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HOUSE BILL NO. 1324 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-15-303, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO REVISE THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE STATE AND SCHOOL EMPLOYEES HEALTH INSURANCE MANAGEMENT BOARD; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 2 3 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 25-15-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 7 25-15-303. (1) There is created the State and School 8 Employees Health Insurance Management Board, which shall administer the State and School Employees Life and Health 9 Insurance Plan provided for under Section 25-15-3 et seq. The 10 State and School Employees Health Insurance Management Board, 11 hereafter referred to as the "board," shall also be responsible 12 13 for administering all procedures for selecting third-party administrators provided for in Section 25-15-301. 14 15 (2) The board shall consist of the following: (a) The Chairman of the Workers' Compensation 16 17 Commission; 18 (b) The State Personnel Director; The Commissioner of Insurance; 19 (C) 20 (d) The Commissioner of Higher Education; 21 (e) The State Superintendent of Education; 22 (f) The Executive Director of the Department of Finance and Administration; 23 (g) Two (2) appointees of the Governor whose terms 24 shall be concurrent with that of the Governor, one (1) of whom 25 26 shall have experience in providing actuarial advice to companies 27 that provide health insurance to large groups and one (1) of whom *HR40/R1172PH* G1/2 H. B. No. 1324

shall have experience in the day-to-day management and 28 29 administration of a large self-funded health insurance group; 30 (h) The Chairman of the Senate Insurance Committee, or 31 his designee; 32 (i) The Chairman of the House of Representatives 33 Insurance Committee, or his designee; 34 (j) The Chairman of the Senate Appropriations Committee, or his designee; and 35 The Chairman of the House of Representatives 36 (k) Appropriations Committee, or his designee. 37

38 The legislators, or their designees, shall serve as ex 39 officio, nonvoting members of the board.

40 The Executive Director of the Department of Finance and 41 Administration shall be the chairman of the board.

(3) The board shall meet at least monthly and maintain minutes of such meetings. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the authorized voting membership of the board. The board shall have the sole authority to promulgate rules and regulations governing the operations of the insurance plans and shall be vested with all legal authority necessary and proper to perform this function including, but not limited to:

49 (a) Defining the scope and coverages provided by the50 insurance plan;

51 (b) Seeking proposals for services or insurance through 52 competitive processes where required by law and selecting service 53 providers or insurers under procedures provided for by law; and

54 (c) Developing and adopting strategic plans and budgets 55 for the insurance plan.

56 The department shall employ a State Insurance Administrator, 57 who shall be responsible for the day-to-day management and 58 administration of the insurance plan. The board shall employ a 59 Deputy State Insurance Administrator who shall be an actuary and a 60 member of the American Academy of Actuaries. The Deputy State H. B. Insurance Administrator shall have experience in providing 61 62 actuarial services to companies which provide health insurance to 63 large groups. The deputy administrator shall receive a salary set 64 by the board and shall not be subject to the authority of the 65 State Personnel Board for any purpose. The Department of Finance 66 and Administration shall provide to the board on a full-time basis personnel and technical support necessary and sufficient to 67 effectively and efficiently carry out the requirements of this 68 69 section.

Members of the board shall not receive any compensation 70 (4) 71 or per diem, but may receive travel reimbursement provided for under Section 25-3-41 except that the legislators shall receive 72 73 per diem and expenses which shall be paid from the contingent expense funds of their respective houses in the same amounts as 74 75 provided for committee meetings when the Legislature is not in session; however, no per diem and expenses for attending meetings 76 of the board shall be paid while the Legislature is in session. 77 78 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 79 and after July 1, 2005.
