Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1832

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

20 SECTION 1. As used in this act, the following words shall 21 have the meanings ascribed to them in this section unless 22 otherwise clearly indicated by the context in which they are used: 23 (a) "Commission" means the Capital City Convention Center Commission. 24 25 (b) "Convention center" means the Capital City 26 Convention Center and other related and ancillary facilities. "Convention supply and display business" means a 27 (C) 28 business that supplies conventions and/or is in the business of 29 providing displays for conventions. "Caterer" means an entity that sells food/beverages 30 (d) 31 and/or other products to or at the convention center or has the 32 franchise rights to provide food/beverages and/or other products 33 at the convention center. 34 (e) "Entertainment venue" means an establishment or venue that offers live entertainment or exhibits motion pictures 35 36 to the public. "Governor" means the Governor of the State of 37 (f) Mississippi. 38 39 (g) "Hotel" or "motel" means and includes a place of 40 lodging that at any one time will accommodate transient guests on a daily or weekly basis and that is known to the trade as such, 41 42 and which is located within the city limits of Jackson, 43 Mississippi.

44 (h) "Mayor" means the Mayor of the City of Jackson,45 Mississippi.

(i) "Motor vehicle rental business" means a person,
firm or corporation engaged in or continuing in the business of
renting motor vehicles under rental agreements with a term of not
more than thirty (30) continuous days each, and which are located
within the city limits of Jackson, Mississippi, including, but not
limited to, businesses located at the Jackson International
Airport.

"Restaurant" means and includes all places where 53 (i) 54 prepared food is sold and whose annual gross proceeds of sales or gross income for the preceding calendar year equals or exceeds One 55 56 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00), and which are located within the city limits of Jackson, Mississippi. For the purpose 57 58 of calculating gross proceeds of sales or gross income, the sales 59 or income of all establishments owned, operated or controlled by 60 the same person, persons or corporation shall be aggregated.

61 SECTION 2. (1) There is hereby created and established in 62 the City of Jackson, Mississippi, a convention center to be named 63 the "Capital City Convention Center."

64 (2) The commission shall be domiciled in the City of
65 Jackson. It shall have the authority to promulgate and enact all
66 rules and regulations necessary or advantageous to the purpose of
67 the commission.

68 **SECTION 3.** (1) The commission shall be composed of nine (9) 69 members who shall be known as commissioners appointed as follows:

(a) Two (2) hotel/motel members representing hotel or
motel properties located within the city limits of Jackson,
Mississippi, appointed by the Central Mississippi Chapter of
Mississippi Lodging Association for initial terms of one (1) and
three (3) years, respectively.

(b) Two (2) restaurant members representing restaurants
located within the city limits of Jackson appointed by the Jackson
Chapter of the Mississippi Restaurant Association for initial
terms of two (2) and four (4) years, respectively.

79 (c) Two (2) members representing the business community
 80 in the City of Jackson appointed by the Metro Jackson Chamber of
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81 Commerce for initial terms of one (1) and five (5) years 82 respectively. The members appointed pursuant to this paragraph 83 shall be persons who represent businesses located within the city 84 limits of Jackson, Mississippi.

(d) Two (2) members shall be appointed at large by the
mayor for initial terms of two (2) and three (3) years
respectively. All appointments made by the mayor pursuant to this
paragraph shall be residents of the City of Jackson.

(e) One (1) member shall be appointed at large by the
Governor for an initial term of four (4) years. All appointments
made by the Governor pursuant to this paragraph shall be residents
of the City of Jackson.

93 (2) The terms of all appointments made subsequent to the 94 initial appointment shall be made for five (5) years. Any vacancy 95 which may occur shall be filled in the same manner as the original 96 appointment and shall be made for the unexpired term. Each member 97 of the commission shall serve until his successor is appointed and 98 qualified.

99 (3) The mayor shall designate a chairman of the commission 100 from among the membership of the commission. The chairman shall 101 serve in that capacity for two (2) years and may be reappointed 102 only after the expiration of two (2) intervening years. The vice 103 chairman and secretary shall be elected by the commission from 104 among the membership of the commission for a term of two (2) 105 The vice chairman and chairman may be reelected. vears.

106 (4) The commissioners shall serve without compensation.
107 (5) Any commissioner shall be disqualified and shall be
108 removed from office for either of the following reasons:

109 (a) Conviction of a felony in any state court or in110 federal court; or

111 (b) Failure to attend three (3) consecutive meetings
112 without just cause.

If a commissioner is removed for any of the above reasons, the vacancy shall be filled in the manner prescribed in this section and shall be made for the unexpired term.

