It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 207 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2005 appropriation for "Personal 208 209 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 210 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 211 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 212 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2005 "Personal Services" 213 214 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 215 216 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 217 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 218 219 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 220 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 221 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 222 The 223 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 224 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 225 226 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

231 **SECTION 5.** The funds authorized herein shall be used to fund 232 all operations of the agency with the following prohibitions:

(1) The agency shall not fill any current or future vacantpositions;

(2) The agency shall not take any action to promote or
otherwise award salary increases through reallocation,

237 reclassification, realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, 238 or any other means to increase salaries of employees or positions 239 except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House Bill No. 240 1279, 2004 Regular Session;

(3) The agency shall not expend funds for out-of-state
travel except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House
Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Session;

(4) The agency shall not expend funds for the purchase of or
contract for cellular phones, two-way radios or pagers, except for
support of employees in the Department of Public Safety and the
Bureau of Narcotics as recommended by Information Technology
Services or as allowed under the provisions set forth in House
Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Session;

(5) The agency shall not expend funds to publish ordistribute any annual reports or other publications;

(6) The agency shall not expend funds for public relation activities regarding the functions, programs or services of the agency except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Session;

(7) The agency shall not advertise the functions, programs or services of the agency except that the Mississippi Development Authority is authorized to expend funds for advertising to carry out the purposes of key programs administered by the authority;

260 (8) The agency shall not expend funds for staff development261 or training services;

(9) The agency shall not expend funds for the purchase of new or replacement equipment or furniture, excluding lease purchase payments on agreements in effect upon passage of this appropriation bill, except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Session.

267 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that none 268 of the funds appropriated above shall be expended unless members of the Mississippi House of Representatives and Mississippi Senate 269 270 are notified at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony 271 announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public 272 announcement or ceremony regarding the groundbreaking or opening of a facility, roadway or bridge for which the Legislature has 273 274 made funds available. Any signage regarding any public event or 275 any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following

276 language: "Funds were made available for this project by the 277 Mississippi State Legislature."

278 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 279 Department of Mental Health shall maintain complete accounting and 280 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 281 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 282 2004. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 283 284 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2006 shall be submitted to 285 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 286 287 during the Fiscal Year 2005 budget request process.

SECTION 8. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee for Fiscal Year 2006.

354 **SECTION 9.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 355 Section 1, authorized for expenditure in Section 2, and allocated 356 in Section 3 to the "Central Office," funds are included for an 357 Alzheimer's education and training program.

358 SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 359 of Section 1, authorized for expenditure in Section 2, and 360 allocated in Section 4 to the "Central Office," funds are included 361 to compensate part-time members of the Sexual Predator Review 362 Board at an hourly rate not to exceed the hourly rate for 363 similarly qualified and titled full-time state employees, plus 364 fringe benefits allowable for such part-time employees.

SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 365 366 of Section 1, authorized for expenditure under the provisions of 367 Section 2, and allocated under the provisions of Section 4, funds 368 in the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) may be 369 expended for the support of a pilot project to provide authority 370 for East Mississippi State Hospital and Mississippi State Hospital to contract with local hospitals located in counties with a 371 population of less than fifty thousand (50,000) to provide 372 emergency inpatient care to individuals committed by the Chancery 373 Court to East Mississippi State Hospital or Mississippi State 374 375 Hospital for treatment of mental illness if, at the time that such commitment is made, a bed is not available for admission to East 376 377 Mississippi State Hospital or Mississippi State Hospital. East 378 Mississippi State Hospital and Mississippi State Hospital shall have the authority to contract with local hospitals located in 379 380 counties with a population of less than fifty thousand (50,000)

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381 for inpatient emergency care for a period not to exceed seven (7) 382 days at a rate not to exceed One Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) per day with East Mississippi State Hospital or 383 384 Mississippi State Hospital providing One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and the local government providing Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per day 385 386 for such care. Payment for such physician fees shall be made at 387 the Medicaid rate of reimbursement and paid by East Mississippi 388 State Hospital or Mississippi State Hospital. Funds provided for 389 the initiation of this pilot project shall not be expended for inpatient hospital care unless there is participation in the 390 391 reimbursement for such care by the local government as required by the provisions of this section. 392

393 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 394 Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health shall have 395 authority to transfer cash from one special fund treasury fund to 396 another special fund treasury fund under the control of the Department of Mental Health. The purpose of this authority is to 397 398 more efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the 399 intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health shall submit written justification for 400 401 the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department 402 of Finance and Administration on or before the fifteenth (15th) of 403 the month prior to the effective date of the transfer.

