## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 32

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE ST. ANDREWS  
2 EPISCOPAL SCHOOL SAINTS FOOTBALL TEAM FOR THEIR OUTSTANDING SEASON  
3 OF PLAY FOR 2004 AND WINNING THE DISTRICT VI CLASS 2A  
4 CHAMPIONSHIP.

5 WHEREAS, the St. Andrews Episcopal School Saints Football  
6 Team finished the 2004 season with an impressive, undefeated  
7 record of 10-0 in regular season play, winning the District VI  
8 Class 2A Championship; and

9 WHEREAS, the 2004 Saints team made their mark in the school's  
10 record book by tying the school's record for the most wins and  
11 clinching the team's first undefeated regular season since 1993;  
12 and

13 WHEREAS, the Saints climaxed their season of play with an  
14 11-game winning streak, finishing the season with an 11-1 record,  
15 before losing in the second round of the state playoffs; and

16 WHEREAS, led by five seniors, Brent Smith, Brian Gladney,  
17 Alan Landrum, David Drake and Japanese exchange student, Taka  
18 Naragino, many individual honors have been bestowed upon various  
19 team members in recognition of their fine, dedicated and superior  
20 play and their hard work this season, including: the naming of  
21 Brent Smith to *The Clarion-Ledger* All-Metro First Team; the  
22 selection of Conway Craig as second ranked passer in Class 2A; the  
23 naming of Martin Edwards as lead kicker in Class 2A and the  
24 selection of standout sophomore running back Bradford Blackmon as  
25 Most Valuable Player for District VI Class 2A and named to the  
26 Mississippi Association of Coaches All-State Second Team; and

27 WHEREAS, during his two years of varsity play at St. Andrews,  
28 Bradford Blackmon has scored 45 touchdowns, completed 349 rushes,

29 compiled 2,560 yards, ranked fourth in rushing in the State Class  
30 2A division, set a school record with 222 points in 12 games,  
31 averaging 18.5 points per game and scored the second most points  
32 of any player in the state in all classifications; and

33 WHEREAS, the Saints have been superbly coached and inspired  
34 by Head Coach David Bradberry and Assistant Coaches Dan Roach, Joe  
35 Ray and Gerald McCall, who have broadened the team's knowledge of  
36 the game and refined their skills in execution; and

37 WHEREAS, Coach Bradberry, whose overall coaching record  
38 stands at 149-57, has compiled an 18-5 record at St. Andrews since  
39 becoming head coach in 2003; and

40 WHEREAS, in addition to excelling on the field, the Saints  
41 also display superior prowess in the classroom to achieve academic  
42 excellence with 19 honor roll students; and

43 WHEREAS, a self-disciplined and self-motivated team, the  
44 Saints have been supported in their athletic endeavors and can  
45 attribute much of their success to the many parents, fans and  
46 supporters whose moral and spiritual encouragement have remained  
47 fervent throughout the season; and

48 WHEREAS, they have developed a winning and cooperative spirit  
49 and a high degree of sportsmanship, and their activities and  
50 attitude reflect great credit upon the individual players and  
51 their coaches and bring honor to St. Andrews Episcopal School; and

52 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to  
53 recognize and commend excellence, especially when evidenced by the  
54 youth of our state, who are its future:

55 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF  
56 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby  
57 commend and congratulate the St. Andrews Episcopal School Saints  
58 Football Team and their coaches, Head Coach David Bradberry and  
59 Assistant Coaches Dan Roach, Joe Ray and Gerald McCall, for their  
60 phenomenal 2004 season, for winning the District VI Class 2A

61 Championship and for displaying tireless devotion to their  
62 athletic endeavors.