Before assuming the duties of office, each commissioner 116 (6) 117 shall take the oath prescribed by law and shall enter into and give bond, to be approved by the Secretary of State of the State 118 119 of Mississippi, in the sum of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars 120 (\$25,000.00), conditioned upon the faithful performance of his 121 duties. Such bond shall be payable to the State of Mississippi, and, in the event of a breach thereof, suit may be brought by the 122 State of Mississippi for the benefit of the commission. 123 The 124 premiums on such bonds shall be paid from the funds received by the commission under the provisions of this act. 125

(7) A quorum shall consist of five (5) members of the commission. The commission shall adopt such rules and regulations as may govern the time and place for holding meetings, regular and special, and other rules and regulations to administer, operate and promote the convention center not inconsistent with the provisions of this act.

SECTION 4. (1) The commission shall have jurisdiction and 132 133 authority over all matters relating to the establishment, 134 development, construction, furnishing, equipping, operating and promoting of a convention center within the City of Jackson to be 135 136 connected to the Mississippi Telecommunication Conference and 137 Training Center located in the City of Jackson, including the 138 authority to enter into such contracts and agreements as may be 139 necessary to carry out the intent of this act. The commission 140 shall adhere to the provisions of the public purchasing laws, public works contracts laws and public bid laws as provided by the 141 142 laws of the State of Mississippi.

143 (2) The commission is authorized to contract for the 144 construction, furnishing, equipping, operation and promotion of a 145 convention center and to receive and expend, subject to the 146 provisions of this act, revenues from any source.

147 **SECTION 5.** (1) For the purpose of providing funds for the 148 acquisition, construction, furnishing, equipping, erection, 149 operation, maintenance and promotion of a convention center and 150 for the payment of any debt incurred for the acquisition,

151 construction, equipping and furnishing of a convention center, 152 there is hereby levied and assessed and shall be collected from 153 every person engaging in or doing business in the City of Jackson, 154 in addition to all other taxes currently being levied, assessed 155 and collected:

(a) A tax of one percent (1%) of the gross proceeds of
sales of restaurants and of sales of food and beverages in the
hotels and motels, including, but not limited to, sales of beer
and alcoholic beverages sold to be consumed on the premises;

160 (b) A tax of three percent (3%) of the gross proceeds161 of sales of hotel and motel rooms and lodging;

162 (c) A tax of three percent (3%) of the gross proceeds 163 of sales of entertainment venue, and the gross proceeds of sales 164 at the convention center by caterers.

165 (2) Persons liable for the taxes imposed in this section 166 shall add the amount of tax to the sales price or gross income 167 and, in addition thereto, shall collect, insofar as practicable, 168 the amount of the tax due by them from the person receiving the 169 services or goods at the time of payment therefor.

(3) The tax shall be collected by and paid to the State Tax Commission on a form prescribed by the State Tax Commission, in the same manner that state sales taxes are computed, collected and paid; and the full enforcement provisions of Chapter 65, Title 27, Mississippi Code of 1972, shall apply as necessary to the implementation and administration of this act.

176 (4) The proceeds of the tax shall be paid to the City of 177 Jackson on or before the fifteenth day of the month following the 178 month in which they were collected.

179 (5) The proceeds of the tax shall not be considered by the 180 City of Jackson as general fund revenues and shall be placed into a special fund. Money in the special fund shall first be used to 181 182 pay the debt service on any debt incurred by the city for the 183 acquisition, construction, equipping and furnishing the convention The proceeds of the tax shall be used by the commission 184 center. 185 for the following purposes in the priority set forth:

186 (a) First, to pay debt service on debt incurred187 pursuant to this act;

(b) Second, to fund a trust fund to pay any deficit that may occur with respect to the operation of the convention center, not to exceed the amount of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) per year; and

192 (c) The remainder shall be used for the operation,193 maintenance and promotion of the convention center.

194 (6) The provisions of this section shall be repealed upon
195 the payment in full of any debt incurred pursuant to the
196 provisions of Section 6 of this act.

197 SECTION 6. The governing authorities of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, are authorized to incur debt under any existing law 198 199 authorizing the issuance of bonds, notes or other evidences of 200 debt, for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, equipping and 201 furnishing of a convention center in an amount not to exceed 202 Sixty-five Million Dollars (\$65,000,000.00). In the event that 203 the city elects to issue bonds pursuant to Section 21-33-301 et 204 seq., the bonds shall not be subject to the limitation on 205 indebtedness imposed by Section 21-33-303, to the extent that the 206 bonds are paid with the proceeds of the taxes authorized by this 207 act.

