement or ceremony regarding the groundbreaking or opening

106 of a facility, roadway or bridge for which the Legislature has

107 made funds available. Any signage regarding any public event or

108 any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following

109 language: "Funds were made available for this project by the

110 Mississippi State Legislature."

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2004. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2006 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail

provided during the Fiscal Year 2005 budget request process.

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency may, upon the request of a local public emergency management organization in an area which has suffered a natural disaster, supply equipment to rural water associations to enable their continued operation when the local emergency management organization determines that such private entities provide services essential to the welfare of the community.

SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall provide enhanced training to local governments, supervisors, mayors, civil defense groups and municipal associations in disaster management.

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SECTION 12. None of the funds appropriated in Section 9

shall be used to establish a special reserve fund in the State

- 175 **SECTION 13.** The expenditure of the funds appropriated by
- 176 this act shall be under the direction of the Governor and shall be
- 177 paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the proper fund or
- 178 funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State
- 179 Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his
- 180 warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or
- 181 officers in the manner provided by law.
- 182 **SECTION 14.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 183 and after July 1, 2004.
