## \*\*\* Pending \*\*\* COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

## House Bill No. 1839

## **BY: Committee**

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 7 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 878, Local and Private Laws of 1990, as
- 8 amended by Chapter 1013, Local and Private Laws of 1995, as
- 9 amended by Chapter 947, Local and Private Laws of 1997, as amended
- 10 by Chapter 958, Local and Private Laws of 2000, is amended as
- 11 follows:
- 12 Section 1. The following terms as used in this act shall
- 13 have the meanings herein ascribed unless the context otherwise
- 14 clearly requires:
- 15 (a) "Hotel" or "motel" means a place of lodging that at
- 16 any one time will accommodate transient guests on a daily or
- 17 weekly basis, excluding hotels or motels with ten (10) or less
- 18 overnight rental units;
- 19 (b) "Commission" means the Hattiesburg Tourism
- 20 Commission;
- 21 (c) "City" means the City of Hattiesburg.
- 22 Section 2. There is hereby created and established the
- 23 Hattiesburg Tourism Commission.

- Section 3. (1) The commission shall consist of the 24
- 25 following seven (7) members appointed by the mayor and ratified by
- the city council: 26
- Two (2) members of the hotel/motel industry; 27 (a)
- One (1) member either of the Chamber of Commerce or 2.8 (b)
- 29 the Economic Development Foundation;
- One (1) member representing the University of 30 (C)
- Southern Mississippi; and 31
- 32 Three (3) members who serve at large.
- The commission shall be appointed within sixty (60) days 33
- 34 following the adoption of a resolution pursuant to passage of this
- act for the following terms: 35
- Two (2) members for a term of one (1) year; 36 (a)
- 37 (b) Two (2) members for a term of two (2) years;
- One (1) member for a term of three (3) years; 38 (C)
- 39 (d) One (1) member for a term of four (4) years; and
- (e) One (1) member for a term of five (5) years. 40
- 41 Thereafter, appointments will be made on a staggered basis
- for a five-year period. 42
- (3) Members of the commission shall serve without 43
- 44 compensation, shall elect officers and adopt rules and
- regulations, and shall fix a regular meeting date, but may provide 45
- 46 for special meetings. The commission shall keep minutes of its
- 47 proceedings as are necessary to carry out its responsibilities. Α
- quorum of the commission shall consist of four (4) members. 48
- (4) Any member of the commission may be disqualified and 49
- 50 removed from office for any one (1) of the following reasons:
- 51 (a) Conviction of a felony; or
- 52 Failure to attend three (3) consecutive meetings
- 53 without just cause.
- (5) Before entering on the duties of the office appointed, 54
- 55 each member of the commission shall enter into and give bond to be

- approved by the Secretary of State of the State of Mississippi, in 56
- 57 the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) conditioned on the
- satisfactory performance of his duties. This bond premium shall 58
- 59 be paid from the Tourism Commission's funds and payable to the
- City of Hattiesburg in the event of a breech thereof. Suit may be 60
- brought by the city for benefit of the commission. 61
- Section 4. The commission shall have jurisdiction and 62
- 63 authority over all matters relating to establishing, promoting and
- 64 developing tourism in the city and shall be authorized:
- To acquire, own, furnish, equip, staff and operate 65
- 66 any and all facilities and equipment necessary or usable in the
- promotion of tourism for the City of Hattiesburg; 67
- 68 (b) To receive and expend revenues from any source,
- 69 including, but not limited to, private enterprise and those
- 70 revenues generated by this act;
- 71 (c) To own, lease or contract for any equipment useful
- and necessary in the promotion of tourism and convention business 72
- 73 for the City of Hattiesburg;
- 74 To sell, convey and otherwise dispose of all or any
- 75 part of its property and assets in accordance with the General
- 76 Laws of the State of Mississippi; and
- 77 (e) To have and exercise all powers necessary or
- 78 convenient to effect any and all of the purposes for which the
- 79 commission is organized, including the appointment and employment
- 80 of individuals acting on behalf of the commission.
- 81 Section 5. (1) For the purpose of providing operating funds
- for the commission to promote tourism, the governing authorities 82
- are hereby authorized, in their discretion, to levy, assess and 83
- 84 collect from every person, firm or corporation operating hotels
- 85 and motels in the City of Hattiesburg, and in addition to all
- other taxes now imposed, an amount not to exceed two percent (2%) 86
- 87 of the gross proceeds from overnight room rental, exclusive of

- charges for food, telephone, laundry, beverages and similar 88
- 89 charges.
- (2) Persons liable for the tax imposed herein shall add the 90
- 91 amount of the tax to the aforesaid room rentals and collect the
- 92 same.
- 93 (3) The tax collected shall be paid to the State Tax
- Commission on a form prescribed in the same manner that state 94
- sales taxes are computed, collected and paid; and the full 95
- 96 enforcement provisions and all other provisions of Chapter 65,
- Title 27, Mississippi Code of 1972, shall apply as necessary to 97
- 98 the implementation and administration of this act.
- (4) The proceeds of such tax, less three percent (3%) 99
- 100 thereof which shall be retained by the State Tax Commission to
- 101 defray the costs of collection, shall be paid to the City of
- Hattiesburg on or before the fifteenth day of the month following 102
- 103 the month in which collected.
- 104 (5) Proceeds of the tax shall not be considered by the City
- 105 of Hattiesburg as General Fund revenues, but shall be dedicated
- 106 solely for the purpose of carrying out the programs and activities
- 107 of the Tourism Commission.
- 108 (6) Before the taxes authorized by this act may be imposed,
- 109 the governing authorities shall adopt a resolution declaring its
- 110 intention to levy the taxes and establishing the amount of the tax
- 111 levy and the date on which the taxes initially shall be levied and
- 112 collected. The date shall be the first day of a month but not
- less than forty-five (45) days from the date of adoption of the 113
- 114 resolution. Notice of the proposed tax levy shall be published
- 115 once each week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks in a
- 116 newspaper having a general circulation in such city. The first
- 117 publication of such notice shall be made not less than twenty-one
- (21) days prior to the date fixed in the resolution on which the 118
- 119 governing authorities propose to levy such taxes, and the last

- publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to 120
- 121 such date. If, within the time of giving notice, twenty percent
- (20%) or fifteen hundred (1500), whichever is less, of the 122
- 123 qualified electors of the city file a written petition against the
- levy of such taxes, then such taxes shall not be levied unless 124
- 125 authorized by a majority of the qualified electors of such city
- 126 voting at an election to be called and held for that purpose.
- Prior to the effective date of the tax levy approved as herein 127
- 128 provided, the governing authorities shall furnish to the Chairman
- of the State Tax Commission a certified copy of the resolution 129
- 130 evidencing such tax levy.
- Section 6. (1) This act shall take effect and be in force 131
- 132 from and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the
- 133 Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
- (2) This act shall stand repealed from and after September 134
- 135 30, 2008.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 136
- 137 and after its passage.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 878, LOCAL AND PRIVATE LAWS OF 1990,
