2	ACADEMY HEAD FOOTBALL COACH AND ATHLETIC DIRECTOR, GERALD CRAWFORD
3	"BUBBA" MIMS, JR., AND EXPRESSING THE SYMPATHY OF THE SENATE.
4	WHEREAS. Gerald Crawford "Bubba" Mims. Jr Head Football

- WHEREAS, Gerald Crawford "Bubba" Mims, Jr., Head Foo
- 5 Coach and Athletic Director at Porters Chapel Academy (PCA), died
- Sunday, May 16, 2004, in Vicksburg, Mississippi, at the age of 46. 6
- His funeral was among the largest in the history of Vicksburg; and 7
- 8 WHEREAS, Mr. Mims was a Vicksburg native, the second of five
- children of the late Crawford and Betty "Boop" Nosser Mims, and a 9
- 1974 graduate of Vicksburg High School; and 10
- WHEREAS, he was a star baseball and football player for 11
- Vicksburg High School, and helped the Gators to the 1973 Big Eight 12
- 13 Football Championship, the equivalent of a state title today. He
- went on to play football at Ole Miss, where he lettered for one 14
- 15 season; and

- 16 WHEREAS, Mr. Mims, who only stood about 5-foot-8, often used
- his experiences as an undersized linebacker for the Ole Miss 17
- 18 Rebels to inspire his players or remind them that all it took was
- a little hard work to succeed; and 19
- 20 WHEREAS, after graduating from Ole Miss in 1979, Mr. Mims
- 21 began working in his father's chain of convenience stores and
- 22 eventually became manager and owner. He continued working there
- until September 2000, when he filled the coaching void at PCA four 23
- 24 games into the season; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Mims, who had a son on the junior high team and 25
- 26 knew most of the players from a summer baseball team he coached,
- 27 initially agreed to filling in at the private K-12 school for the

- 28 rest of the season. He was hired as the permanent Coach and
- 29 Athletic Director the following spring. Mr. Mims had coached a
- 30 summer baseball team, the Culkin Critters, for several years
- 31 before taking over at PCA. Being a full-time coach brought him
- 32 even greater joy and seemed to fill a void in his life, Johnny
- 33 Mims said; and
- 34 WHEREAS, Mr. Mims posted a 20-21 record in three-plus seasons
- 35 as PCA's Coach, but he also left his mark as the school's Athletic
- 36 Director. In that post, Mr. Mims helped the athletic program grow
- 37 to new heights. PCA started new programs in track, golf which
- 38 Mr. Mims coached and powerlifting, and also made the transition
- 39 from slow-pitch softball to fast-pitch. Capital improvements were
- 40 also made to the school's gym, baseball field and football field.
- 41 Long-term projects to build a new fieldhouse and football stadium
- 42 were also started; and
- WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife, Karen; sons Gerald and
- 44 Judd; daughters Claire, Paige and Jessica, all of Vicksburg,
- 45 Mississippi; brothers Peter and Johnny (of Vicksburg) and Paul, of
- 46 West Monroe, Louisiana; and sister Renee Boyce of West Monroe,
- 47 Louisiana; and
- WHEREAS, this untimely death was a loss for the Mims family,
- 49 the Porters Chapel Academy, the City of Vicksburg and the State of
- 50 Mississippi:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 52 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commend the life of well-known
- 53 Porters Chapel Academy Head Football Coach and Athletic Director,
- 54 Gerald Crawford "Bubba" Mims, Jr., and express to his wife and
- 55 surviving family the sympathy of the Senate on his passing.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 57 the surviving family of Coach Mims and be made available to the
- 58 Capitol Press Corps.
