House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3143

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
5	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
6	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
7	defraying the expenses and paying salaries of the Veterans Affairs
8	Board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending
9	June 30, 2005\$ 1,355,025.00.
10	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
11	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
12	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Veterans Affairs
13	Board which is comprised of special source funds collected by or
14	otherwise available to the board, for the support and maintenance
15	of said board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and
16	ending June 30, 2005\$ 26,822,997.00.
17	SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions
18	of Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized:
19	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:
20	Permanent: Full Time
21	Part Time
22	Time-Limited: Full Time
23	Part Time 100
24	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
25	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
26	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
27	Services" for Fiscal Year 2006 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2005
28	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
29	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2006 budget by the

Based on data provided by the 31 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 32 33 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 34 act. 35 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 36 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2005 appropriation for "Personal 37 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 38 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 39 40 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2005 "Personal Services" 41 42 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 43 44 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 45 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 46 47 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 48 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 49 50 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 51 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 52 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 53 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 54 appropriated level.

55 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 56 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 57 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 58 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

59 SECTION 4. The funds authorized herein shall be used to fund 60 all operations of the agency with the following prohibitions: 61 (1) The agency shall not fill any current or future vacant

63 (2) The agency shall not take any action to promote or64 otherwise award salary increases through reallocation,

S. B. 3143 PAGE 2 65 reclassification, realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, 66 or any other means to increase salaries of employees or positions 67 except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House Bill No. 68 1279, 2004 Regular Session;

69 (3) The agency shall not expend funds for out-of-state
70 travel except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House
71 Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Session;

72 (4) The agency shall not expend funds for the purchase of or 73 contract for cellular phones, two-way radios or pagers, except for 74 support of employees in the Department of Public Safety and the 75 Bureau of Narcotics as recommended by Information Technology 76 Services or as allowed under the provisions set forth in House 77 Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Session;

78 (5) The agency shall not expend funds to publish or79 distribute any annual reports or other publications;

80 (6) The agency shall not expend funds for public relation
81 activities regarding the functions, programs or services of the
82 agency except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House
83 Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Session;

84 (7) The agency shall not advertise the functions, programs
85 or services of the agency except that the Mississippi Development
86 Authority is authorized to expend funds for advertising to carry
87 out the purposes of key programs administered by the authority;

88 (8) The agency shall not expend funds for staff development89 or training services;

90 (9) The agency shall not expend funds for the purchase of 91 new or replacement equipment or furniture, excluding lease 92 purchase payments on agreements in effect upon passage of this 93 appropriation bill, except as allowed under the provisions set 94 forth in House Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Session.

95 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that none 96 of the funds appropriated above shall be expended unless members 97 of the Mississippi House of Representatives and Mississippi Senate 98 are notified at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony 99 announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public 100 announcement or ceremony regarding the groundbreaking or opening 101 of a facility, roadway or bridge for which the Legislature has 102 made funds available. Any signage regarding any public event or 103 any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following 104 language: "Funds were made available for this project by the 105 Mississippi State Legislature."

SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 106 107 Sections 1 and 2, funds in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty 108 Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) are provided to defray the cost of providing care to indigent/low-income Mississippi veterans and the 109 110 non-veteran surviving spouses of Mississippi veterans if the surviving spouse was a resident of a state veterans home at the 111 112 time of the veteran's death and who, subsequent to the veteran's death, meets the indigent/low-income criteria established by the 113 114 State Veterans Affairs Board, in the state veterans homes. It is 115 the intention of the Legislature that the provision pertaining to 116 use of indigent/low-income surviving spouses be retroactive for 117 any such period, prior to the effective date of this act, that a 118 current surviving spouse may have met the criteria. This section 119 and its provisions shall be known and cited as the "Hilton R. 'Jack' Vance Act of 1997." 120

121 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 122 Veterans Affairs Board shall maintain complete accounting and 123 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 124 appropriated under the provisions of this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of details as 125 maintained for Fiscal Year 2004. It is further the intention of 126 the Legislature that the budget request for Fiscal Year 2006 shall 127 128 be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 129 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2005 budget request process. 130

131 SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 132 Section 2, Six Hundred Sixty-seven Thousand Two Hundred Ninety 133 Dollars (\$667,290.00) shall be derived from the Health Care 134 Expendable Fund for the purpose of defraying the expenses of state 135 veterans homes.

136 SECTION 9. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 137 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 138 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 139 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 140 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 141 142 SECTION 10. This act shall take effect and be in force from 143 and after July 1, 2004.
