Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1736

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

| 5 | SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be |

| 11 | SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be |
| 12 | necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special |
| 13 | fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry |
| 14 | Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by |
| 15 | or otherwise available to the commission, for the support and |
| 16 | maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning |
| 17 | July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005 |
| 18 | \$ 8,689,861.00. |
| 19 | Of the funds specified in this section, Two Hundred Fifty |
| 20 | Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund |
| 21 | created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement |
| 22 | Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State |
| 23 | Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth |
| 24 | improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands of |
| 25 | the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby, |
| 26 | Columbia Training School and colleges and universities. |
| 27 | Landowners who contract with the commission for such work shall |
| 28 | pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work. |
| 29 | Money received for this work by the commission shall be paid into |

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   money in the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund."

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        With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
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   the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
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   make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
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   Services" for Fiscal Year 2006 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2005
   funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
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   are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2006 budget by the
   Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
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   Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
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determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all

the State Treasury, and the State Treasurer shall deposit such

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65 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this

66 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure

- 67 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual
- 68 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2005 appropriation for "Personal
- 69 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds.
- 70 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
- 71 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
- 72 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
- 73 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2005 "Personal Services"
- 74 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
- 75 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
- 76 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- 77 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- 78 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 79 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 80 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 81 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 82 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 83 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 84 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 85 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 86 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 88 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 89 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 90 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 91 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 92 State Forestry Commission shall maintain complete accounting and
- 93 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
- 94 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
- 95 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
- 96 2004. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
- 97 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2006 shall be submitted to
- 98 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of

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It is the intention of the Legislature that the 134 SECTION 6. 135 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the Capital Outlay: Equipment major object of expenditure, with funds 136 137 generated from the Forest Acreage Tax, and with funds generated from the sale of old equipment and lease of tower sites an amount 138 139 not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00). It is further the intention of the Legislature that the State 140 141 Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the 142 Subsidies, Loans and Grants major object of expenditure, with funds generated from the Severance Tax to fund the Forest Resource 143 144 Development Program in an amount not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00). The receipt of these funds is 145 hereby authorized and approved, provided such receipts and 146 expenditures are reported and otherwise accounted for in 147 148 accordance with Section 27-103-101 et seq. and Section 27-104-1 et 149 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972. SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 150 151 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate part-time 152 positions up to one hundred (100) and expend funds not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any source of 153

154 funds that become available to the commission. This escalation 155 shall be in accordance with rules and regulations of the 156 Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent 157 with the escalation of federal funds. These positions may be used 158 to protect life and property during extended periods of extreme wildfire occurrences of a minimum of fifty (50) fires per day. 159 The escalation of positions and the expenditure of these funds 160 shall be at the discretion of the State Forester, with written 161 162 notification to the State Personnel Board and the State Fiscal 163 Officer.

section 8. The Forestry Commission has the authority to
purchase from the "General Services Administration" Fire Fighter
Catalog and any other GSA Catalog as long as the cost of such
items are less than the quotes received.

168 SECTION 9. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a 169 fund designated as the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving Fund to be used by the State Forestry 170 171 Commission to assist in the conversion of vehicles acquired by the State Forestry Commission through the Federal Excess Personal 172 173 Property Program or by Volunteer Fire Departments through other means to adapt them for use in the suppression of wildland fires. 174 This assistance shall be in the form of fabrication of water tanks 175 176 or other accessories necessary for the operation of fire suppression units, installation of piping and valves, painting or 177 178 other similar or associated component work necessary to place fire suppression equipment into service. It is not for general vehicle 179 180 maintenance or repair. The Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving 181 182 Fund shall be funded by monies received from charges for work and 183 services performed for Volunteer Fire Departments by the State Forestry Commission. Monies collected from such charges shall be 184 185 deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion 186 Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall make disbursements therefrom for payment of materials, supplies and labor upon 187 requisition of the Forestry Commission and upon the issuance of

The amount of monies deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Fund through this work shall not exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). Funds in excess of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be placed in the State Forestry Commission's regular appropriated special funds. in this revolving fund are to be considered special funds and shall be carried forward from one fiscal year to the next.

warrants therefor by the Department of Finance and Administration.

SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
