Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

Senate Bill No. 2386

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

Section 55-15-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 25 SECTION 1. reenacted as follows: 26 55-15-51. It is hereby found and determined by the 27 Legislature that many thousands of Mississippians have served in 28 the Armed Forces of the United States; that the Mississippi 29 30 veterans have not received the recognition and honor they deserve 31 for service to their country; and that an appropriate monument should be established and maintained as a symbol of the 32 recognition and appreciation of the State of Mississippi to 33 34 Mississippi veterans. 35 SECTION 2. Section 55-15-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted and amended as follows: 36 37 55-15-53. (1) From and after the effective date of Laws, 1997, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the present membership 38 of the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall cease 39 40 serving on the commission. From and after the effective date of 41 Laws, 1997, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall consist of the following seven 42 43 (7) members:

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The Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans 44 (a) 45 Memorial Commission, who shall serve as Secretary of the 46 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission; 47 (b) The Executive Secretary of the State Veterans 48 Affairs Board; The Director of the Division of General Services in 49 (C) the Department of Finance and Administration; 50 51 Three (3) members appointed by the Governor, one (d) (1) from each of the three (3) state Supreme Court districts as 52 53 follows: 54 (i) One (1) veteran of World War II; (ii) One (1) veteran of the Korean Conflict; and 55 (iii) One (1) veteran of the Vietnam Conflict; 56 One (1) veteran of the Persian Gulf Conflict, 57 (e) 58 appointed from the state at large by the Lieutenant Governor. 59 (2) The initial meeting of the commission shall be called and chaired by the Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans 60 61 Memorial Commission, until the monument commission shall choose a chairman from among its members. Thereafter, the commission shall 62 63 elect a chairman each year, and the commission may meet at the call of the chairman once each month. Minutes of the meetings of 64 65 the commission shall be kept in a well-bound book and, along with all other records and papers, shall remain in the custody of the 66 secretary of the commission. A majority of the commission shall 67 68 constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. All actions taken or rules and regulations adopted by the commission shall be 69 70 by resolution duly spread upon its minutes, showing yea and nay votes of each member present. The signature of the chairman and 71 72 secretary, pursuant to a duly adopted resolution, shall be binding upon the commission. 73

74 (3) The appointed members of the Mississippi Veterans75 Monument Commission shall receive per diem compensation in the

amount authorized under Section 25-3-69 for each day or portion 76 77 thereof spent in the performance of the duties of the commission 78 and shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses while 79 on commission business as authorized under Section 25-3-41. Other 80 members of the commission shall not be entitled to compensation 81 but shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses as authorized under Section 25-3-41 while on commission business. 82 Commission members shall be limited to reimbursement of travel 83 expenses and per diem compensation authorized herein for no more 84 85 than twelve (12) meetings per year.

86 (4) When the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission ceases
87 to exist, all records of the Mississippi Veterans Monument
88 Commission shall become the property of the Mississippi War
89 Veterans Memorial Commission.

90 (5) The Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission shall
91 have continuing oversight responsibility over all activities
92 pertaining to all Mississippi veterans monuments.

93 (6) The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall
94 continue in existence under the provisions of this chapter after
95 the design, construction and dedication of the Mississippi
96 veterans monument until July 1, 2006, so that such commission can
97 provide for the design, construction and dedication of future
98 monuments to be located at sites designated by the Mississippi
99 Veterans Monument Commission.

SECTION 3. Section 55-15-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted as follows:

102 55-15-55. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is 103 hereby authorized and directed to cause to be constructed and 104 maintained an appropriate monument to honor Mississippi veterans 105 when adequate funds for the construction thereof are deposited in 106 the Veterans Monument Trust Fund herein created.

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107 SECTION 4. Section 55-15-57, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 108 reenacted as follows:

109 55-15-57. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission 110 shall:

(a) Plan and provide for the design, construction and dedication of the Mississippi veterans monument. The actual design and site of the monument shall be selected with the approval of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History.

(b) Solicit private monetary donations for deposit into the Veterans Monument Trust Fund.

(c) Report to the Legislature by November 15 of each year on the progress of such monument. In addition to the report required in the preceding sentence, the commission shall submit an annual report on its activities no later than November of each year to the Military Affairs Committees of both the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Mississippi Senate.

123 SECTION 5. Section 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 124 reenacted as follows:

55-15-59. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is 125 126 hereby authorized to accept gifts, grants and donations from individuals and organizations, to be deposited in the Veterans 127 128 Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 129 The State Treasurer shall invest all monies in the Veterans Monument Trust Fund and any interest earned shall be deposited 130 131 into the fund. All appropriated funds and funds deposited in the Veterans Monument Trust Fund shall be used exclusively for the 132 133 purpose of designing, erecting, maintaining and dedication of the veterans monument, except that not more than Seven Thousand Five 134 135 Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) may be expended annually to pay the 136 administrative costs of the commission. Costs associated with the 137 designing, erecting, maintaining and dedication of the veterans 138 monument are not considered commission administrative costs for

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purposes of this section. Upon completion of the monument, money in the trust fund shall be utilized by the Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission for maintenance of the veterans monument and memorials.

