## Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1107

## TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 8 **SECTION 1.** Section 49-7-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 49-7-3. (1) Any resident of the State of Mississippi shall
- 11 be entitled to receive a resident fishing license.
- 12 (2) Any person domiciled within the State of Mississippi
- 13 shall be entitled to receive a resident hunting license provided
- 14 in Section 49-7-5. The domicile of a person is that person's
- 15 principal or primary home or place of abode. A "principal or
- 16 primary home or place of abode" is that home or place in which a
- 17 person's habitation is fixed and to which he, whenever absent, has
- 18 the present intention of returning after a departure of absence
- 19 therefrom, regardless of the duration of the absence. The burden
- 20 of proving domicile shall be on the person claiming such status.
- 21 The following evidence or other reliable evidence may be
- 22 considered in establishing, but is not necessarily determinative
- 23 of, domicile: driver's license, residence for income or other tax
- 24 purposes, homestead exemption receipt, or any other means
- 25 prescribed by the department. In the case of minors, domicile of
- 26 the parents shall be used as evidence of the minor's domicile.
- 27 (3) A nondomiciliary of the state may be issued a resident
- 28 hunting or fishing license or combination resident hunting/fishing
- 29 license upon providing the following:
- 30 (a) A current identification card from a Mississippi
- 31 college or university; or
- 32 (b) A current military identification card showing that
- 33 the person is an active member of the <u>United States</u> Armed Forces

- 34 (excluding Reserves and the National Guard) and proof that the
- 35 person is stationed on a military base in Mississippi; or.
- 36 (c) If not stationed on a military base in Mississippi,
- 37 a current military identification card showing that a person is an
- 38 active member in the United States Armed Forces (excluding
- 39 Reserves and the National Guard) and approval of such request for
- 40 a license by the commission. This paragraph (c) shall stand
- 41 repealed from and after June 30, 2004.
- 42 (4) A holder of a resident or nonresident license is
- 43 required to carry the license on his person while engaged in
- 44 hunting, trapping or fishing. Any penalty for not carrying a
- 45 license while engaged in hunting, trapping or fishing shall be
- 46 waived if the person can verify purchase of a license prior to the
- 47 date of the violation.
- 48 (5) Each application or filing made under this section shall
- 49 include the Social Security number(s) of the applicant in
- 50 accordance with Section 93-11-64 \* \* \*.
- 51 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 52 and after July 1, 2004.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO

AUTHORIZE A NONRESIDENT OF THE STATE TO BE ISSUED A RESIDENT

3 HUNTING OR FISHING LICENSE OR COMBINATION RESIDENT HUNTING AND

4 FISHING LICENSE UPON PROOF THAT SUCH PERSON IS AN ACTIVE MEMBER OF

5 THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE

6 COMMISSION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