404 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 405 Department of Mental Health shall have the authority to receive, budget, and expend funds from any source, including beginning cash 406 407 in excess of beginning cash when spending authority was initially 408 appropriated, that may become available to the department in 409 accordance with the rules and regulations of the Department of 410 Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds. 411

412 SECTION 14. The Department of Mental Health and its 413 facilities shall have the authority, within funding and spending 414 authority appropriated under the provisions of Section 1, 415 authorized for expenditure in Section 2, and allocated under the

416 provisions of Section 4 of this act, to transfer funds to the 417 Division of Medicaid in payment of Medicaid match and designate 418 that the funds thus transferred shall be applied to Medicaid match 419 obligations arising in the subsequent fiscal year.

420 **SECTION 15.** Any person within the Department of Mental 421 Health who must work on a statutory holiday or any holiday 422 proclaimed by the Governor, may at the discretion of the Director 423 of the Institution and the Executive Director of the Department of 424 Mental Health and within available personnel funds, be paid "call 425 back pay" in lieu of "compensatory time credit."

426 **SECTION 16.** Of the funds appropriated to the "Service 427 Budget," funds are included for the support of community mental 428 health services for Fiscal Year 2005.

429 Provided, however, that none of the funds appropriated for 430 the support of community mental health services shall be made 431 available to any Regional Mental Health/Retardation Center which does not receive from each of its participating counties a dollar 432 433 amount equivalent to what the proceeds of a three-fourths (3/4)434 mill tax on all taxable property in the county in Fiscal Year 1982 would have been or the amount of funds contributed to the center 435 by the county in Fiscal Year 1984, whichever shall be greater. By 436 437 means of performance contracts, the Department of Mental Health 438 shall disburse the funds appropriated in this section for services 439 for the mentally ill, mentally retarded and alcohol/drug abusers. 440 The State Board of Mental Health and the Department of Mental Health shall be responsible for selecting the types of services 441 442 which shall be provided with the funds appropriated in this 443 section, for developing and monitoring performance contracts and 444 for holding contractors accountable for utilization of funds.

445 **SECTION 17.** Funds presently included or any funds received 446 in the future for timber funds at Ellisville State School and East 447 Mississippi State Hospital are hereby authorized for transfer to 448 the regular operating budgets of the respective facilities. Each 449 facility shall receive such funds as "Special" funds, and such 450 funds shall be available for use in payment of any and all

451 expenses of each facility, paid by the State Treasurer upon 452 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 453 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 454 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.

455 SECTION 18. The Department of Mental Health and its 456 facilities shall have the express legal authority, within funding 457 and spending authority appropriated under the provisions of 458 Section 1, authorized for expenditure under the provisions of 459 Section 2, and allocated under the provisions of Section 4 of this 460 act, to purchase land for use by residential facilities operated 461 by the Department, either directly or by means of transferring 462 funds to the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property 463 Management, and to transfer such funds to Bureau of Building, 464 Grounds, and Real Property Management for the purposes of 465 constructing and equipping group homes for persons with mental 466 illness, mental retardation, and/or substance abuse; constructing 467 and equipping such other buildings as may be required for 468 treatment of persons with mental illness, mental retardation, 469 and/or substance abuse; repair and renovate existing buildings; 470 and to construct, repair and/or renovate employee housing. Any 471 intermediate care facilities for the mentally retarded (ICF/MR) constructed with funds authorized in this section shall be 472 473 authorized to participate in Medicaid funding available for such 474 services.

