HOUSE BILL NO. 737

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-519, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO AUTHORIZE THE USE OF RADAR SPEED DETECTION DEVICES BY ANY LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER ON THAT PORTION OF A PUBLIC HIGHWAY, ROAD OR STREET WITHIN THE OFFICER'S JURISDICTION DESIGNATED AS A SCHOOL 3 4 ZONE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 8 9 63-3-519. (1) It is unlawful for any person or peace officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway 10 Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of 11 radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or 12 highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used: 13 14 (a) By municipal law enforcement officers within a municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more 15 16 upon the public streets of the municipality; 17 (b) By any college or university campus police force within the confines of any campus wherein more than two thousand 18 19 (2,000) students are enrolled; (c) By municipal law enforcement officers in any 20 21 municipality having a population in excess of fifteen thousand 22 (15,000) according to the latest federal census on federally 23 designated highways lying within the corporate limits; and (d) By any duly sworn law enforcement officer on that 24 portion of a public highway, road or street within the officer's 25 jurisdiction designated by signage as a school zone and giving 26 27 warning to motorists by the appearance of flashing lights that 28 speed within the school zone may be enforced with the use of

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29 radar. The location of school zone signage shall be determined by

30 agreement of the trustees of the school district and law

31 <u>enforcement officials.</u>

32 (2) The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol <u>shall</u> not set up 33 radar on highways within municipalities with a population in 34 excess of fifteen thousand (15,000) according to the latest 35 federal census.

36 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 37 and after July 1, 2005.
