## HOUSE BILL NO. 1119 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-103-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO CLARIFY THE RESIDENCE STATUS OF SPOUSE AND CHILDREN OF MILITARY 3 PERSONNEL ASSIGNED TO ACTIVE DUTY FOR PURPOSES OF ATTENDING 4 STATE-SUPPORTED INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING AND 5 COMMUNITY/JUNIOR COLLEGES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI; AND FOR 6 RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** Section 37-103-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

10 37-103-19. (1) Resident status of a spouse or child of a member of the Armed Forces of the United States on extended active 11 duty shall be that of the military spouse or parent for the 12 purpose of attending state-supported institutions of higher 13 learning and community/junior colleges of the State of Mississippi 14 during the time that the military spouse or parent is stationed 15 within the State of Mississippi and shall be continued through the 16 17 time that the military spouse or parent is stationed in an overseas area with last duty assignment within the State of 18 Mississippi, excepting temporary training assignments en route 19 20 from Mississippi. Resident status of a minor child terminates upon reassignment under Permanent Change of Station Orders of the 21 military parent for duty in the continental United States outside 22 the State of Mississippi, excepting temporary training assignments 23 24 en route from Mississippi, and except that children of members of the Armed Forces who attain Mississippi residency in accordance 25 with the above provisions, who begin and complete their senior 26 27 year of high school in Mississippi, and who enroll full time in a Mississippi institution of higher learning or community/junior 28 college to begin studies in the fall after their graduation from 29 \*HR40/R1486SG\* H. 30 high school, maintain their residency status so long as they 31 remain enrolled as a student in good standing at a Mississippi institution of higher learning or community/junior college. 32 33 Enrollment during summer school is not required to maintain such 34 resident status. 35 (2) The spouse or child of a member of the Armed Forces of the United States who dies or is killed is entitled to pay the 36 resident tuition fee if the spouse or child becomes a resident of 37 Mississippi within one hundred eighty (180) days of the date of 38 39 death. 40 (3) If a member of the Armed Forces of the United States is stationed outside Mississippi and the member's spouse or child 41 42 establishes residence in Mississippi and registers with the Mississippi institution of higher learning or community/junior 43 college at which the spouse or child plans to attend, the 44 institution of higher education or community/junior college shall 45 46 permit the spouse or child to pay the tuition, fees and other 47 charges provided for Mississippi residents without regard to 48 length of time that the spouse or child has resided in 49 Mississippi. (4) A member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the 50 child or spouse of a member of the Armed Forces of the United 51 States who is entitled to pay tuition and fees at the rate 52 provided for Mississippi residents under another provision of this 53 54 section while enrolled in a degree or certificate program is entitled to pay tuition and fees at the rate provided for 55 56 Mississippi residents in any subsequent term or semester while the person is continuously enrolled in the same degree or certificate 57 program. A student may withdraw or may choose not to reenroll for 58 59 no more than one (1) semester or term while pursuing a degree or 60 certificate without losing resident status only if that student provides sufficient documentation by a physician that the student 61 62 has a medical condition that requires withdrawal or nonenrollment. \*HR40/R1486SG\* H. 63	For purposes of this subsection, a person is not required to
64	enroll in a summer term to remain continuously enrolled in a
65	degree or certificate program. The person's eligibility to pay
66	tuition and fees at the rate provided for Mississippi residents
67	under this subsection does not terminate because the person is no
68	longer a member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the
69	child or spouse of a member of the Armed Forces of the United
70	States.
71	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
72	and after its passage.
