HOUSE BILL NO. 876

AN ACT TO ENACT THE FAIR TRADE PRACTICE ACT FOR THE 1 PROCUREMENT OF CONTACT LENSES, RELATING TO THE RIGHTS OF CONSUMERS 2 3 TO PROCURE CONTACT LENSES FROM PERSONS OR COMPANIES OF THEIR 4 CHOICE; TO AUTHORIZE PRESCRIPTIONS TO BE TRANSFERRED OR VERIFIED BY ELECTRONIC MEANS; TO REQUIRE THE RELEASE OF CONTACT LENS 5 б PRESCRIPTIONS; TO REQUIRE EYE CARE PROFESSIONALS TO VERIFY OR 7 CONFIRM PRESCRIPTION INFORMATION TO CONTACT LENS PROVIDERS OR 8 OTHER EYE CARE PROFESSIONALS; TO AMEND SECTION 73-19-61, IN CONFORMITY TO THE PRECEDING PROVISIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 11 SECTION 1. The following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed in this section unless the context clearly 12 indicates otherwise: 13 (a) "Contact lens" means a medical device placed on the 14 15 eye. 16 (b) "Contact lens prescription" means a written or verbal communication issued by an eye care professional authorized 17 18 to issue prescriptions, setting forth all of the necessary information to dispense or prepare contact lenses for the 19 20 consumer. 21 **SECTION 2.** (1) A prescription is required before contacts 22 may be dispensed to any individual. 23 (2) A contact lens prescription may not contain an 24 expiration date that is less than two (2) years from the date of issue unless, in the medical judgment of the eye care 25 professional, there is a medical reason for a shorter period of 26 time. If a prescription is issued for a period of less than two 27 (2) years, the medical reason must be explained to the patient in 28 29 writing, and a signed copy of the explanation shall be preserved 30 in the patient's medical record.

31 **SECTION 3.** (1) Eye care professionals authorized under 32 state law to issue contact lens prescriptions, upon determining 33 the parameters of the lens, shall provide the patient with a 34 contact lens prescription containing all of the necessary 35 information for any eye care professional or contact lens 36 replacement provider to dispense lenses to the customer. If an 37 expiration date is not included on the prescription, the 38 prescription shall expire two (2) years after the date of issue.

When requested by another eye care professional, 39 (2)40 optical dispenser or contact lens provider to confirm prescription 41 information for a specified individual, the eye care professional shall confirm all necessary information to enable the person 42 43 requesting verification to accurately dispense the contact lenses. 44 Confirmation may be requested and responded to in any written form, including by electronic means, such as facsimile or e-mail 45 transmission. If confirmation is not made within one (1) hour 46 47 following the request, all information contained in the request, including the fact that the prescription has not expired, shall be 48 presumed as accurate, and the eye care professional or replacement 49 50 contact lens provider shall be authorized to dispense lenses under 51 the prescription.

52 (3) If contact lenses are dispensed under a prescription at a time when the eye care professional's office is 53 54 closed, and the eye care professional later determines that there 55 is a problem with the prescription, the eye care professional 56 shall notify the dispenser in any written form, including by 57 electronic means such as facsimile or e-mail transmission, of the 58 problem. Upon receipt of the notification, the dispenser shall notify the customer in any written form, including by electronic 59 means such as facsimile or e-mail transmission, provide a copy of 60 61 the eye care professional's notification, and advise the consumer 62 to return to his or her eye care professional for follow-up care. 66 <u>SECTION 4.</u> All eye care professionals who issue 67 prescriptions for contact lenses shall post a notice, no smaller 68 than one-half (1/2) inch type in the location where payment for 69 services is made, informing patients as follows: "Following the 70 final fitting of your contact lenses, you have a right to receive 71 a copy of your contact lens prescription."

72 SECTION 5. Section 73-19-61, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 73 amended as follows:

74 73-19-61. It shall be unlawful for any person, persons, corporation, proprietorship, partnership, or any entity other than 75 a licensed optometrist or licensed ophthalmologist to * * * 76 prescribe to the public contact lenses, or to dispense, fit or 77 prescribe any medical appliance having direct contact with the 78 cornea of the eye. However, an optical dispenser or contact lens 79 provider may * * * fill the written contact lens prescription of a 80 licensed optometrist or licensed ophthalmologist, provided that 81 the optical dispenser or contact lens provider complies with the 82 provisions of Sections 1 through 4 of this act. 83

84 **SECTION 6.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 85 and after July 1, 2005.
