- 1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING CHARLES W. (CHARLIE) CAPPS, JR., FOR HIS MANY YEARS OF OUTSTANDING AND DEDICATED SERVICE TO THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI AND WISHING HIM 3
- 4 WELL UPON HIS RETIREMENT.
- 5 WHEREAS, Charles W. (Charlie) Capps, Jr., of the Mississippi
- House of Representatives, is completing thirty-three years of 6
- consecutive service as a member of the House from District 28, 7
- which includes Bolivar, Sunflower and Washington Counties; and 8
- 9 WHEREAS, born on January 1, 1925, in Cleveland, Mississippi,
- Representative Capps, a World War II veteran having served in the 10
- Pacific Theater, joined the United States Army in June 1943 as a 11
- private and was discharged as a First Lieutenant in September 12
- 1946; and 13
- 14 WHEREAS, Representative Capps attended Culver Military
- Academy in Indiana, Davidson College in North Carolina and earned 15
- 16 an undergraduate degree in business from the University of
- 17 Mississippi in 1967 before beginning his career as a public
- 18 servant; and
- WHEREAS, after serving as Sheriff of Bolivar County, he began 19
- his service as a legislator when elected to the membership of the 20
- Mississippi House of Representatives in 1971; and 21
- 22 WHEREAS, the talents and ability of Charlie Capps were
- 23 recognized by the legislative leadership as evidenced by his

- 25 Constitution Committee, then to his 1988 appointment as Chairman
- 26 of the House Appropriations Committee, and his recent 2004
- 27 reappointment as Chairman of Constitution; and
- 28 WHEREAS, the most senior member of the House, affectionately
- 29 known in the Capitol as "Mr. Chairman" for his many years leading
- 30 Appropriations, he also serves on the Appropriations, Agriculture,
- 31 Enrolled Bills, Military Affairs and Tourism Committees; and
- 32 WHEREAS, Chairman Capps has been especially active in
- 33 promoting education at all levels and in industrial development at
- 34 both state and local levels, having participated in
- 35 investment-seeking trade missions to Japan and other far eastern
- 36 countries; and
- 37 WHEREAS, known by his colleagues as an able and dedicated
- 38 legislator who has effectively represented the citizens of his
- 39 district and state, Chairman Capps was honored by Delta State
- 40 University with the dedication of the Charles W. Capps, Jr.,
- 41 Archives and Museum in Cleveland; Charles W. Capps, Jr.,
- 42 Technology Center at Mississippi Delta Community College; Lake
- 43 Charlie Capps; Representative Charles W. Capps, Jr., National
- 44 Guard Armory located on Charlie Capps Road in Cleveland; Charles
- 45 W. Capps, Jr., Crisis Intervention Center in Cleveland; and
- 46 Charles W. Capps, Jr., Entrepreneurial Center in Stoneville; and
- WHEREAS, Chairman Capps' love and deeply felt respect for the
- 48 Legislature as an institution has led him to fight to preserve and
- 49 nurture its integrity, becoming a guardian of this democratic
- 50 institution during a time in Mississippi's history when the
- 51 diversity of the House membership expanded to include meaningful
- 52 participation by women, African Americans and Republicans, as well
- 53 as the majority group of Democrats; and
- 54 WHEREAS, Chairman Capps' leadership abilities have been
- 55 recognized nationally, as evidenced by his serving as Chairman of
- 56 the Southern Legislative Conference (SLC) of the Council of State

- of the Southern Regional Education Board, as a member of the SLC

- WHEREAS, in addition to serving in the Mississippi House of
- 63 Representatives, Chairman Capps is president of Capps
- 64 Insurance-Real Estate and Capps Farms, Inc., a successful farmer
- 65 and a director of the Sunburst Banking System; and
- 66 WHEREAS, Chairman Capps is known as a "Gentleman Statesman"
- 67 possessing a congenial nature, the ability to listen effectively
- 68 and a good sense of humor -- qualities which have enabled him to
- 69 resolve volatile and controversial situations; and
- 70 WHEREAS, in addition to his career as a successful
- 71 businessman and statesman, Chairman Capps has been a faithful
- 72 member of the Methodist Church, as well as a devoted husband to
- 73 the late Mrs. Allen Hobbs Capps, and father of three children,
- 74 Alinda Sledge, Margaret Allen and Charlie Capps III, and eight
- 75 grandchildren, who have supported him in all of his endeavors; and
- 76 WHEREAS, Chairman Capps has indicated that he will retire on
- 77 June 30th of this year and the members of the Mississippi
- 78 Legislature wish to express their sincere appreciation to "Mr.
- 79 Chairman" for his dedicated service to the people of the State of
- 80 Mississippi and for the personal sacrifices that he has made on
- 81 their behalf:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 83 REPRESENTATIVES, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN, That we do hereby
- 84 commend our friend and colleague, "Mr. Chairman," Charles W.