208 SECTION 7. Before any tax authorized under this act may be 209 imposed, the governing authorities of the City of Jackson shall 210 adopt a resolution declaring their intention to levy the taxes, 211 setting forth the amount of such tax to be imposed, the date upon which such taxes shall become effective and calling for a 212 213 referendum to be held on the question. The date of the referendum shall be the date of the next municipal general election. 214 Notice 215 of such intention shall be published once each week for at least 216 three (3) consecutive weeks in a newspaper published or having a 217 general circulation in the county, with the first publication of 218 such notice to be made not less than twenty-one (21) days before the date fixed in the resolution for the referendum and the last 219 220 publication to be made not more than seven (7) days before the

At the referendum, all qualified electors of the City 221 referendum. 222 of Jackson may vote, and the ballots used in such referendum shall have printed thereon a brief statement of the amount and purposes 223 224 of the proposed tax levy and the words "FOR THE CONVENTION CENTER 225 TAX" and, on a separate line, "AGAINST THE CONVENTION CENTER TAX", 226 and the voters shall vote by placing a cross (X) or check $(\sqrt{)}$ 227 opposite their choice on the proposition. When the results of any 228 such referendum shall have been canvassed by the election 229 commission and certified, the city may levy the taxes beginning on the first day of the second month following the referendum, only 230 231 if at least sixty percent (60%) of the qualified electors who vote 232 in the election vote in favor of the tax. In the event that sixty percent (60%) of the qualified electors who vote at the referendum 233 234 vote for the convention center tax and the city elects to issue bonds pursuant to Section 21-33-301 et seq., the city shall not be 235 236 required to comply with the provisions of Section 21-33-307. No public funds shall be used for the purpose of promoting the 237 238 adoption of the referendum and no city employee may promote the 239 referendum during working hours. At least thirty (30) days before 240 the effective date of the taxes, the governing authorities of the City of Jackson shall furnish to the State Tax Commission a 241 242 certified copy of the resolution evidencing the taxes.

243 SECTION 8. Accounting for receipts and expenditures of the 244 funds described in this act must be made separately from the 245 accounting of receipts and expenditures of the general fund and any other funds of the City of Jackson. The records reflecting 246 247 the receipts and expenditures of the funds prescribed in this act 248 shall be audited annually by an independent certified public 249 accountant, and the accountant shall make a written report of his 250 audit to the council and the commission. The audit shall be made and completed as soon as practicable after the close of the fiscal 251 252 year, and expenses of such audit shall be paid from the funds derived pursuant to this act. 253

254 **SECTION 9.** The provisions of this act shall be repealed in 255 the event that the referendum on the question of imposing 256 convention center taxes has been denied by the electors of the 257 city. If this event occurs, the Clerk of the City of Jackson 258 shall notify the Chairmen of the House and Senate Local and 259 Private Committees.

SECTION 10. The governing authorities of the City of Jackson shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

267 **SECTION 11.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 268 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 269 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO CREATE THE CAPITAL CITY CONVENTION CENTER 1 COMMISSION; TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE COMMISSION; TO 2 3 PROVIDE THAT THE COMMISSION SHALL HAVE JURISDICTION AND AUTHORITY 4 OVER ALL MATTERS RELATING TO THE ESTABLISHMENT, DEVELOPMENT, CONSTRUCTION, FURNISHING, EQUIPPING, OPERATING AND PROMOTING OF A CONVENTION CENTER WITHIN THE CITY OF JACKSON; TO AUTHORIZE THE 5 б 7 IMPOSITION OF A TAX ON THE GROSS PROCEEDS OF RESTAURANTS, HOTELS 8 AND MOTELS AND ENTERTAINMENT VENUES FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING 9 FUNDS FOR THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION, FURNISHING, EQUIPPING, 10 ERECTION, OPERATION, MAINTENANCE AND PROMOTING OF A CONVENTION CENTER AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF ANY DEBT INCURRED FOR THE 11 12 ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION, EQUIPPING AND FURNISHING OF A 13 CONVENTION CENTER; TO AUTHORIZE THE GOVERNING AUTHORITIES OF THE 14 CITY OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, TO INCUR DEBT FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING, EQUIPPING AND FURNISHING OF A CONVENTION CENTER IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$65,000,000.00; TO REQUIRE A 15 16 REFERENDUM ON THE QUESTION OF THE IMPOSITION OF ANY TAX AUTHORIZED 17 18 UNDER THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
