HOUSE BILL NO. 121

AN ACT TO CREATE A NEW CODE SECTION TO BE CODIFIED AS SECTION 1 2 3-3-32, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DESIGNATE "MISSISSIPPI, THE PROMISED LAND" AS THE OFFICIAL STATE BALLAD; AND FOR RELATED 3 4 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. The following shall be codified as Section 6 7 3-3-32, Mississippi Code of 1972: 3-3-32. The ballad "Mississippi, The Promised Land," by Paul 8 9 Robertson and Paul Ott, copyrighted 1969, is hereby designated as 10 the state ballad of Mississippi. The ballad reads as follows: "MISSISSIPPI 11 THE PROMISED LAND 12 You know I've traveled all over this world 13 And I've seen a lot of beautiful places and people 14 But when I'm away 15 16 My heart always turns toward the most beautiful place 17 And the most beautiful people in the world I call it the Promised Land 18 19 You know I'm thinking about Mississippi Where the cotton blossoms grow 20 21 I can see the fields of white Cast a spell that seems just right 22 23 And in my heart I'll always know 24 There's a cotton blossom moon still shining On my old Mississippi home 25 26 Fragrant whispers in the breeze 27 From the sweet magnolia trees Seems to haunt me where ever I roam 28 *HR40/R333* H.
