1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 45-33-27, 45-33-29, 45-33-31, 45-33-33 AND 45-33-35, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE SEX OFFENDERS WHO ARE SUBJECT TO THE SEX OFFENDER REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS TO FULFILL ALL REGISTRATION, REREGISTRATION, AND UPDATE OR VERIFICATION REQUIREMENTS BY PERSONALLY APPEARING AT A DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY DRIVER'S LICENSE STATION; TO AMEND SECTION 45-33-57, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW IMPOSITION OF FEES TO BE ASSESSED AGAINST OFFENDERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
10	SECTION 1. Section 45-33-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
11	amended as follows:
12	45-33-27. (1) A person required to register on the basis of
13	a conviction, adjudication of delinquency or acquittal by reason
14	of insanity entered shall register by appearing in person at a
15	Department of Public Safety Driver's License Station within three
16	(3) days of the date of judgment unless the person is immediately
17	confined or committed, in which case the person shall register
18	when released in accordance with the procedures established by the
19	department.
20	(2) If a person who is required to register under this

- section is released from prison or placed on parole or supervised release, the Department of Corrections shall perform the registration duties at the time of release and forward the registration information to the Department of Public Safety within ten (10) days. The person is also required to personally appear at a Department of Public Safety Driver's License Station within ten (10) days of release.

- 54 moving to a county of this state.
- 55 (6) A person, other than a person confined in a correctional
- or juvenile detention facility or involuntarily committed on the
- 57 basis of mental illness, who is required to register on the basis
- 58 of a sex offense for which a conviction, adjudication of
- 59 delinquency or acquittal by reason of insanity was entered prior
- 60 to July 1, 1995, shall register with the sheriff of the county in
- 61 which he resides no later than August 15, 2000.
- 62 **SECTION 2.** Section 45-33-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 63 amended as follows:

- 64 45-33-29. (1) Upon any change of address, an offender
- 65 required to register under this chapter is required to personally
- 66 appear at a Department of Public Safety Driver's License Station
- 67 not less than ten (10) days before he intends to first reside at
- 68 the new address.
- 69 (2) Upon any change in the status of a registrant's
- 70 employment or vocation at any institution of higher learning, the
- 71 offender is required to personally appear at a Department of
- 72 Public Safety Driver's License Station within ten (10) days of the
- 73 change.
- 74 **SECTION 3.** Section 45-33-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 75 amended as follows:
- 76 45-33-31. All registrants are required to personally appear
- 77 <u>at a Department of Public Safety Driver's License Station to</u>
- 78 reregister every ninety (90) days. Reregistration includes the
- 79 submission of current information to the department and the
- 80 verification of registration information, including the street
- 81 address and telephone number of the registrant; name, social
- 82 security number, street address and telephone number of the
- 83 registrant's employment along with any other registration
- 84 information that may need to be verified and the payment of any
- 85 required fees. A person who fails to reregister as required by
- 86 this section commits a violation of this chapter.
- 87 **\* \* \***
- SECTION 4. Section 45-33-33, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 89 amended as follows:
- 90 45-33-33. (1) The failure of an offender to personally
- 91 appear at a Department of Public Safety Driver's License Station
- 92 or to provide any registration or other information, including,
- 93 but not limited to, initial registration, reregistration or change
- 94 of address information, or required notification to a volunteer
- 95 organization, as required by this chapter, is a violation of the

- 96 law. Additionally, forgery of information or submission of
- 97 information under false pretenses is also a violation of the law.
- 98 (2) Unless otherwise specified, a violation of this chapter
- 99 shall be considered a felony and shall be punishable by a fine not
- 100 more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or imprisonment in the
- 101 State Penitentiary for not more than five (5) years, or both fine
- 102 and imprisonment.
- 103 (3) Whenever it appears that an offender has failed to
- 104 comply with the duty to register or reregister, the department
- 105 shall promptly notify the sheriff of the county of the last known
- 106 address of the offender. Upon notification, the sheriff shall
- 107 attempt to locate the offender at his last known address.
- 108 (a) If the sheriff locates the offender, he shall
- 109 enforce the provisions of this chapter. The sheriff shall then
- 110 notify the department with the current information regarding the
- 111 offender.
- 112 (b) If the sheriff is unable to locate the offender,
- 113 the sheriff shall promptly notify the department and initiate a
- 114 criminal prosecution against the offender for the failure to
- 115 register or reregister. The sheriff shall make the appropriate
- 116 transactions into the Federal Bureau of Investigation's
- 117 wanted-person database.
- 118 (4) A first violation of this chapter may result in the
- 119 arrest of the offender. Upon any second or subsequent violation
- 120 of this chapter, the offender shall be arrested for such
- 121 violation.
- 122 (5) Any prosecution for a violation of this section shall be
- 123 brought by a prosecutor in the county of such violation.
- 124 (6) The Commissioner of Public Safety or his authorized
- 125 agent shall suspend the driver's license of any offender failing
- 126 to comply with the duty to report, register or reregister.
- 127 **SECTION 5.** Section 45-33-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 128 amended as follows:

45-33-35. (1) The Mississippi Department of Public Safety
shall maintain a central registry of sex offender information as
defined in Section 45-33-25 and shall adopt rules and regulations
necessary to carry out this section. The responsible agencies
shall provide the information required in Section 45-33-25 on a
form developed by the department to ensure accurate information is

136 (2) Upon conviction, adjudication or acquittal by reason of 137 insanity of any sex offender, if the sex offender is not immediately confined or not sentenced to a term of imprisonment, 138 139 the clerk of the court which convicted and sentenced the sex 140 offender shall inform the person of the duty to register, 141 including the duty to personally appear at a Department of Public Safety Driver's License Station, and shall perform the 142 registration duties as described in Section 45-33-23 and forward 143

the information to the department.

- 145 (3) Upon release from prison, placement on parole or
  146 supervised release, the Department of Corrections shall inform the
  147 person of the duty to register, including the duty to personally
  148 appear at a Department of Public Safety Driver's License Station,
  149 and shall perform the registration duties as described in Section
  150 45-33-23 and forward the information to the Department of Public
  151 Safety.
- (4) Upon release from confinement in a mental institution
  following an acquittal by reason of insanity, the director of the
  facility shall inform the offender of the duty to register,

  including the duty to personally appear at a Department of Public

  Safety Driver's License Station, and shall notify the Department
  of Public Safety of the offender's release.

- 164 (6) In addition to performing the registration duties, the
- 165 responsible agency shall:
- 166 (a) Inform the person having a duty to register that:
- 167 (i) The person is required to personally appear at
- 168 a Department of Public Safety Driver's License Station at least
- 169 ten (10) days before changing address.
- 170 (ii) Any change of address to another state shall
- 171 be reported to the department by personally appearing at a
- 172 Department of Public Safety Driver's License Station not less than
- 173 ten (10) days before the change of address. The offender shall
- 174 comply with any registration requirement in the new state.
- 175 (iii) The person must register in any state where

198	SECTION 6. Section 45-33-57, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
199	amended as follows:
200	45-33-57. (1) The Department of Public Safety may adopt
201	regulations to establish fees to be charged for information
202	requests.
203	(2) The Department of Public Safety may adopt regulations to
204	establish fees to be charged to registrants for registration,
205	reregistration, and verification or change of address.
206	SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from
