HOUSE BILL NO. 813 (As Passed the House)

1 AN ACT TO PRESCRIBE CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS FOR THE DEPARTMENT 2 OF HUMAN SERVICES IN THE OPERATION OF THE CHILD CARE AND 3 DEVELOPMENT FUND/TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE TO NEEDY FAMILIES PROGRAM; 4 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Human Services is 6 7 Mississippi's lead agency in the federal Child Care and 8 Development Fund (CCDF) program. CCDF is comprised of the 9 following funding streams: discretionary, mandatory, federal 10 matching, and state matching. In addition, as allowed by federal regulation, Mississippi currently transfers twenty percent (20%) 11 of the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) grant into 12 CCDF. The CCDF/TANF program helps eligible working parents pay 13 for early care and education services for their children. 14 In the operation of the CCDF/TANF program, 15 (2) the 16 Department of Human Services shall comply with the following 17 requirements: (a) The department shall maintain records and post 18 19 quarterly on a publicly accessible web site for each county the information required for all federal and state reports related to 20 21 CCDF (42 USCS, Chapter 105, Subchapter II-B). (b) The department shall establish performance level 22 23 standards including the following requirements in CCDF/TANF certificate subcontracts: measurable outcome-based contract 24 measures, clear statements of expectations, evaluation criteria, 25 26 documentation, and the explicit descriptions of reporting requirements. The State Department of Audit shall annually audit 27 the expenditures by the department and subcontractors (currently 28 *HR03/R1013PH* H. B. No. 813 G1/2 05/HR03/R1013PH PAGE 1 (RF\LH)

known as "Designated Agents"). In addition, the State Department 29 of Audit shall periodically, but not less than once every three 30 (3) years, conduct performance audits for the purposes of 31 32 assessing program impact. The State Department of Audit shall 33 provide copies of each of the audits to the Chairmen of the House 34 Public Health and Human Services Committee and the Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee. 35 (C) The department shall provide to the custodial 36 parents all information and a plain-language explanation of all 37 program criteria to qualify for a CCDF/TANF certificate to obtain 38 39 early care and education for a child from birth to twelve (12) 40 years of age. 41 (d) The department shall require child care providers participating in the CCDF/TANF certificate program to provide 42 developmentally appropriate early childhood educational 43 activities, including reading and writing where age appropriate. 44 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 45 46 and after July 1, 2005.
