HOUSE BILL NO. 1756

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 991, LOCAL AND PRIVATE LAWS OF 1997, 1 AS AMENDED BY CHAPTER 936, LOCAL AND PRIVATE LAWS OF 2001, TO EXTEND THE REPEAL DATE ON THE LAW THAT ESTABLISHES THE LAUDERDALE 2 3 COUNTY TOURISM COMMISSION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Chapter 991, Local and Private Laws of 1997, as 6 amended by Chapter 936, Local and Private Laws of 2001, is amended 7 as follows: 8 9 Section 1. (1) The Board of Supervisors of Lauderdale County, Mississippi, ("board of supervisors") is authorized and 10 empowered, in its discretion, to create, by resolution duly 11 adopted and entered on its minutes, the Lauderdale County Tourism 12 Commission ("commission"), as set forth in this act. 13 (2) The board of supervisors may empower the commission as 14 follows: 15 16 (a) To exercise activities related to establishing, 17 promoting and developing tourism within Lauderdale County 18 ("county"); 19 To acquire, own, lease, furnish, equip, staff and (b) operate any and all facilities and equipment necessary or useful 20 21 in the promotion of tourism within the county; (c) To receive and expend revenues from any sources 22 23 including, but not limited to, grants, donations, private enterprise, individuals, the county general fund and those 24 revenues provided by this act; 25 26 (d) To own, lease or contract for any equipment or 27 office space useful and necessary in the promotion of tourism and 28 convention business; \*HR03/R1945.1\* L3/5 H. (e) To sell, convey or otherwise dispose of all or any
part of its property and assets in accordance with general laws of
the State of Mississippi providing for such disposal; and

32 To have and exercise all powers necessary or (f) 33 convenient to effect any and all of the purposes for which the 34 commission is organized and, further, to appoint and employ individuals and agencies acting in its behalf for any and all of 35 the aforementioned powers and responsibilities. However, the 36 commission may not appoint or employ any individual or agency 37 38 unless the individual or agency is first approved by the board of 39 supervisors.

Section 2. (1) For the purposes of providing funds to 40 promote tourism and conventions in Lauderdale County, the board of 41 supervisors is authorized to levy and assess against and to 42 collect from every person, firm or corporation operating hotels or 43 motels in the county a tax in addition to all other taxes now 44 45 imposed, which shall not exceed a sum equal to two and one-half 46 percent (2-1/2%) of the gross proceeds from room rentals of all such hotels or motels in the county, excluding charges for food, 47 48 telephone, laundry, beverages and similar charges. The tax shall not be levied upon or collected from gross proceeds from room 49 50 rentals for day meetings where the room does not serve as overnight sleeping accommodations. Persons liable for the tax 51 imposed herein shall add the amount of tax to the room rental and 52 53 in addition thereto shall collect, insofar as practicable, the amount of tax due by him from the person receiving the services or 54 55 goods at the time of payment therefor.

56 (2) For the purposes of this act, the words "hotel" and 57 "motel" shall mean a place of lodging that at any one time will 58 accommodate transient guests on a daily or weekly basis and that 59 is known to the trade as such. Hotels and motels with ten (10) or 60 less rental units are exempt.

No. 1756 \*HRO3/R1945.1\* 05/HR03/R1945.1 PAGE 2 (TBT\LH) 61 (3) Such tax shall be collected by and paid to the State Tax 62 Commission on a form prescribed by the State Tax Commission in the 63 same manner that state sales taxes are computed, collected and 64 paid; and the full enforcement provisions and all other provisions 65 of Chapter 65, Title 27, Mississippi Code of 1972, shall apply as 66 necessary to the implementation and administration of this act.

67 (4) The proceeds of such tax, less three percent (3%) to be 68 retained by the State Tax Commission to defray the costs of 69 collection, shall be paid to the board of supervisors on or before 70 the fifteenth day of the month following the month in which 71 collected.

