## SENATE BILL NO. 2003

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 43-1-1, 43-1-2, 43-1-3, 43-1-5 AND 43-1-6, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH CREATE THE DEPARTMENT OF
- 3 HUMAN SERVICES, PRESCRIBE ITS DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES, PROVIDE
- 4 FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF AN EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF HUMAN SERVICES,
- 5 PROVIDE FOR THE AUTHORITY AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE EXECUTIVE
- 6 DIRECTOR, PROVIDE FOR A JOINT OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE OF THE
- 7 DEPARTMENT AND PROVIDE THE STRUCTURE OF THE DEPARTMENT, TO EXTEND
- 8 THE AUTOMATIC REPEALERS ON THOSE SECTIONS TO JULY 1, 2005; AND FOR
- 9 RELATED PURPOSES.
- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 **SECTION 1.** Section 43-1-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 12 amended as follows:
- 13 43-1-1. (1) The Department of Human Services shall be the
- 14 State Department of Public Welfare and shall retain all powers and
- 15 duties as granted to the State Department of Public Welfare.
- 16 Wherever the term "State Department of Public Welfare" or "State
- 17 Board of Public Welfare" appears in any law, the same shall mean
- 18 the Department of Human Services. The Executive Director of the
- 19 Department of Human Services may assign to the appropriate offices
- 20 such powers and duties deemed appropriate to carry out the lawful
- 21 functions of the department.
- 22 (2) This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2005.
- 23 **SECTION 2.** Section 43-1-2, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 24 amended as follows:
- 25 43-1-2. (1) There is created the Mississippi Department of
- 26 Human Services, whose offices shall be located in Jackson,
- 27 Mississippi, and which shall be under the policy direction of the
- 28 Governor.
- 29 (2) The chief administrative officer of the department shall
- 30 be the Executive Director of Human Services. The Governor shall

- 31 appoint the Executive Director of Human Services with the advice
- 32 and consent of the Senate, and he shall serve at the will and
- 33 pleasure of the Governor, and until his successor is appointed and
- 34 qualified. The Executive Director of Human Services shall possess
- 35 the following qualifications:
- 36 (a) A bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
- 37 of higher learning and ten (10) years' experience in management,
- 38 public administration, finance or accounting; or
- 39 (b) A master's or doctoral degree from an accredited
- 40 institution of higher learning and five (5) years' experience in
- 41 management, public administration, finance or accounting.
- Those qualifications shall be certified by the State
- 43 Personnel Board.
- 44 (3) There shall be a Joint Oversight Committee of the
- 45 Department of Human Services composed of the respective chairmen
- 46 of the Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee, the Senate
- 47 Appropriations Committee, the House Public Health and Welfare
- 48 Committee and the House Appropriations Committee, two (2) members
- 49 of the Senate appointed by the Lieutenant Governor to serve at the
- 50 will and pleasure of the Lieutenant Governor, and two (2) members
- of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the
- 52 House to serve at the will and pleasure of the Speaker. The
- 53 chairmanship of the committee shall alternate for twelve-month
- 54 periods between the Senate members and the House members, with the
- 55 Chairman of the Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee serving
- 56 as the first chairman. The committee shall meet once each month,
- 57 or upon the call of the chairman at such times as he deems
- 58 necessary or advisable, and may make recommendations to the
- 59 Legislature pertaining to any matter within the jurisdiction of
- 60 the Mississippi Department of Human Services. The appointing
- 61 authorities may designate an alternate member from their
- 62 respective houses to serve when the regular designee is unable to
- 63 attend such meetings of the oversight committee. For attending

