Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1178

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7	SECTION 1. Section 37-151-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
8	amended as follows:
9	37-151-17. (1) There is established the Council for
10	Education Technology, which shall be an advisory group attached to
11	the Board of the Department of Information Technology Services and
12	the State Board of Education. The council shall develop a master
13	plan for education technology.
14	(2) <u>(a)</u> The council shall consist of the <u>following members</u>
15	who shall serve as ex officio voting members:
16	(i) The Director of the Management Information
17	Services in the Department of Education;
18	(ii) The Director of Educational Technology in the
19	Department of Education;
20	(iii) The Executive Director of the Mississippi
21	Department of Information Technology Services;
22	(iv) The Executive Director of Mississippi Public
23	Broadcasting;
24	(v) The Executive Director of the Mississippi
25	Library Commission;
26	(vi) The Executive Director of the State Board for
27	Community and Junior Colleges; and
28	(vii) The Commissioner of Higher Education * * *.
29	(b) The following six (6) members to be appointed no
30	later than August 1, 2004, as follows:
31	(i) One (1) member appointed by the State Board of
32	Education;
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33 (ii) Two (2) members appointed by the 34 Governor; * * * (iii) One (1) member appointed by the Lieutenant 35 36 Governor; (iv) One (1) member appointed by the Board of 37 38 Information Technology Services; and 39 (v) One (1) member appointed by the Executive Director of the Mississippi Development Authority. All appointed 40 41 members of the council shall have a demonstrated knowledge in the use, applications and specifications of education 42 43 technology * * *. A majority of the membership present at any meeting shall constitute a quorum for the official conduct of 44 45 business. (c) Members appointed to the council before August 1, 46 47 2004, shall be subject to reappointment or replacement by the 48 appointing entity. (3) Members shall be appointed for four-year terms and may 49 50 be reappointed for one (1) additional four-year term. Members may 51 be reimbursed for mileage and actual and necessary expenses in accordance with state law, and members who are not state officers 52 53 or employees shall receive per diem as authorized in Section 54 25-3-69, Mississippi Code of 1972. 55 (4) Immediately upon receiving notice of the appointment of all members, the Executive Director of the Department of 56 57 Information and Technology Services shall call an organizational meeting no later than September 15, 2004, and shall serve as 58 chairperson of the council for the first year beginning with the 59 60 date of the organizational meeting. The council shall elect from among the members * * * any other officers it deems necessary, and 61 62 define the duties of the officers. The council shall annually elect a chairperson and no member shall serve more than two (2) 63 64 consecutive years as chairperson.

(5) Meetings shall be held at least four (4) times per year,
or upon call of the <u>chairperson</u>, at a time and place designated by
the <u>chairperson</u>. The <u>Department of Information and Technology</u>

69 support for the council.

70 (6) The duties and responsibilities of the council shall71 include, but not be limited to, the following:

72 (a) Developing and updating annually a long-range 73 master plan for the efficient and equitable use of technology at 74 all levels from primary school through higher education, including vocational and adult education. The plan shall focus on the 75 76 technology requirements of classroom instruction, literacy laboratories, student record management, financial and 77 78 administrative management, distance learning and communications as they relate to the state's performance goals for students. 79 The annual plan shall include specific and detailed cost projections 80 and analysis related to its implementation. The plan shall be 81 82 presented to the Mississippi Department of Information Technology 83 Services for approval and a copy shall be provided annually to the Legislature no later than November 1, highlighting any cost 84 85 projections and a detailed budget and justifications for

86 implementation of the plan;

87 (b) Creating, overseeing and monitoring a well-planned
88 and efficient statewide network of technology services designed to
89 meet the educational and informational needs of the schools;

90 (c) Working with private enterprise to encourage the 91 development of technology products specifically designed to answer 92 Mississippi's educational needs;

93 (d) Encouraging an environment receptive to 94 technological progress in education throughout the state; * * * 95 (e) Working with other state entities to maximize the 96 use and benefit of the state's technology infrastructure, to avoid 97 duplication of public and private resources and to maximize the 98 purchasing ability of the state. When appropriate, shared 99 resources and competitive bidding shall be used<u>; and</u>

100(f) Ensuring collaboration of all education entities to101maximize efficiency and cost savings and to enhance the

102 utilization of education technology as a means of impacting the

103 shortage of teachers.

