Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 715

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

6 Section 73-25-14, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows: 73-25-14. (1) The license of every person licensed to 8 9 practice medicine or osteopathy in the State of Mississippi shall be renewed annually. 10 On or before May 1 of each year, the State Board of Medical 11 12 Licensure shall mail a notice of renewal of license to every physician or osteopath to whom a license was issued or renewed 13 14 during the current licensing year. The notice shall provide 15 instructions for obtaining and submitting applications for renewal. The State Board of Medical Licensure is authorized to 16 make applications for renewal available via electronic means. 17 18 applicant shall obtain and complete the application and submit it to the board in the manner prescribed by the board in the notice 19 20 before June 30 with the renewal fee of an amount established by 21 the board, but not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), a portion of which fee shall be used to support a program to aid 22 impaired physicians and osteopaths. The payment of the annual 23 license renewal fee shall be optional with all physicians over the 24 25 age of seventy (70) years. Upon receipt of the application and fee, the board shall verify the accuracy of the application and 26 issue to applicant a certificate of renewal for the ensuing year, 27 beginning July 1 and expiring June 30 of the succeeding calendar 28 year. That renewal shall render the holder thereof a legal 29

practitioner as stated on the renewal form.

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- 31 (2) Any physician or osteopath practicing in Mississippi who
- 32 allows his or her license to lapse by failing to renew the license
- 33 as provided in subsection (1) may be reinstated by the board on
- 34 satisfactory explanation for the failure to renew, by completion
- 35 of a reinstatement form, and upon payment of the renewal fee for
- 36 the current year, and shall be assessed a fine of Twenty-five
- 37 Dollars (\$25.00) plus an additional fine of Five Dollars (\$5.00)
- 38 for each month thereafter that the license renewal remains
- 39 delinquent.
- 40 (3) Any physician or osteopath not practicing in Mississippi
- 41 who allows his or her license to lapse by failing to renew the
- 42 license as provided in subsection (1) may be reinstated by the
- 43 board on satisfactory explanation for the failure to renew, by
- 44 completion of a reinstatement form and upon payment of the
- 45 arrearages for the previous five (5) years and the renewal fee for
- 46 the current year.
- 47 (4) Any physician or osteopath who allows his or her license
- 48 to lapse shall be notified by the board within thirty (30) days of
- 49 that lapse.
- 50 (5) Any person practicing as a licensed physician or
- 51 osteopath during the time his or her license has lapsed shall be
- 52 considered an illegal practitioner and shall be subject to
- 53 penalties provided for violation of the Medical Practice Act,
- 54 provided that he or she had not submitted the required
- 55 reinstatement form and fee within fifteen (15) days after
- 56 notification by the board of the lapse.
- 57 (6) Any physician or osteopath practicing in the State of
- 58 Mississippi whose license has lapsed and is deemed an illegal
- 59 practitioner under subsection (5) of this section may petition the
- 60 board for reinstatement of his or her license on a retroactive
- 61 basis, if the physician or osteopath was unable to meet the June
- 62 30 deadline due to extraordinary or other legitimate reasons, and
- 63 retroactive reinstatement of licensure shall be granted or may be
- 64 denied by the board only for good cause. Failure to advise the

- board of change of address shall not be considered a basis of 65
- 66 reinstatement.
- 67 None of the fees or fines provided for in this section
- 68 shall be applicable to the renewal of a special volunteer medical
- license authorized under Section 73-25-18. 69
- 70 Fees collected under the provisions of this section
- 71 shall be used by the board to defray expenses of administering the
- licensure provisions of the Medical Practice Act (Title 73, 72
- 73 Chapter 25, Mississippi Code of 1972) and to support a program to
- aid impaired physicians and osteopaths in an amount determined by 74
- 75 the board.
- 76 SECTION 2. Section 73-27-12, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 77 amended as follows:
- 78 73-27-12. (1) The license of every person licensed to
- 79 practice podiatry in the State of Mississippi shall be renewed
- 80 annually.
- On or before May 1 of each year, the board shall mail a 81
- 82 notice of renewal of license to every podiatrist to whom a license
- 83 was issued or renewed during the current licensing year.
- notice shall provide instructions for obtaining and submitting 84
- applications for renewal. The State Board of Medical Licensure is 85
- 86 authorized to make applications for renewal available via
- 87 electronic means. The applicant shall obtain and complete the
- 88 application and submit it to the board in the manner prescribed by
- 89 the board in the notice before June 30 with the renewal fee of an
- amount established by the board, but not to exceed Two Hundred 90
- Dollars (\$200.00), a portion of which fee shall be used to support 91
- a program to aid impaired podiatrists. Upon receipt of the 92
- application and fee, the board shall verify the accuracy of the 93
- 94 application and issue to applicant a certificate of renewal for
- the ensuing year, beginning July 1 and expiring June 30 of the 95
- 96 succeeding calendar year. That renewal shall render the holder
- thereof a legal practitioner as stated on the renewal form. 97
- Any podiatrist practicing in Mississippi who allows his 98
- 99 or her license to lapse by failing to renew the license as

- provided in subsection (1) may be reinstated by the board on 100
- 101 satisfactory explanation for the failure to renew, by completion
- 102 of a reinstatement form, and upon payment of the renewal fee for
- 103 the current year, and shall be assessed a fine of Twenty-five
- 104 Dollars (\$25.00) plus an additional fine of Five Dollars (\$5.00)
- 105 for each month thereafter that the license renewal remains
- 106 delinquent.
- (3) Any podiatrist not practicing in Mississippi who allows 107
- 108 his or her license to lapse by failing to renew the license as
- provided in subsection (1) may be reinstated by the board on 109
- 110 satisfactory explanation for the failure to renew, by completion
- of a reinstatement form and upon payment of the arrearages for the 111
- previous five (5) years and the renewal fee for the current year. 112
- (4) Any podiatrist who allows his or her license to lapse 113
- 114 shall be notified by the board within thirty (30) days of that
- 115 lapse.
- 116 Any person practicing as a licensed podiatrist during
- 117 the time his or her license has lapsed shall be considered an
- 118 illegal practitioner and shall be subject to penalties set forth
- in Section 73-27-17, provided that he or she has not submitted the 119
- required reinstatement form and fee within fifteen (15) days after 120
- notification by the board of the lapse. 121
- 122 Any podiatrist practicing in the State of Mississippi
- 123 whose license has lapsed and is deemed an illegal practitioner
- under subsection (5) of this section may petition the board for 124
- reinstatement of his or her license on a retroactive basis, if the 125
- podiatrist was unable to meet the June 30 deadline due to 126
- 127 extraordinary or other legitimate reasons, and retroactive
- reinstatement of licensure shall be granted or may be denied by 128
- 129 the board only for good cause. Failure to advise the board of
- change of address shall not be considered a basis for 130
- 131 reinstatement.
- 132 (7) Fees collected under the provisions of this section
- shall be used by the board to defray expenses of administering the 133
- licensure provisions of Title 73, Chapter 27, Mississippi Code of 134

- 135 1972, and to support a program to aid impaired podiatrists in an
- 136 amount determined by the board.
- 137 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 138 and after its passage.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 73-25-14 AND 73-27-12, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE RENEWAL OF LICENSES TO PRACTICE MEDICINE OR OSTEOPATHY AND PODIATRY BY ELECTRONIC MEANS; AND FOR

4 RELATED PURPOSES.
