## Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1725

## TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

6	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
7	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
8	Treasury to the credit of the Department of Transportation Funds,
9	for the purpose of defraying the administrative expenses of the
10	Mississippi Department of Transportation for the fiscal year
11	beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005
12	\$ 863,860,105.00.
13	SECTION 2. The following offices are supported by the funds
14	appropriated in Section 1: The Office of Administrative Services,
15	the Office of Highways, the Office of Aeronautics and Rails and
16	the Office of Enforcement. Of the funds appropriated under the
17	provisions of Section 1, not more than the amounts set forth below
18	shall be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of
19	expenditure:

36	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of	
37	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to	
38	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal	
39	Services" for Fiscal Year 2006 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2005	
40	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions	ŀ
41	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2006 budget by the	
42	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the	
43	Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall	
44	determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all	
45	appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this	
46	act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure	:
47	that no single personnel action increases this projected annual	
48	cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2005 appropriation for "Personal	
49	Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds.	
50	If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal	
51	Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency	
52	has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this	
53	projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2005 "Personal Services"	
54	appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which	h
55	reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation	
56	requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until	
57	such time as the requirements of this provision are met.	
58	Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance wit	h
59	the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or	
60	allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State	
61	Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written	
62	approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The	
63	Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide writte	n
64	approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions	
65	without proof of availability of new or additional funds above th	ıe
66	appropriated level.	

67 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 68 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 69 70 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. 71 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi 72 Department of Transportation under the provisions of Section 1 and authorized for expenditure in Section 2, the following amounts 73 74 shall be available for expenditure in the program budgets as 75 required by Section 27-103-127, Mississippi Code of 1972: 76 Administration and Other Expenses......\$ 41,256,705.00 77 Construction.....\$ 622,432,662.00 78 Maintenance.....\$ 139,121,506.00 79 Debt Service.....\$ 27,500,000.00 80 Law Enforcement.....\$ 8,522,373.00 81 Aeronautics, Rails and other.....\$ 25,026,859.00 82 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall maintain complete 83 84 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 85 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 86 87 Year 2004. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 88 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2006 shall be 89 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 90 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail 91 provided during the Fiscal Year 2005 budget request process. SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and 92 authorized for expenditure in Section 2, it is the intention of 93 94 the Legislature that Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of 95 96 Agriculture and Commerce for the Beaver Control or Eradication Program during the Fiscal Year 2005. 97 98 SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall expend 99

such funds as necessary to conduct project planning. Such project

planning shall apply to all preliminary engineering, right-of-way

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- acquisition and construction projects of the department and, at a 102
- 103 minimum, shall consist of policies for the oversight and
- 104 management of project cost which:
- 105 (a) Establish a reasonable cost estimate for each
- project. For purposes of this provision, projects include 106
- 107 preliminary engineering, right-of-way acquisition and
- 108 construction;
- Capture and retain the initial project cost 109 (b)
- 110 estimates for comparison with final actual expenditures;
- (c) Require that any changes to a cost estimate for a 111
- 112 project will be reviewed and approved by district or central
- office personnel. Such personnel shall be responsible for signing 113
- 114 any revision, and providing a narrative description of the reasons
- 115 for approving a revision;
- 116 Capture the cost of consultants, engineers,
- 117 attorneys, contract appraisers and other technical and
- professional contractors used in preliminary engineering, 118
- 119 right-of-way acquisition and construction projects.
- SECTION 7. (1) None of the funds appropriated under the 120
- provisions of Section 1 of this act may be expended by the 121
- 122 Department of Transportation for construction of new highways if
- 123 such highway segment is less than ten (10) miles in length unless:
- 124 The explanation and justification for letting such
- 125 a contract for a length of less than ten (10) miles is entered
- 126 upon the official minutes of the Transportation Commission;
- 127 (b) The commission, within ten (10) working days after
- entry of its explanation and justification upon its minutes, gives 128
- notice, by United States First Class Mail, and provides a copy of 129
- 130 such entry upon its minutes, to the Chairman of the Transportation
- 131 Committee of the Mississippi House of Representatives and the
- Chairman of the Mississippi Senate Highways and Transportation 132
- 133 Committee.
- 134 SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi
- 135 Department of Transportation, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars

- 136 (\$300,000.00) shall be used for the Statewide Litter Prevention
- 137 Program.
- SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 138
- 139 Mississippi Department of Transportation is hereby authorized to
- 140 receive, budget and expend in the Capital Outlay major object of
- 141 expenditure an amount not to exceed Two Million Dollars
- (\$2,000,000.00) resulting from funds received from third party 142
- 143 damages.
- 144 SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and
- allocated in Section 2, not less than Eighty Million Dollars 145
- 146 (\$80,000,000.00) shall be expended for contracted maintenance
- 147 overlay and pavement rehabilitation.
- SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 148
- Mississippi Department of Transportation shall have the authority 149
- 150 to escalate its budget in the Capital Outlay - Other Than
- 151 Equipment or the Commodities major objects of expenditure in the
- Maintenance Program, with funds which were obligated in Fiscal 152
- 153 Year 2004 for maintenance overlay projects and maintenance repair
- 154 projects but not completed by the end of Fiscal Year 2004, in an
- amount not to exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00). 155
- 156 escalation made from the authority granted in this Section shall
- 157 be reported to the Chairmen of the Appropriations Committees of
- 158 the Mississippi Senate and the Mississippi House of
- 159 Representatives, the Chairman of the Highways and Transportation
- 160 Committee of the Mississippi Senate, the Chairman of the
- Transportation Committee of the Mississippi House of 161
- Representatives, and the Legislative Budget Office, within fifteen 162
- (15) working days after said escalation. 163
- 164 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 165 Mississippi Department of Transportation shall have the authority
- to escalate and expend funds from any proceeds arising from 166
- 167 participation in drug seizure activities not to exceed Fifty
- Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). 168
- 169 SECTION 13. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- necessary is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the State 170

L71	Treasury to the credit of the Department of Transportation Funds,
L72	not expended by the Mississippi Department of Transportation in FY
L73	2004 in the Capital Outlay-Equipment major object of expenditure,
L74	as authorized in House Bill No. 1530, Regular Session of 2003, for
L75	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30,
L76	2005\$ 500,000.00.
L77	SECTION 14. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
L78	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
L79	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
L80	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
L81	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
L82	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
L83	SECTION 15. This act shall take effect and be in force from
L84	and after July 1, 2004.