104 All contracts, requests for proposals and bid awards shall be 105 subject to the approval of the Mississippi Department of 106 Information Technology Services.

107 SECTION 2. Section 37-151-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 108 amended as follows:

37-151-19. (1) The Council for Education Technology shall 109 110 develop and update annually the master plan for education technology and submit the plan to the Board of the Department of 111 Information Technology Services, State Board of Education and the 112 The annual master plan shall include detailed and 113 Legislature. specific cost projections and a detailed budget for its 114 implementation. Implementation of each stage of the master plan 115 116 shall begin immediately upon approval of the Board of the 117 Department of Information Technology Services and the State Board of Education, and upon any appropriation of any necessary funding 118 119 required to carry out the objectives of the plan. The plan shall outline the state's five-year activities related to purchasing, 120 developing and using technology to: 121

122 (a) Improve learning and teaching and the ability to meet individual students' needs to increase student achievement; 123

124 (b) Improve curriculum delivery to help meet the needs 125 for educational equity across the state;

Improve delivery of professional development; (C)

Improve the efficiency and productivity of 127 (d) administrators; and 128

129 (e) Encourage development by the private sector and 130 acquisition by districts of technologies and applications 131 appropriate for education.

(2) The five-year plan, which shall be updated annually, 132 133 shall cover all aspects of education technology, including but not limited to, its use in educational instruction and administration, 134 135 video and computer systems, software and hardware, multiple delivery systems for satellite, microwave, cable, instructional 136 H. 137 television fixed service, fiber optic and computer connections 138 products, video cameras and monitoring equipment for classrooms, 139 school buildings and school buses, the preparation of school 140 buildings for technological readiness, and the development of 141 staff necessary to implement the plan.

142 (3) Periodically, to develop and make specific recommendations to the Board of the Department of Information 143 Technology Services and the State Board of Education for the 144 145 adoption of minimum specifications for the equipment to be utilized in the education technology plan by school districts. 146 The Board of the Department of Information Technology Services and 147 the State Board of Education shall adopt and promulgate said 148 149 minimum guidelines for the utilization of said education 150 technology equipment * * *.

151 (4) The integrated technology-based communications system 152 shall provide comprehensive, current, accurate and accessible 153 information relating to management, finance, operations, 154 instruction and pupil programs which are under the jurisdiction of 155 the Department of Education.

156 (5) To facilitate communication among teachers, parents, 157 students and prospective employers of students, and to provide 158 access to many vital technological services, the five-year plan 159 may include the installation of telephone lines in each classroom.

(6) In designing and implementing the five-year plan, the
 council shall consider seeking the active participation of private
 organizations whose knowledge and assistance will be useful.

(7) The council shall update as necessary, but not less than
annually, the plan developed under subsection (2) of this section
and report to the Legislature, the Board of the Department of
Information Technology Services and the State Board of Education

167 at the completion of each implementation phase of the master plan. 168 * * *

169 SECTION 3. Section 37-151-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 170 amended as follows:

37-151-21. The council shall create a strategic plan for 171 172 distance learning in the state and submit it to the Legislature, the Board of the Department of Information Technology Services and 173 174 the State Board of Education by November 1, 2004. The plan shall set forth the state's vision for developing a long-term and 175 176 statewide distance learning strategy. It shall include, but not 177 be limited to, definitions of the types of distance learning 178 delivery systems, an evaluation process for determining and 179 certifying the educational and cost-effectiveness of each type of delivery system, comparisons of the various types of delivery 180 181 systems and recommendations for implementation. The plan shall include specific cost projections and a detailed budget for all 182 components of its implementation. 183 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from 184 185 and after its passage.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-151-17, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE COUNCIL FOR EDUCATION TECHNOLOGY; TO REVISE THE DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE COUNCIL; TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-151-19 AND 37-151-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