143 SECTION 6. Section 55-15-61, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 144 reenacted as follows:

145 55-15-61. (1) In addition to the duties assigned to the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55, 146 147 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission shall plan and provide for the design, construction and dedication 148 149 of a Mississippi Confederate memorial at the Shiloh National 150 Military Park. In planning the design, construction and 151 dedication of the memorial, the commission shall consult with and 152 be advised by an advisory committee composed of three (3) 153 representatives from the Mississippi Department of the Sons of 154 Confederate Veterans. The Mississippi Department of the Sons of 155 Confederate Veterans shall designate such representatives and 156 certify them to the commission. The commission shall solicit 157 private monetary donations for deposit into a Shiloh Confederate 158 Memorial Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 159 Private donations to the trust fund may be matched by the state 160 using any appropriations made for that purpose by the Legislature; 161 however, any state match shall not exceed One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) in the aggregate. The commission 162 163 is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust fund grants or donations made to it from any other source. All funds 164 165 deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for the 166 purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the monument. 167 (2) The board of supervisors of any county and the governing 168 authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and

169 empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any

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available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the ShilohConfederate Memorial Trust Fund.

172 SECTION 7. Section 55-15-62, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 173 reenacted as follows:

174 55-15-62. (1) In addition to the duties assigned to the 175 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55, 176 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission is 177 hereby authorized, subject to any available funds, to plan and 178 provide for the design, construction and dedication of a monument recognizing Mississippi recipients of the Congressional Medal of 179 180 In planning the design, construction and dedication of the Honor. monument, the commission shall consult with and be advised by the 181 182 State Veterans Affairs Board. The commission may solicit private 183 monetary donations for deposit into a Congressional Medal of Honor 184 Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 185 Private donations to the trust fund may be accepted. The 186 commission is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust 187 fund grants or donations made to it from any other source. All funds deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for 188 189 the purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the 190 monument.

191 (2) The board of supervisors of any county and the governing 192 authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and 193 empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any 194 available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the 195 Congressional Medal of Honor Monument Trust Fund.

196 SECTION 8. Section 55-15-63, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 197 amended as follows:

198 55-15-63. Sections 55-15-51 through 55-15-62, Mississippi
199 Code of 1972, which create and empower the Mississippi Veterans
200 Monument Commission, are repealed from and after July 1, 2006.

201 **SECTION 9.** Section 33-3-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 202 amended as follows:

(1) The Governor is hereby authorized and 203 33-3-17. 204 empowered to decorate members and former members of the 205 Mississippi National Guard and members and former members of the national guard of the several states and members and former 206 207 members of the armed forces of the United States, who he may deem worthy of such decoration, with such awards, medals or decorations 208 209 as he may prescribe by rules and regulations promulgated by him, and the Governor is hereby authorized to promulgate suitable and 210 211 reasonable rules and regulations for such purposes.

212 (2) The Governor shall award posthumously the Mississippi 213 Medal of Valor to those members of the Mississippi National Guard 214 who gave their lives while in active service of the United States 215 as defined in Section 33-1-1(1).

216 (3) The Governor may award retroactively the Mississippi 217 Medal of Valor to a member or former member of the Armed Forces of 218 the United States if such member has been awarded the Medal of 219 Honor or the Purple Heart.

220 (4) The design of the Mississippi Medal of Valor is as follows: A gold medal with the Great Seal of the State of 221 222 Mississippi superimposed on a cross combined with crossed sabers with the words "MEDAL FOR VALOR" inscribed around the seal. The 223 medal is suspended from a ribbon of navy blue background, with two 224 225 (2) wide, vertical white bands. The recipient's name and rank are engraved in the reverse side of the medal. The ribbon carries the 226 227 same colors as described for the medal.

228 **SECTION 10.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 229 and after July 1, 2004.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

1 AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 55-15-51 THROUGH 55-15-62, 2 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI VETERANS 3 MONUMENT COMMISSION, PRESCRIBE ITS POWERS AND DUTIES AND ESTABLISH THE VETERANS MONUMENT TRUST FUND, THE SHILOH CONFEDERATE MEMORIAL 4 5 TRUST FUND AND THE CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR MONUMENT TRUST 6 FUND; TO AMEND REENACTED SECTION 55-15-53, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE MISSISSIPPI VETERANS MONUMENT COMMISSION WILL CONTINUE IN EXISTENCE UNTIL JULY 1, 2006, IN ORDER TO PROVIDE FOR THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION AND DEDICATION OF FUTURE MONUMENTS TO 7 8 9 10 BE LOCATED AT SITES DESIGNATED BY THE COMMISSION; TO AMEND SECTION 55-15-63, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE DATE OF THE REPEALER ON THE SECTION OF LAW THAT CREATES THE MISSISSIPPI 11 12 VETERANS MONUMENT COMMISSION, PRESCRIBE ITS POWERS AND DUTIES AND 13 ESTABLISH THE VETERANS MONUMENT TRUST FUND, THE SHILOH CONFEDERATE 14 15 MEMORIAL TRUST FUND AND THE CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR MONUMENT 16 TRUST FUND; TO AMEND SECTION 33-3-17, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 17 PROVIDE THAT THE GOVERNOR SHALL AWARD POSTHUMOUSLY THE MISSISSIPPI MEDAL OF VALOR TO MEMBERS OF THE MISSISSIPPI NATIONAL GUARD WHO 18 GAVE THEIR LIVES WHILE IN ACTIVE SERVICE OF THE UNITED STATES; TO 19 20 PROVIDE THAT THE GOVERNOR MAY AWARD RETROACTIVELY THE MISSISSIPPI 21 MEDAL OF VALOR TO PERSONS AWARDED THE MEDAL OF HONOR OR THE PURPLE HEART; TO PROVIDE FOR THE DESIGN OF THE MISSISSIPPI MEDAL OF 2.2 23 VALOR; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
