HOUSE BILL NO. 382

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 23-15-627 AND 23-15-631, MISSISSIPPI 2 CODE OF 1972, TO PROHIBIT THE ISSUANCE OF AN ABSENTEE BALLOT TO 3 INCARCERATED PERSONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 23-15-627, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 23-15-627. The registrar shall be responsible for furnishing 8 an absentee ballot application form to any elector authorized to receive an absentee ballot. Absentee ballot applications shall be 9 furnished to a person only upon the oral or written request of the 10 elector who seeks to vote by absentee ballot; however, the parent, 11 child, spouse, sibling, legal guardian, those empowered with a 12 13 power of attorney for that elector's affairs or agent of the elector may orally request an absentee ballot application on 14 15 behalf of the elector. An absentee ballot application must have 16 the seal of the circuit or municipal clerk affixed to it and be initialed by the registrar or his deputy in order to be utilized 17 18 to obtain an absentee ballot. A reproduction of an absentee ballot application shall not be valid unless it is a reproduction 19 20 provided by the office of the registrar of the jurisdiction in 21 which the election is being held and which contains the seal and initials required by this section. An application shall not be 22 accepted from a person who is imprisoned at the time of making the 23 application. Such application shall be substantially in the 24 following form: 25

citizen of Mississippi, or spouse or dependent of such member.
() I am a member of the Merchant Marine or the American Red
Cross and am a citizen of Mississippi or spouse or dependent of
such member.

41 () I am a disabled war veteran who is a patient in any
42 hospital and am a citizen of Mississippi or spouse or dependent of
43 such veteran.

44 () I am a civilian attached to and serving outside of the
45 United States with any branch of the Armed Forces or with the
46 Merchant Marine or American Red Cross, and am a citizen of
47 Mississippi or spouse or dependent of such civilian.

48 () I am a citizen of Mississippi temporarily residing
49 outside the territorial limits of the United States and the
50 District of Columbia.

51 () I am a student, teacher or administrator at a college, university, junior or community college, high, junior high, 52 53 elementary or grade school, whose studies or employment at such institution necessitates my absence from the county of my voting 54 55 residence or spouse or dependent of such student, teacher or 56 administrator who maintains a common domicile outside the county 57 of my voting residence with such student, teacher or 58 administrator.

59 () I will be outside the county on election day. H. B. No. 382 *HR40/R270* 05/HR40/R270 PAGE 2 (GT\BD) 60 () I have a temporary or permanent physical disability.

61 () I am sixty-five (65) years of age or older.

62 () I am the parent, spouse or dependent of a person with a 63 temporary or permanent physical disability who is hospitalized 64 outside his county of residence or more than fifty (50) miles away 65 from his residence, and I will be with such person on election 66 day.

() I am a member of the congressional delegation, or spouse 67 or dependent of a member of the congressional delegation. 68

I am required to be at work on election day during the 69 () 70 times which the polls will be open.

() I am not currently serving a sentence of imprisonment. 71 72 I hereby make application for an official ballot, or ballots, to be voted by me at the election to be held in _____, on ___ 73 74 Mail 'Absent Elector's Ballot' to me at the following

address _____ (if eligible to vote by mail). 75

76 I realize that I can be fined up to Five Thousand Dollars 77 (\$5,000.00) and sentenced up to five (5) years in the Penitentiary for making a false statement in this application and for selling 78 79 my vote and violating the Mississippi Absentee Voter Law. (This sentence is to be in bold print.) 80

81 If you are temporarily or permanently disabled, you are not 82 required to have this application notarized or signed by an official authorized to administer oaths for absentee balloting. 83 84 You are required to sign this application in the proper place and have a person eighteen (18) years of age or older witness your 85 86 signature and sign this application in the proper place.

DO NOT SIGN WITHOUT READING. (This sentence is to be in bold 87 88 print.)

