HOUSE BILL NO. 887

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-31, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ESTABLISH SEPARATE DEER HUNTING SEASONS ON PRIVATE LANDS WITHIN A SPECIFIED ZONE IN THE SOUTHEASTERN PART OF THE STATE AND RESTRICT THE MINIMUM INSIDE SPREAD OR MAIN BEAM LENGTH OF ANTLERS FOR LEGAL BUCKS THAT MAY BE TAKEN; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 49-7-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 49-7-31. (1) The open season for game birds and game
- 10 animals shall be as follows:
- 11 (a) On bobwhite quail: The season shall open on
- 12 Thanksgiving Day and run through the first Saturday in March next
- 13 following.
- 14 (b) On pheasant: There shall be no open season on
- 15 pheasant.
- 16 (c) On wild turkey: The commission may fix the spring
- 17 season between March 1 and May 15. In addition, the commission
- 18 may fix special fall either-sex seasons.
- 19 (d) On squirrel:
- 20 (i) Zone 1: For areas north of Highway 82 plus

83	deer, a hunter must wear in full view five hundred (500) square
84	inches of solid unbroken fluorescent orange.
85	(iv) In order to set and regulate the deer
86	seasons, the commission may:
87	A. Set and regulate the deer seasons on
88	wildlife management areas which it administers;
89	B. Allow the harvesting of antlerless deer in
90	the districts or zones upon the recommendation of the executive
91	director based upon good and substantial quantitative data and
92	research evaluations that demonstrate that the harvesting is
93	necessary to properly manage the herd. The commission, only upon

the recommendation of the executive director, may allow the 94 95 harvesting of antlerless deer during the deer season with guns and 96 with dogs by a majority vote of the commission. Nothing in this 97 section prohibits the harvesting of either-sex deer by landowners 98 or leaseholders on private lands under a deer management program 99 prescribed or approved by the executive director. 100 C. Provide a special permit for the 101 harvesting of deer when they are depredating and destroying crops. 102 The department shall supervise the harvesting and provide for the 103 salvaging of the meat of the animals. The commission may 104 authorize the department to assist any farmer in this state, who sustains crop damage by wildlife, in eradication of the problem 105 106 wildlife. 107 (v) The commission shall establish a special hunting season for youth under the age of sixteen (16) and for 108 109 handicapped persons in the Natchez State Park. The commission 110 shall also establish a primitive weapon season in the Natchez 111 State Park. The selection of participants in the primitive weapon season shall be by public drawing from all qualified applications. 112 113 The commission shall set the number of permits to be issued and 114 the length of the special seasons. The commission may also 115 establish a special hunting season for youth and handicapped persons or a primitive weapon season as provided in this 116 117 subparagraph in any other state park under the jurisdiction of the 118 department but shall only do so upon the recommendation of the staff of the department as approved by the commission. 119 120 commission shall select participants and set the number of permits to be issued and the length of the special seasons in the manner 121 provided in this subparagraph. 122 (vi) The commission may establish and regulate 123 124 special youth hunts for all nonmigratory game birds and animals

- 127 On fur-bearing animals: The commission may fix the (f) 128 open season on fur-bearing animals between November 1 and March 1 129 next following and fix the open season for hunting opossums, 130 raccoons and bobcats with dogs and guns by licensed hunters from 131 October 1 to February 28 next following; but raccoons and bobcats 132 may be run, hunted, chased or pursued throughout the year with dogs by licensed hunters. The commission may establish an 133 additional open season on raccoon from July 1 through October 1, 134 135 and the bag limit on raccoon during the additional open season
- 137 (g) On rabbits: The season shall open on the Saturday
 138 nearest October 15 and run through February 28 next following, and
 139 when rabbits are depredating or destroying crops, the owner of the
 140 crops or his tenants may shoot the rabbits with guns.

shall be one (1) per party, per night.

- 141 (h) On predatory animals: The hunting of predatory 142 animals shall be restricted to the open seasons for hunting any game animal or game bird, using only the firearms, ammunition, 143 144 primitive weapons or archery equipment legal for use during that open season. Landowners, agricultural leaseholders or their 145 146 designated agents may take predatory animals year-round on lands owned or leased by them. The taking of any animal or animals 147 148 other than beavers or coyote by the use of a trap or traps is 149 unlawful except during the time the season is open for the taking 150 of fur-bearing animals. Fox and coyote may be run, chased or 151 pursued with dogs except as provided in Section 49-7-32 year-round by licensed hunters. 152
- 153 (i) On migratory birds: The open season for migratory
 154 birds shall be the season prescribed by the Federal Migratory Bird
 155 Treaty regulations.
- (j) It is unlawful to trap fox after the closed season for trapping of other fur-bearing animals, except on property owned or leased by the person trapping.

- 159 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature that the open season 160 for game birds and game animals shall be stabilized unless some 161 unforeseen calamity affecting the resource necessitates earlier 162 change.
- 163 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 164 and after July 1, 2005.
