Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1733

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be					
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State					
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and					
8	maintenance of the Department of Marine Resources for the fiscal					
9	year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005					
10	\$ 1,776,451.00					
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be					
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special					
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of					
14	Marine Resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and					
15	ending June 30, 2005\$ 7,086,876.00					
16	Of the funds appropriated in this section, Three Million					
17	Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$3,050,000.00) is derived from the state					
18	excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products.					
19	SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions					
20	of Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized:					
21	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:					
22	Permanent: Full Time 103					
23	Part Time 0					
24	Time-Limited: Full Time					
25	Part Time 1					
26	Each Marine Conservation Officer and Supervisor shall be					
27	furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Four Hundred					
28	Fifty Dollars (\$450.00) per annum.					
29	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of					
30	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to					
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- 31 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
- 32 Services" for Fiscal Year 2006 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2005
- funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 33
- 34 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2006 budget by the
- 35 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
- 36 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
- 37 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
- 38 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
- 39 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure
- that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 40
- 41 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2005 appropriation for "Personal
- Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 42
- 43 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
- Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 44
- 45 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
- 46 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2005 "Personal Services"
- appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 47
- 48 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
- 49 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 50
- 51 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 52 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 53 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 54 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 55 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 56
- 57 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 58
- 59 appropriated level.
- 60 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 61
- 62 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. 63
- SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 64
- 65 Department of Marine Resources shall maintain complete accounting

66 and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds

67 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the

68 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year

69 2004. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the

70 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2006 shall be submitted to

71 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of

72 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided

73 during the Fiscal Year 2005 budget request process.

74 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the

75 Department of Marine Resources shall have the authority to

76 receive, budget and expend funds from any source that may become

77 available to the department in accordance with the rules and

78 regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a

79 manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

80 **SECTION 6.** In addition to all other sums heretofore

appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be

necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State

83 Treasury to the credit of the Tidelands Fund No. 3452 to the

Department of Marine Resources for the purpose of defraying the

expenses of the Tidelands projects for the fiscal year beginning

86 July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005..... \$5,000,000.00.

It is the intention of the Legislature that any political 150 151 subdivision seeking to qualify for tidelands funds for the subsequent fiscal year shall submit a proposal to the Department 152 153 of Marine Resources no later than July 1, 2005. All proposals 154 submitted will be reviewed and evaluated by the Department of 155 Marine Resources in accordance to department plans and procedures. 156 Multiphased projects, multiyear projects, proposed projects with 157 high dollar value and projects that have a record of stacking 158 funds shall be considered as low priority projects when evaluated. 159 It is the intention of the Legislature that if the amount of 160 the Tidelands funds appropriated in this act exceed the actual amount of Tidelands funds available, the available funds shall be 161 162 allocated on a pro rata basis between projects listed in this 163 section. 164 SECTION 7. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 165 necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Marine Resources, 166 167 Tidelands Fund, which is comprised of special source funds available to the department, for expenditures pursuant to House 168 Bill No. 1532, 2003 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning 169 July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005...... \$5,819,273.00. 170

- 171 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the
- 172 provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended
- exceed the balance as of June 30, 2004, or change the purpose for 173
- 174 which the funds were originally authorized except as otherwise
- stated in this bill. 175
- 176 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 177 Tidelands funds provided for and remaining in, as indicated by
- Form TTF-6, the "City of Biloxi-McDonnell Avenue Boat Launch" 178
- 179 project authorized in House Bill No. 1633, 1999 Regular Session,
- and Tidelands funds provided for the "Biloxi Port Commission-West 180
- 181 Biloxi Boat Launch/Marina" project authorized in House Bill No.
- 1636, 2000 Regular Session, shall be used for the "P32A-Biloxi 182
- Port Commission-Lighthouse Fishing Dock and Bulkheads, Phase VI" 183
- project authorized in House Bill No. 1756, 2002 Regular Session. 184
- SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 185
- 186 Tidelands funds provided for and remaining in, as indicated by
- Form TTF-6, the "P03A-City of Gulfport-Gulfport Lake Improvements" 187
- 188 project authorized in House Bill No. 1756, 2002 Regular Session,
- 189 shall be used for the "PO4A-City of Gulfport-Cowan Road Boat
- 190 Launch" project authorized in House Bill No. 1756, 2002 Regular
- 191 Session.
- SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 192
- 193 Tidelands funds provided for and remaining in, as indicated by
- 194 Form TTF-6, the "P31A-D'Iberville Port Commission-Fountain Beach
- 195 Access and Learning Center" project authorized in House Bill No.
- 1532, 2003 Regular Session, shall be used for the 196
- 197 "P02A-D'Iberville Port Commission-Fountain Beach Public Access and
- Habitat Learning Center" project authorized in House Bill No. 198
- 199 1756, 2002 Regular Session.
- 200 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- Tidelands funds provided for and remaining in, as indicated by 201
- 202 Form TTF-6, the "P07A-City of Gautier-City Park Expansion" project
- 203 authorized in House Bill No. 1756, 2002 Regular Session, shall be
- 204 used for the "P03A-City of Gautier-City Park Community Center"
- project authorized in House Bill No. 1532, 2003 Regular Session. 205

206 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 207 Tidelands funds provided for and remaining in, as indicated by Form TTF-6, the "P13A-City of Pass Christian-Harbor Improvements" 208 209 project authorized in House Bill No. 1532, 2003 Regular Session, shall be used for "P16A-City of Pass Christian-Harbor 210 211 Improvements" project authorized in House Bill No. 1756, 2002 Regular Session. 212 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 213 214 Tidelands funds provided for and remaining in, as indicated by Form TTF-6, the "City of Bay St. Louis-Ulman Avenue Pier" project 215 216 authorized in House Bill No. 1569, 2001 Regular Session, the "P01A-City of Bay St. Louis-Ulman Avenue Pier" project authorized 217 in House Bill No. 1756, 2002 Regular Session, and the 218 219 "P01A-Rutherford Pier Improvement, Phase II" project authorized in 220 House Bill No. 1532, 2003 Regular Session, shall be used for the 221 "P06A-City of Bay St. Louis-Property Acquisition and Improvements for Parking" project authorized in _____. (Requested FY2005 222 223 application, if approved for funding in FY2005) SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 224 commission shall place any special trust funds appropriated to the 225 226 department in a special trust fund and the interest earned on the 227 principal shall be credited to the special trust fund. Monies in 228 the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall be retained in the 229 special trust fund for use in the next succeeding fiscal year. 230 The department may use the interest earned on the fund to pay reasonable costs for administering the fund and related projects. 231 SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that 232 Tidelands Funds not otherwise appropriated shall be used for 233 234 additional funding of tideland projects and the administration 235 thereof by the Department of Marine Resources. Expenditures of excess Tidelands Funds by the Department of Marine Resources for 236 237 supplemental and additional funding and administration of

tidelands projects heretofore or hereafter proposed is authorized

and approved. The Department of Marine Resources may escalate the

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Tidelands Fund in an amount not to exceed Eight Hundred Thousand
Dollars (\$800,000.00) for the purposes outlined in this section.

SECTION 16. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the

247 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

248 **SECTION 17.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 249 and after July 1, 2004.