- 64 meetings of the oversight committee, such legislators shall
- 65 receive per diem and expenses which shall be paid from the
- 66 contingent expense funds of their respective houses in the same
- 67 amounts as provided for committee meetings when the Legislature is
- 68 not in session; however, no per diem and expenses for attending
- 69 meetings of the committee will be paid while the Legislature is in
- 70 session. No per diem and expenses will be paid except for
- 71 attending meetings of the oversight committee without prior
- 72 approval of the proper committee in their respective houses.
- 73 (4) The State Department of Human Services shall provide the
- 74 services authorized by law to every individual determined to be
- 75 eligible therefor, and in carrying out the purposes of the
- 76 department, the executive director is authorized:
- 77 (a) To formulate the policy of the department regarding
- 78 human services within the jurisdiction of the department;
- 79 (b) To adopt, modify, repeal and promulgate, after due
- 80 notice and hearing, and where not otherwise prohibited by federal
- 81 or state law, to make exceptions to and grant exemptions and
- 82 variances from, and to enforce rules and regulations implementing
- 83 or effectuating the powers and duties of the department under any
- 84 and all statutes within the department's jurisdiction, all of
- 85 which shall be binding upon the county departments of human
- 86 services;
- 87 (c) To apply for, receive and expend any federal or
- 88 state funds or contributions, gifts, devises, bequests or funds
- 89 from any other source;
- 90 (d) Except as limited by Section 43-1-3, to enter into
- 91 and execute contracts, grants and cooperative agreements with any
- 92 federal or state agency or subdivision thereof, or any public or
- 93 private institution located inside or outside the State of
- 94 Mississippi, or any person, corporation or association in
- 95 connection with carrying out the programs of the department; and

- To discharge such other duties, responsibilities 96 97 and powers as are necessary to implement the programs of the
- 98 department.
- 99 (5) The executive director shall establish the
- 100 organizational structure of the Mississippi Department of Human
- 101 Services which shall include the creation of any units necessary
- 102 to implement the duties assigned to the department and consistent
- with specific requirements of law, including, but not limited to: 103
- Office of Family and Children's Services; 104 (a)
- Office of Youth Services; 105 (b)
- 106 (C) Office of Economic Assistance;
- 107 Office of Child Support. (d)
- 108 (6) The Executive Director of Human Services shall appoint
- 109 heads of offices, bureaus and divisions, as defined in Section
- 7-17-11, who shall serve at the pleasure of the executive 110
- director. The salary and compensation of such office, bureau and 111
- division heads shall be subject to the rules and regulations 112
- 113 adopted and promulgated by the State Personnel Board as created
- under Section 25-9-101 et seq. The executive director shall have 114
- 115 the authority to organize offices as deemed appropriate to carry
- out the responsibilities of the department. The organization 116
- 117 charts of the department shall be presented annually with the
- budget request of the Governor for review by the Legislature. 118
- 119 This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2005.
- 120 **SECTION 3.** Section 43-1-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 121
- 122 43-1-3. Notwithstanding the authority granted under
- subsection (4)(d) of Section 43-1-2, the Department of Human 123
- Services or the Executive Director of Human Services shall not be 124
- 125 authorized to delegate, privatize or otherwise enter into a
- 126 contract with a private entity for the operation of any office,
- 127 bureau or division of the department, as defined in Section

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128 7-17-11, without specific authority to do so by general act of the 129 Legislature. However, nothing in this section shall be construed 130 to invalidate (i) any contract of the department that is in place and operational before January 1, 1994; or (ii) the continued 131 132 renewal of any such contract with the same entity upon the 133 expiration of the contract; or (iii) the execution of a contract 134 with another legal entity as a replacement of any such contract 135 that is expiring, provided that the replacement contract is 136 substantially the same as the expiring contract. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the department shall be 137 authorized to continue the operation of its child support 138 139 collection program with a private entity on a pilot program basis in Hinds and Warren Counties in Mississippi, and the department 140 141 and the private entity shall specifically be prohibited from 142 expanding such pilot program to any counties other than Hinds and Warren Counties without specific authority to do so by amendment 143 to this section by general act of the Legislature. 144 Before 145 December 15, 1994, the department shall provide a detailed report 146 to the Joint Oversight Committee established by Section 43-1-2 and to the Legislature that describes the results of the pilot program 147 148 for the privatization of the department's child support collection program as of December 1, 1994, including an evaluation of whether 149 150 there has been substantial compliance with the performance standards specified in the contract for the private entity in 151 152 conducting the pilot program.

