- WHEREAS, Perrin H. Purvis, former Mississippi State Senator, 4
- died Friday, October 30, 2004, at his Tupelo, Mississippi, home at 5
- the age of 86; and 6
- 7 WHEREAS, family and friends said improving Mississippi's
- 8 education system was the Democratic Senator's main goal in a
- legislative career lasting from 1964 to 1988. He believed in 9
- education and what education could do for Mississippians; and 10
- WHEREAS, he authored the amendment in the State Senate to the 11
- Education Reform Act of 1982 that provided state funds for 12
- 13 mandatory kindergarten classes in public schools; and
- WHEREAS, Senator Purvis was a prominent retired businessman 14
- 15 with interests in insurance and television. He attended the
- University of Southern Mississippi, where he was a member of the 16
- school's M Club, served as President of the USM Alumni 17
- 18 Association, and was inducted into the USM Sports Hall of Fame.
- 19 He served in the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II. He was
- 20 a Shriner, a member of the American Legion and a 32nd Degree
- 21 Mason. He was also appointed to the Governor's Commission of
- 22 Children and Youth and the Mississippi Community College Board.
- He was Chairman of the Tupelo Public School Board and served as 23
- President of the Tupelo Kiwanis Club, the International Fly 24
- Fisherman's Conclave and the Conference of Insurance Legislators. 25
- 26 During his 24 years in the Senate, he served as Chairman of the

- 27 Senate Insurance Committee. He was a member of First United
- 28 Methodist Church in Tupelo; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Senator Purvis liked to fly fish and was a great
- 30 public speaker. He traveled to several cities and gave a speech
- 31 called, "Pan fish and politics"; and
- 32 WHEREAS, it is with sadness that we note the passing of this
- 33 respected Senator, whose legacy featured public school
- 34 kindergartens and a new highway program for Mississippi, and whose
- 35 career serves as a model for all citizens in the State of
- 36 Mississippi:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 38 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 39 we do hereby commend the life and legacy of public service of
- 40 former State Senator Perrin H. Purvis of Tupelo, Mississippi, and
- 41 extend to his daughter and grandchildren the sympathy of the
- 42 Legislature on his passing.