72 (5) The proceeds of the tax shall be deposited into the 73 general fund of the county and may be expended for any purpose 74 authorized by law for expenditures of county general fund money, 75 including the purpose of carrying out the programs and activities 76 of the commission under the provisions of this act; however, 77 accounting for receipts and expenditures of the proceeds of the 78 tax shall be made separately as provided in Section 8 of this act. 79 Section 3. (1) The Lauderdale County Tourism Commission 80 shall be composed of seven (7) members, appointed as hereinafter provided. The board of supervisors shall appoint three (3) 81 82 members of the commission; the City Council of the City of Meridian, Mississippi, ("city council") shall appoint three (3) 83 members of the commission; and the Board of Aldermen of the Town 84 85 of Marion, Mississippi, ("board of aldermen") shall appoint one (1) member of the commission. The commission shall be appointed 86 87 within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this act, in the 88 following manner:

89 (a) Board of supervisors: three (3) members for terms
90 of one (1), two (2) and three (3) years respectively.

91 (b) City council: three (3) members for terms of one92 (1), two (2) and three (3) years respectively.

95 (2) All subsequent appointments shall be made for terms of
96 three (3) years, except that the appointing bodies shall appoint a
97 member to fill a vacancy for the unexpired term only.

98 (3) Before entering on the duties of the office, each member of the commission shall enter into and give bond to be approved by 99 100 the Secretary of State of the State of Mississippi in the sum of 101 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), conditioned on the satisfactory performance of his duties. This bond's premium shall 102 103 be paid from the commission's funds. Such bond shall be payable 104 to the county and in the event of a breach thereof, suit may be 105 brought by the county for the benefit of the commission.

106 The members of the commission shall serve without salary (4) 107 or compensation, but the members, staff and employees of the 108 commission may be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses, including mileage and travel expenses, whether within or without 109 110 the State of Mississippi, incurred in the performance of their duties, as authorized by Section 25-3-41, Mississippi Code of 111 112 1972. The commission shall elect officers and adopt rules and regulations and shall fix a regular meeting date, but may provide 113 114 for special meetings. The commission shall keep minutes of its proceedings as necessary to carry out its responsibilities under 115 this act. A quorum of the commission shall consist of four (4) 116 117 members.

118 (5) Any member of the commission may be disqualified and 119 removed from office for any one (1) of the following reasons:

Conviction of a felony; or

121 (b) Failure to attend three (3) consecutive meetings

1987, as amended by Chapter 945, Local and Private Laws of 1991, 126 127 is not eligible to serve as an employee or as a member of the 128 commission. A present or former salaried employee or board member 129 of an entity created pursuant to Chapter 932, Local and Private 130 Laws of 1984, as amended by Chapter 848, Local and Private Laws of 131 1986, as amended by Chapter 945, Local and Private Laws of 1991, 132 is not eligible to serve as an employee or as a member of the commission if such person served as a salaried employee or board 133 134 member of the Meridian/Lauderdale County Partnership, created pursuant to Chapter 945, Local and Private Laws of 1991. A person 135 136 who served as a salaried employee or board member of the Meridian/Lauderdale County Partnership, created pursuant to 137 138 Chapter 945, Local and Private Laws of 1991, is not eligible to serve as an employee or as a member of the commission. 139

140 If a member of the commission is removed for one (1) of the 141 above reasons, the vacancy shall be filled in the manner 142 prescribed in this section.

143 The commission may employ a director and establish the (7)specific duties of the director, including day-to-day 144 145 administration and implementing policies established by the 146 commission. However, the commission may not employ any person as 147 director unless such person is first approved by the board of The director shall give bond in a sum not less than 148 supervisors. Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), conditioned upon the faithful 149 150 performance of his duties and made payable to and approved by the commission. The premium shall be paid from the commission's 151 152 funds. The director may employ staff or contract for staff and professional services with other organizations such as attorneys, 153 engineers, accountants, consultants and such personnel as 154 155 reasonably necessary to carry out the duties and powers authorized 156 by this act. However, the director may not employ any staff 157 unless such proposed employment is first approved by the board of 158 The director and staff of the commission shall serve supervisors. \*HR03/R1945.1\* H. 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at the will and pleasure of the board of supervisors. The maximum salary that may be paid to the director or any employee of the commission may not exceed one and one-half (1-1/2) times the maximum statutory salary for a member of the board of supervisors.

