## Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 636

### TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

14	SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

16	37-19-7. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited
17	as the Mississippi "Teacher Opportunity Program (TOP)." The
18	allowance in the minimum education program and the Mississippi

21	accordance with the scale for teachers' salaries as provided in

For each one percent (1%) that the Sine Die General Fund Revenue Estimate 64 Growth exceeds five percent (5%) for fiscal year 2006, as 65 certified by the Legislative Budget Office to the State Board of 66 67 Education and subject to specific appropriation therefor by the Legislature, the State Board of Education shall revise the salary 68 69 scale to provide an additional one percent (1%) across the board 70 increase in the base salaries for each type of license. 71 It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made 72 available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall 73 74 be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal

75 and compensation system implemented by the State Board of

76 Education. The State Board of Education shall have the authority

77 to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to

All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no school district shall receive any funds under this section for any school year during which the local supplement paid to any individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties from local supplement during the immediately preceding school

86 year. The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health

87 and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the

88 aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered a

89 part of the amount of individual local supplement.

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#### 2004-2005 School Year Annual Increment

For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Forty Dollars (\$740.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$675.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Ten Dollars (\$610.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four

Hundred Sixty-five Dollars (\$465.00) for each year of teaching
experience possessed by the person holding such license until such
person shall have twenty-four (24) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$770.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Five Dollars (\$705.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Forty Dollars (\$640.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$480.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-four (24) years of teaching experience.

The level of professional training of each teacher to be used in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current school year.

140 (2) (a) The following employees shall receive an annual
141 salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars
142 (\$6,000.00), plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other
143 compensation to which the employee may be entitled:

144 Any licensed teacher who has met the 145 requirements and acquired a Master Teacher certificate from the 146 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and who is 147 employed by a local school board or the State Board of Education 148 as a teacher and not as an administrator. Such teacher shall 149 submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the 150 certificate was received prior to October 15 in order to be 151 eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school 152 year, or the teacher shall submit such documentation to the State 153 Department of Education prior to February 15 in order to be 154 eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the 155 second term of the school year. In addition, any school counselor 156 that started the National Board for Professional Teaching 157 Standards process for school counselors between June 1, 2003, and 158 June 30, 2004, and completes the requirements and acquires the 159 Master Teacher certificate shall be entitled to the Master Teacher 160 supplement and those that complete the process shall be entitled to a one-time reimbursement for the actual cost of the process as 161 162 outlined in subsection (2)(b) of this section. (ii) Any licensed school counselor who has met the 163 164 requirements and acquired a National Certified School Counselor (NCSC) endorsement from the National Board of Certified Counselors 165 166 and who is employed by a local school board or the State Board of 167 Education as a counselor and not as an administrator. licensed school counselor shall submit documentation to the State 168 169 Department of Education that the endorsement was received prior to 170 October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school year, or the licensed school counselor shall 171 172 submit such documentation to the State Department of Education 173 prior to February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary 174 supplement beginning with the second term of the school 175 year. \* \* \* 176 (iii) Any licensed speech-language pathologist and audiologist who has met the requirements and acquired a 177

Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American

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179 Speech-Language-Hearing Association and who is employed by a local

180 school board. Such licensed speech-language pathologist and

181 audiologist shall submit documentation to the State Department of

182 Education that the certificate or endorsement was received prior

183 to October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary

185 speech-language pathologist and audiologist shall submit such

February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary

supplement beginning with the second term of the school

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(b) An employee shall be reimbursed one (1) time for the actual cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement, excluding any costs incurred for postgraduate courses, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for a school counselor or speech-language pathologist and audiologist, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. A local school district or any private individual or entity may pay the cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for any employee of the school district described under paragraph (a), and the State Department of Education shall reimburse the

If a private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing

the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an

employee, the local school district may agree to directly

appropriation by the Legislature. Local school districts shall
not reduce the local supplement paid to any employee receiving
such salary supplement, and the employee shall receive any local
supplement to which employees with similar training and experience
otherwise are entitled.

219 (d) The State Department of Education may not pay any process reimbursement to a school district for an employee who 220 221 does not complete the certification or endorsement process 222 required to be eligible for the certificate or endorsement. employee for whom such cost has been paid in full or in part by a 223 224 local school district or private individual or entity fails to complete the certification or endorsement process, the employee 225 shall be liable to the school district or individual or entity for 226 all amounts paid by the school district or individual or entity on 227 228 behalf of that employee toward his or her certificate or