This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2005.

154 **SECTION 4.** Section 43-1-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

156 43-1-5. It shall be the duty of the Department of Human 157 Services to:

(1) Establish and maintain programs not inconsistent with the terms of this chapter and the rules, regulations and policies of the State Department of Human Services, and publish the rules and regulations of the department pertaining to such programs.

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- (2) Make such reports in such form and containing such information as the federal government may, from time to time, require, and comply with such provisions as the federal government may, from time to time, find necessary to assure the correctness
- (3) Within ninety (90) days after the end of each fiscal
  year, and at each regular session of the Legislature, make and
  publish one (1) report to the Governor and to the Legislature,
  showing for the period of time covered, in each county and for the

- 174 (c) The maximum and the minimum amount paid to any 175 recipients in any one (1) month;
- 176 (d) The total number of applications;
- (e) The number granted;

- 179 (g) The number cancelled;
- 180 (h) The amount expended for administration of the 181 provisions of this chapter;
- 182 (i) The amount of money received from the federal government, if any;
- 184 (j) The amount of money received from recipients of 185 assistance and from their estates and the disposition of same;
- 186 (k) Such other information and recommendations as the 187 Governor may require or the department shall deem advisable;
- 188 (1) The number of state-owned automobiles purchased and
  189 operated during the year by the department, the number purchased
- 190 and operated out of funds appropriated by the Legislature, the
- 191 number purchased and operated out of any other public funds, the
- 192 miles traveled per automobile, the total miles traveled, the
- 193 average cost per mile and depreciation estimate on each
- 194 automobile;

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- The cost per mile and total number of miles 195
- 196 traveled by department employees in privately-owned automobiles,
- for which reimbursement is made out of state funds; 197
- 198 Each association, convention or meeting attended by
- 199 any department employees, the purposes thereof, the names of the
- 200 employees attending and the total cost to the state of such
- 201 convention, association or meeting;
- 202 (o) How the money appropriated to the institutions
- 203 under the jurisdiction of the department has been expended during
- the preceding year, beginning and ending with the fiscal year of 204
- 205 each institution, exhibiting the salaries paid to officers and
- 206 employees of the institutions, and each and every item of receipt
- 207 and expenditure;
- 208 The activities of each division within the (p)
- 209 Department of Human Services and recommendations for improvement
- 210 of the services to be performed by each division;
- In order of authority, the twenty (20) highest paid 211
- 212 employees in the department receiving an annual salary in excess
- of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00), by P.I.N. number, job 213
- 214 title, job description and annual salary.
- Each report shall be balanced and shall begin with the 215
- 216 balance at the end of the preceding fiscal year, and if any
- 217 property belonging to the state or the institution is used for
- profit such report shall show the expenses incurred in managing 218
- 219 the property and the amount received from the same. Such reports
- 220 shall also show a summary of the gross receipts and gross
- 221 disbursements for each fiscal year and shall show the money on
- hand at the beginning of the fiscal period of each division and 222
- 223 institution of the department.
- 224 This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2005.
- SECTION 5. Section 43-1-6, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 225
- 226 amended as follows:

227	43-1-6. The following programs within the Division of
228	Federal-State Programs, Office of the Governor, shall be
229	transferred to the State Department of Human Services:
230	(a) Office of Energy and Community Services;
231	(b) Juvenile Justice Advisory Committee; and
232	(c) Mississippi Council on Aging.
233	All authority to implement those programs shall be vested in
234	the State Department of Human Services.
235	This section shall stand repealed on July 1, $2005$ .
236	SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from
237	and after June 30, 2004.