163 Section 4. The commission may, with the approval of the 164 board of supervisors, reserve, set aside or expend any or all of 165 the revenue derived from the tax set forth in Section 2 of this act, in addition to the revenues set forth in Sections 1 and 5 of 166 167 this act, for the purpose of defraying costs of construction, 168 acquisition, equipping, furnishing or other expenses of a 169 coliseum, multipurpose building or convention center which may be constructed by the board of supervisors, the Mayor and City 170 171 Council of the City of Meridian, Mississippi, and the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, Mississippi, acting 172 separately or jointly. 173

The commission may, with the approval of the board of supervisors, also use such revenues to defray any or all of the principal and interest of indebtedness incurred by any one or more of the board of supervisors or such governing authorities with regard to a coliseum, multipurpose building or convention center if each of the three (3) governing bodies so approve.

Section 5. Any and all remaining tourism revenue and other remaining tourism funds previously collected from tourism taxes by the Meridian/Lauderdale County Partnership shall be paid to the board of supervisors within ten (10) days of the effective date of this act. All revenue and funds paid pursuant to this section shall in all respects be considered revenue as contemplated by Section 1(2)(c) of this act.

187 Section 6. Before the tax authorized by this act shall be 188 imposed, the board of supervisors shall adopt a resolution 189 declaring its intention to levy the tax, setting forth the amount 190 of such tax and establishing the date on which this tax initially 191 shall be levied and collected. 05/HR03/R1945.1 PAGE 6 (TBT\LH) 192 the first day of the second month from the date of adoption of the 193 resolution, and shall become effective on the first day of such 194 month.

The resolution shall be published in a local newspaper at least twice during the period from the adoption of the resolution to the effective date of the tax prescribed in this act, with the last publication being made no later than ten (10) days before the effective date of such tax.

At least thirty (30) days before the effective date of the tax authorized herein, the board of supervisors shall furnish to the State Tax Commission a certified copy of the resolution evidencing such tax.

204 Section 7. Before the expenditure of funds herein 205 prescribed, a budget reflecting the anticipated receipts and expenditures for such purposes as promotion, advertising and 206 207 operation shall be approved by the board of supervisors. The 208 first budget of receipts and expenditures shall cover the period 209 beginning with the effective date of the tax and ending with the end of the county's fiscal year, and thereafter, the budget shall 210 211 be on the same fiscal basis as the budget of the county.

212 Section 8. Accounting for receipts and expenditures of the 213 funds herein described shall be made separately from the accounting of receipts and expenditures of the commission and from 214 215 the general fund and any other funds of the county. The 216 commission shall have its books and records audited annually by an independent certified public accountant regarding the receipt and 217 218 expenditure of funds prescribed in this act. The audit shall be 219 performed in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards 220 and the financial statements shall be prepared in accordance with 221 generally accepted accounting principles. The audit shall be completed within six (6) months after the close of the 222 223 commission's fiscal year. The audit report shall include 224 supplemental schedules of expenditures for items such as \*HR03/R1945.1\* H. B. No. 1756 05/HR03/R1945.1

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consulting fees, travel, salaries, legal, audit, etc., showing for 225 each individual expenditure (1) to whom the expenditure was made, 226 (2) the expenditure amount and (3) an explanation of why the 227 228 expenditure was made. The commission shall file a written report 229 of the audit with the circuit clerk of the county, and with the Lauderdale County Legislative Delegation of the Mississippi House 230 231 of Representatives and the State Senate. The expenses of such 232 audit may be paid from the funds derived pursuant to Section 1, 2 or 5 of this act. 233

234 Section 9. This act shall stand repealed from and after 235 October 1, <u>2009</u>.

236 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 237 and after its passage.
