HOUSE BILL NO. 1266

1 AN ACT TO PROHIBIT ANY PERSON FROM OPERATING AN ALL-TERRAIN 2 VEHICLE OR MOTORCYCLE UPON A PUBLIC STREET, ROAD OR HIGHWAY UNLESS 3 SUCH PERSON HAS COMPLETED AN ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE OR MOTORCYCLE 4 SAFETY COURSE CONDUCTED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY; TO 5 PRESCRIBE A FEE FOR SUCH COURSE; TO PROVIDE A PENALTY FOR 6 VIOLATIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** (1) From and after July 1, 2005, no person may 8 operate an all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle upon any public 9 10 street, road or highway in this state unless such person has completed an all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle safety course 11 conducted by and using course materials, curricula and instructors 12 provided by the Department of Public Safety. A fee of Ten Dollars 13 (\$10.00) shall be charged to those taking the course. The 14 department shall issue a certificate to each person who 15 satisfactorily completes the course. 16

17 (2) Any person who operates an all-terrain vehicle or 18 motorcycle in violation of subsection (1) of this section is 19 guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished, upon conviction, by 20 a fine of not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than 21 Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).

(3) For the purposes of this section, the term "all-terrain vehicle" means any motorized vehicle manufactured and designed exclusively for off-road use that is fifty (50) inches or less in width, has an unladen dry weight of six hundred (600) pounds or less, travels on three (3), four (4) or more low pressure tires, has a seat designed to be straddled by the operator and uses handlebars for steering control.

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29 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 30 and after July 1, 2005.
