HOUSE BILL NO. 1093 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 73-21-85 AND 73-21-111, MISSISSIPPI 1 CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THAT THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY CONDUCT 2 3 CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS ON ANY APPLICANT FOR PHARMACY LICENSURE 4 AND ANY APPLICANT FOR PHARMACY TECHNICIAN REGISTRATION; TO PROVIDE THAT THOSE APPLICANTS SHALL BE FINGERPRINTED AND THE BOARD SHALL 5 б SUBMIT THE FINGERPRINTS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY FOR A 7 CHECK OF THE STATE CRIMINAL RECORDS AND FORWARDED TO THE FEDERAL 8 BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION FOR A CHECK OF THE NATIONAL CRIMINAL RECORDS; TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD TO COLLECT A FEE FROM THE 9 10 APPLICANT FOR THE FINGERPRINTING AND THE STATE AND NATIONAL 11 CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECKS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 73-21-85, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 13 amended as follows: 14 73-21-85. (1) To obtain a license to engage in the practice 15 16 of pharmacy by examination, or by score transfer, the applicant 17 shall: (a) Have submitted a written application on the form 18 19 prescribed by the board; 20 (b) Be of good moral character; (c) Have graduated from a school or college of pharmacy 21 22 accredited by the American Council of Pharmaceutical Education and 23 have been granted a pharmacy degree therefrom; 24 Have successfully passed an examination approved by (d) 25 the board; (e) Have paid all fees specified by the board for 26 27 examination, not to exceed the cost to the board of administering 28 the examination; 29 (f) Have paid all fees specified by the board for 30 licensure; and

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33 (2) To obtain a license to engage in the practice of 34 pharmacy, a foreign pharmacy graduate applicant shall obtain the 35 National Association of Boards of Pharmacy's Foreign Pharmacy 36 Graduate Examination Committee's certification, which shall include, but not be limited to, successfully passing the Foreign 37 Pharmacy Graduate Equivalency Examination and attaining a total 38 score of at least five hundred fifty (550) on the Test of English 39 as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), and shall: 40

41 (a) Have submitted a written application on the form42 prescribed by the board;

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(b) Be of good moral character;

fingerprinted. The board shall submit the fingerprints to the 64 65 Department of Public Safety for a check of the state criminal 66 records and forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a check of the national criminal records. The Department of Public 67 68 Safety shall disseminate the results of the state check and the national check to the board for a suitability determination. The 69 board shall be authorized to collect from the applicant the amount 70 71 of the fee that the Department of Public Safety charges the board for the fingerprinting, whether manual or electronic, and the 72 state and national criminal history records checks. 73 74 SECTION 2. Section 73-21-111, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 75 76 73-21-111. (1) The board shall make, adopt, amend and 77 repeal from time to time such rules and regulations for the regulation of supportive personnel as may be deemed necessary by 78 79 the board. 80 (2) Every person who acts or serves as a pharmacy technician in a pharmacy that is located in this state and permitted by the 81 board shall obtain a registration from the board. To obtain a 82 83 pharmacy technician registration the applicant must: Have submitted a written application on a form(s) 84 (a) 85 prescribed by the board; and (b) Be of good moral character; and 86 87 (C) Have paid the initial registration fee not to 88 exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). Each pharmacy technician shall renew his or her 89 (3) 90 registration annually. To renew his or her registration, a technician must: 91 92 (a) Submit an application on a form prescribed by the board; and 93 94 (b) Pay a renewal fee not to exceed One Hundred Dollars 95 (\$100.00) for each annual registration period. 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97 registration renewal fee to assist in funding a program that 98 assists impaired pharmacists, pharmacy students and pharmacy

99 technicians.

100 (4) To insure that all applicants are of good moral 101 character, the board shall conduct a criminal history records check on all applicants for a license. In order to determine the 102 applicant's suitability for licensing, the applicant shall be 103 fingerprinted. The board shall submit the fingerprints to the 104 Department of Public Safety for a check of the state criminal 105 records and forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a 106 check of the national criminal records. The Department of Public 107 108 Safety shall disseminate the results of the state check and the national check to the board for a suitability determination. The 109 board shall be authorized to collect from the applicant the amount 110 of the fee that the Department of Public Safety charges the board 111 for the fingerprinting, whether manual or electronic, and the 112 state and national criminal history records checks. 113 114 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
