COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 890

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-67-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO PROVIDE THAT ANY PERSON WHO HAS PRACTICED MASSAGE THERAPY FOR 2 3 MORE THAN TWENTY-FIVE YEARS BEFORE THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ACT. 4 WHO IS EMPLOYED AS A MASSAGE THERAPIST BY A NONPROFIT YMCA OR YWCA ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ACT, IS EXEMPT FROM HAVING TO TAKE 5 б AN EXAMINATION FOR REGISTRATION UNDER THE PROFESSIONAL MASSAGE 7 THERAPY ACT; TO PROVIDE THAT PERSONS EXEMPT UNDER THIS ACT MAY 8 APPLY FOR A MASSAGE THERAPY CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION UNTIL JANUARY 1, 2006, BUT MAY NOT PRACTICE MASSAGE THERAPY AFTER THAT 9 10 DATE UNLESS A VALID CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION IS OBTAINED; AND 11 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 73-67-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

15 73-67-21. (1) It shall be the responsibility of a massage 16 therapy establishment to verify the current registration of any 17 and all persons practicing massage therapy at the location of or 18 on behalf of the establishment. Failure to comply is subject to 19 penalty assessed by the board of not less than Five Hundred 20 Dollars (\$500.00) and not more than One Thousand Dollars 21 (\$1,000.00) per offense.

(2) No person may advertise massage or practice massage for 22 23 compensation in this state unless he is registered as a massage 24 therapist by the board. No person may use the title of or 25 represent himself to be a massage therapist or use any other title, abbreviations, letters, figures, signs or devices that 26 27 indicate that the person is a massage therapist unless he is 28 registered to practice massage therapy under the provisions of this chapter. Massage establishments with six (6) or more 29 30 registered massage therapists shall be exempt from the advertising

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31 provisions found in Section 73-67-29 provided that the therapy or 32 service is performed by person(s) registered under this chapter.

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(3) The following are requirements for registration:

34 (a) An applicant must be eighteen (18) years of age, or35 older, on the date the application is submitted.

36 (b) An application must provide proof of high school37 graduate equivalency.

38 (c) An applicant must be of legal status not only to
39 receive a certificate of registration, but also to work in the
40 State of Mississippi with that certificate of registration.

(d) An applicant must supply proof of current
certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and first aid
of at least eight (8) hours of training, including practical
testing, and supply documentation of familiarity with the
Americans With Disabilities Act.

46 (e) All required fees for registration must be47 submitted by the applicant.

48 (f) Any and all requirements regarding good moral
49 character and competency, as provided for in this chapter and in
50 accepted codes of ethics, shall be met.

(g) An applicant must have completed an approved
continuing education course on communicable diseases, including
HIV/AIDS information and prevention.

The applicant's official and certified 54 (h) 55 transcript(s) from the applicant's massage therapy school. The transcript must verify that the applicant has completed a 56 57 board-approved training program of no less than the minimum 58 requirement for supervised in-class massage therapy instruction and student clinic, with a minimum grade requirement of "C" or 59 better in every course of instruction, as stated for school 60 61 requirements; or if the applicant is submitting criteria from an 62 apprenticeship program, all required documentation, forms and other board-stipulated requirements must be met. 63

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65 having to take any examination for registration, but must fulfill
66 all other requirements as stated in this chapter, except for the
67 requirements in subsection (2)(h) of this section:

(a) Those having more than three hundred (300)
documented, board-accepted in-class hours of massage therapy
education before January 1, 2001.

(b) Those having more than five (5) years of professional massage therapy experience and a minimum of one hundred fifty (150) hours of approved massage therapy education.

74 (c) Those having no formal training, but who have
75 successfully passed the National Certification Examination for
76 Therapeutic Massage and Bodywork.

77 All grandfathering exemption allowances as stated (d) 78 in this subsection (4) shall end on July 1, 2002, for nonstudents, 79 and on June 1, 2003, for students who were enrolled in a part-time massage school curriculum on July 1, 2001. 80 Individuals may apply 81 for a certificate of registration until the grandfathering exemption ends, but may not practice massage beyond the allowed 82 grace period as provided for in Section 73-67-37 unless a valid 83 massage therapy certificate of registration or provisional permit 84 85 is obtained. Except as provided in subsection (5) of this section, all other pre-act practitioners and anyone not practicing 86 massage therapy before January 1, 2001, must take and pass the 87 88 registration examination and follow the requirements in this 89 chapter to practice massage therapy for compensation in 90 Mississippi.

91 (e) Students enrolled in a massage therapy curriculum 92 of at least five hundred (500) hours on July 1, 2001, who complete 93 graduation from the same curriculum.

94 (5) Any person who has practiced massage therapy for a
 95 period of more than twenty-five (25) years before the effective
 96 date of House Bill No. 890, 2005 Regular Session, who is employed

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as a massage therapist by a YMCA or YWCA authorized and existing 97 as a nonprofit corporation under the laws of this state on the 98 effective date of House Bill No. 890, 2005 Regular Session, is 99 100 exempt from having to take any examination for registration, but 101 must fulfill all other requirements as stated in this chapter, 102 except for the requirements in subsection (3)(b), (d), (g) and (h) of this section. Persons exempt under this subsection may apply 103 for a massage therapy certificate of registration until January 1, 104 105 2006, but may not practice massage therapy after January 1, 2006, unless a valid certificate of registration is obtained. 106 107 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 108 and after its passage.