115	SECTION 2. Section 23-15-631, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
116	amended as follows:
117	23-15-631. (1) The registrar shall enclose with each ballot
118	provided to an absent elector separate printed instructions
119	furnished by him containing the following:
120	(a) All absentee voters, excepting those with temporary
121	or permanent physical disabilities or those who are sixty-five
122	(65) years of age or older, who mark their ballots in the county
123	of the residence shall use the registrar of that county as the
124	witness. Said absentee voter shall come to the office of the
125	registrar and neither the registrar nor his deputy shall be
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126 required to go out of the registrar's office to serve as an 127 attesting witness.

(b) Upon receipt of the enclosed ballot, you will not mark same except in view or sight of the attesting witness. In the sight or view of the attesting witness, mark the ballot according to instructions.

After marking the ballot, fill out and sign the 132 (C) 133 "ELECTOR'S CERTIFICATE" on back of the envelope so that the signature shall be across the flap of the envelope so as to insure 134 the integrity of the ballot. All absent electors shall have the 135 136 attesting witness sign the "ATTESTING WITNESS CERTIFICATE" across the flap on back of the envelope. Place necessary postage on the 137 138 envelope and deposit it in the post office or some government receptacle provided for deposit of mail so that the absent 139 elector's ballot, excepting presidential absentee ballots, will 140 reach the registrar in which your precinct is located not later 141 142 than 5:00 p.m. on the day preceding the date of the election, or 143 by personally delivering such ballot to the registrar's office not later than 12:00 noon on the Saturday immediately preceding 144 145 elections held on Tuesday, the Thursday immediately preceding 146 elections held on Saturday, and the second day immediately 147 preceding elections held on other days.

Any notary public, United States postmaster, assistant United 148 149 States postmaster, United States postal supervisor, clerk in 150 charge of a contract postal station, or any officer having authority to administer an oath or take an acknowledgment may be 151 152 an attesting witness; provided, however, that in the case of an 153 absent elector who is temporarily or permanently physically disabled, the attesting witness may be any person eighteen (18) 154 years of age or older and such person is not required to have the 155 156 authority to administer an oath. If a postmaster, assistant 157 postmaster, postal supervisor, or clerk in charge of a contract 158 postal station acts as an attesting witness, his signature on the *HR40/R270* 382 H. B. 159 elector's certificate must be authenticated by the cancellation 160 stamp of their respective post offices. If one or the other 161 officers herein named acts as attesting witness, his signature on 162 the elector's certificate, together with his title and address, but no seal, shall be required. Any affidavits made by an absent 163 164 elector who is in the Armed Forces may be executed before a commissioned officer, warrant officer, or noncommissioned officer 165 not lower in grade than sergeant rating or any person authorized 166 167 to administer oaths.

(d) When the application accompanies the ballot it
shall not be returned in the same envelope as the ballot but shall
be returned in a separate preaddressed envelope provided by the
registrar.

(e) A person who is a candidate for public office may
not be an attesting witness for any absentee ballot upon which the
person's name appears.

175 (f) Any voter casting an absentee ballot who declares 176 that he requires assistance to vote by reason of blindness, temporary or permanent physical disability or inability to read or 177 178 write, shall be entitled to receive assistance in the marking of his absentee ballot and in completing the affidavit on the 179 180 absentee ballot envelope. The voter may be given assistance by 181 anyone of the voter's choice other than a candidate whose name appears on the absentee ballot being marked, or the voter's 182 183 employer, or agent of that employer. In order to ensure the 184 integrity of the ballot, any person who provides assistance to an 185 absentee voter shall be required to sign and complete the 186 "Certificate of Person Providing Voter Assistance" on the absentee 187 ballot envelope.

188 (g) Any person who is currently serving a sentence of 189 imprisonment may not make an application for an absentee ballot. 190 (2) The foregoing instructions required to be provided by 191 the registrar to the elector shall also constitute the substantive H. B. No. 382 *HR40/R270* 05/HR40/R270 PAGE 6 (GT\BD) 192 law pertaining to the handling of absentee ballots by the elector 193 and registrar.

194 SECTION 3. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi 195 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, 196 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the 197 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States 198 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the 199 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and 200 extended.

201 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 202 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 203 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
