SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 501

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION FINDING THAT IT IS IN THE PUBLIC 1 INTEREST TO EXTEND COVERAGE OF MEDICAID RECIPIENTS IN THE POVERTY 2 LEVEL AGED AND DISABLED (PLADs) CATEGORY; IF SUCH RECIPIENTS HAVE NOT OBTAINED COVERAGE BY THE SEPTEMBER 15 DEADLINE, IT IS IN THE 3 4 PUBLIC INTEREST THAT THE GOVERNOR CALL A SPECIAL SESSION TO 5 б PROVIDE CONTINUED COVERAGE; TO CREATE A JOINT SELECT COMMITTEE OF 7 THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES TO STUDY AND RECOMMEND 8 MEANS TO MAINTAIN AND MAXIMIZE CONTINUED COVERAGE OF OUR MOST MEDICALLY VULNERABLE CITIZENS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 9 10 WHEREAS, an ill-timed and hasty response to a federal law 11 requiring changes in health care coverage by 2006 will prematurely cut 65,000 Mississippians from Medicaid health care; and 12 WHEREAS, these 65,000 Mississippians are our poor, elderly, 13 disabled and most medically vulnerable citizens; and 14 WHEREAS, this ill-timed rush to revise coverage does not 15 16 provide an adequate transition in order to give our vulnerable citizens time to obtain alternative medical care coverage; and 17 WHEREAS, the extension of Medicaid health care coverage to 18 the poverty level aged and disabled (PLADs) category is literally 19 a life or death matter to some of these medically vulnerable 20 21 citizens; and WHEREAS, in response to the impending crisis, Governor Haley 22 23 Barbour implemented a Medicaid transition plan and extended 24 coverage until September 15, 2004; and 25 WHEREAS, in addition to other measures, Governor Haley Barbour obtained a federal commitment which allows PLADs 26 beneficiaries an exclusive advance enrollment opportunity for 27 prescription drug cards and patient assistance programs: 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE 30 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That:

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31 (1) We do hereby find that it is in the public interest that 32 coverage of our Medicaid recipients in the poverty level aged and 33 disabled (PLADs) category continue, and if most of these 34 recipients do not obtain coverage by the September 15 deadline, 35 then it is in the public interest that the Governor call a special 36 session to provide continued coverage and we urge him to do so.

37 (2) There is hereby created a joint select study committee of the Senate and House of Representatives which shall study 38 eligibility requirements and ways to maintain and maximize 39 40 continued coverage of our most medically vulnerable citizens and 41 the means to fund the continuation of such coverage. The joint select committee shall report its findings and recommendations to 42 43 the Legislature on or before January 4, 2005; and upon the presentation of such report the joint committee shall be 44 dissolved. 45

The committee shall consist of the Chairman of the (3) 46 47 Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee and the Chairman of the House Public Health and Human Services Committee, who shall serve 48 as co-chairmen of the committee; Chairman of the Senate 49 50 Appropriations Committee, Chairman of the House Appropriations Committee, Chairman of the Senate Insurance Committee, Chairman of 51 52 the House Medicaid Committee, six (6) members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, and six (6) members of 53 54 the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the 55 Appointments shall be made within fifteen (15) days after House. the adoption of this resolution by the Legislature; and, within 56 57 fifteen (15) days thereafter on a day to be designated jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House, the 58 59 committee shall meet and organize by selecting from its membership a secretary who shall be responsible for keeping all records of 60 61 the committee. A majority of the members of the committee shall 62 constitute a quorum. In the selection of its officers and the 63 adoption of rules, resolutions and reports, an affirmative vote of *SS01/R4* 501 S. C. R. No. 042E/SS01/R4 PAGE 2

64 a majority of the members of the joint committee from each house 65 shall be required. All members shall be notified in writing of 66 all meetings, such notices to be mailed at least five (5) days 67 prior to the date on which a meeting is to be held.

68 (4) Members of the committee shall be paid from the 69 contingent expense funds of their respective houses in the same manner as provided for committee meetings when the Legislature is 70 71 not in session; however, no per diem or expense for attending meetings of the committee will be paid while the Legislature is in 72 No committee member, except the co-chairmen, may incur 73 session. 74 per diem, travel or other expenses unless previously authorized by vote, at a meeting of the committee, which action shall be 75 76 recorded in the official minutes of the meeting.

77 The committee shall utilize clerical and legal staff (5) already employed by the Legislature, and any other staff 78 79 assistance made available to it. To effectuate the purpose of 80 this resolution, each department, division, board, bureau, commission or agency of the state shall, at the request of a 81 co-chairman of the committee, provide to the committee such 82 83 facilities, assistance and accurate data as will enable the 84 committee properly to carry out its task.