475 SECTION 19. Of the General Funds appropriated to the 476 "Service Budget," the sum required may be expended to fund the 477 Home and Community Based Waiver Option for community mental 478 retardation services as authorized under Section 43-13-117 (29) of 479 the Mississippi Code of 1972 (Annotated).

SECTION 20. With the funds herein appropriated, the Department of Mental Health is authorized to provide home and community based treatment and institutional treatment to not more than ten (10) persons at any given time who, on or after reaching their twenty-first birthday (age 21), suffered a severe brain injury and whose condition as a result of that brain injury would

486 have resulted in their classification as developmentally disabled 487 if such injury had occurred prior to their twenty-first birthday.

SECTION 21. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the special fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Mental Health Funds 3372, 3373, 3374, 3375, 3376, 3377, 3382, 3384, 3385, 3386, 3387, 3388 and 3391 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005...... \$ 10,000,000.00

495 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the 496 provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended 497 exceed the unexpended balance as of June 30, 2004, or change the 498 purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.

499 SECTION 22. None of the funds appropriated herein may be 500 used to pay for alternative residential placement or 501 hospitalization for mental health, mental retardation, or 502 substance treatment of a person committed to the Department of 503 Mental Health under Sections 41-21-61, et seq., 41-21-107, 504 41-31-1, et seq., 43-21-315, and 43-21-611, Mississippi Code of 505 1972.

506 SECTION 23. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 507 of Section 1, authorized for expenditure in Section 2, and 508 allocated in Section 4 to Mississippi State Hospital, funds not to 509 exceed Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) may be 510 expended for preplanning costs associated with a project or projects to renovate buildings on the campus of Mississippi State 511 Hospital to meet standards of the Joint Commission on 512 Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations. 513

514 SECTION 24. None of the funds appropriated for the support 515 of community mental health, mental retardation, or substance abuse 516 services shall be made available to any service provider which, 517 upon determination of the Executive Director of the Department of 518 Mental Health, has an outstanding monetary obligation owed to the 519 Department of Mental Health or to the Division of Medicaid, 520 pursuant to an audit or programmatic review performed by the 521 Department of Mental Health, that has not been resolved, including 522 those audits or programmatic reviews that occurred prior to 523 July 1, 2004.

SECTION 25. From the funds provided herein, the Department shall have the authority to adjust salaries of academic teachers to be commensurate to the teacher's salary scale as provided in the Mississippi Teacher Opportunity Program for the 2004-2005 school year, as outlined in Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, effective July 1, 2003.

SECTION 26. No program or entity certified by the Department 530 531 of Mental Health which also receives state source, federal source, or Medicaid funding directly from the Department of Mental Health 532 533 or by virtue of state source funds appropriated to the Department of Mental Health for Medicaid match for provision of mental 534 535 health, mental retardation, or substance abuse services shall pay 536 to any person employed by that program or entity a salary or compensation, directly or indirectly, in excess of the salary 537 538 provided for a similar position under the classification system of 539 the State Personnel Board for a person with similar credentials, 540 educational level, and directly related years of experience in the 541 position. Any person whose current salary already exceeds the 542 allowable amount as determined under this section shall be allowed 543 to retain his or her current salary, but no increases shall be 544 granted until such time as the allowable maximum salary under the 545 classification system of the State Personnel Board exceeds the 546 current salary paid to that person. Those programs and entities 547 may adopt a system of compensation that includes additional compensation for Educational Benchmarks as allowed under the State 548 549 Personnel Board system. Further, the Department of Mental Health 550 and the State Personnel Board shall collaborate in determining 551 similarity of positions in those programs or entities affected by 552 this Section to positions within the classification system of the 553 State Personnel Board in any manner they deem appropriate to 554 efficiently implement the provisions of this Section. Staff

555 of the State Personnel Board and the Department of Mental Health 556 shall be the final authority in the determination of corresponding 557 job titles and pay grades. Failure to comply with the provisions 558 of this Section shall be cause to reduce or terminate funding 559 received from the Department of Mental Health.

560 SECTION 27. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 561 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 562 563 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 564 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 565 566 SECTION 28. This act shall take effect and be in force from 567 and after July 1, 2004.
