HOUSE BILL NO. 148

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF COMPUTERS WITH THE INTENT TO 1 FALSIFY OR FORGE ELECTRONIC MAIL TRANSMISSION INFORMATION OR OTHER 2 3 ROUTING INFORMATION OR THE SALE OR DISTRIBUTION OF SOFTWARE FOR 4 SUCH PURPOSES; TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS; AND FOR 5 RELATED PURPOSES.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 **SECTION 1.** (1) Any person who:

(a) Uses a computer or computer network with the intent 9 to falsify or forge electronic mail transmission information or 10 other routing information in any manner in connection with the transmission of unsolicited bulk electronic mail through or into 11 the computer network of an electronic mail service provider or its 12 13 subscribers; or

14 (b) Knowingly sells, gives, or otherwise distributes or possesses with the intent to sell, give, or distribute software 15 16 that (i) is primarily designed or produced for the purpose of facilitating or enabling the falsification of electronic mail 17 transmission information or other routing information; (ii) has 18 19 only limited commercially significant purpose or use other than to facilitate or enable the falsification of electronic mail 20 21 transmission information or other routing information; or (iii) is 22 marketed by that person acting alone or with another for use in 23 facilitating or enabling the falsification of electronic mail 24 transmission information or other routing information is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not more than 25 One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned in the county jail 26 27 for not more than one (1) year, or both.

(2) A person is guilty of a felony if he commits a violation 28 29 of subsection (1) and:

(a) The volume of unsolicited bulk electronic mail 30 31 transmitted exceeded ten thousand (10,000) attempted recipients in 32 any twenty-four-hour period, one hundred thousand (100,000) 33 attempted recipients in any thirty-day time period, or one million (1,000,000) attempted recipients in any one-year time period; 34

35 (b) The revenue generated from a specific unsolicited bulk electronic mail transmission exceeded One Thousand Dollars 36 (\$1,000.00) or the total revenue generated from all unsolicited 37 38 bulk electronic mail transmitted to any electronic mail service provider exceeded Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00); or 39

40 (c) Any person convicted of a violation of this subsection shall be fined not more than Five Thousand Dollars 41 (\$5,000.00) or imprisoned in the State Penitentiary for not more 42 than five (5) years, or both. 43

(3) A person is guilty of a felony if he knowingly hires, 44 45 employs, uses, or permits any minor to assist in the transmission of unsolicited bulk electronic mail in violation of subsection (2) 46 47 and, upon conviction, shall be fined not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or imprisoned in the State Penitentiary for 48 49 not more than five (5) years, or both.

50 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2005. 51
