## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 69 (As Adopted by the House)

1 2 3	A RESOLUTION URGING THE MISSISSIPPI SENATE TO JOIN THE MISSISSIPPI HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES IN RAISING REVENUES FOR THE STATE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2006.
4	WHEREAS, the Mississippi Legislature is facing a budget
5	crisis of unprecedented magnitude for fiscal year 2006, which will
6	greatly jeopardize the essential services provided by all areas of
7	state government, particularly in public education, Medicaid,
8	mental health and public safety, if no action is taken; and
9	WHEREAS, the House of Representatives recognizes that this
10	financial crisis $\underline{\text{will}}$ require severe, even Draconian, cuts in the
11	present levels of funding for state government, and the House
12	believes that the enormity of the cuts would negatively impact
13	each and every Mississippianyoung and old, rich and poor, male
14	and female, Black and White, north to southsparing no one from
15	the effects of the cuts; and
16	WHEREAS, if the Legislature fails to raise revenues at the
17	state governmental level, it is likely that our local governmental
18	entities will be required to raise property and other taxes at the
19	<pre>local level; and</pre>
20	WHEREAS, during the 2005 Regular Session, the House has
21	adopted and passed to the Senate several measures that would have
22	mitigated the severity of those cuts by raising revenues from
23	various sources, and those measures sent by the House to the
24	Senate have all died in the Senate without favorable

House Bill 410, sent to the Senate on February 2, 2005, which

would have increased the current taxes on cigarettes and other

consideration, and are as follows:

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tobacco products, to raise revenues of approximately $120 million
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- 29 for fiscal year 2006;
- House Bill 1409, sent to the Senate on February 11, 2005, 30
- 31 which would have provided for new and increased fees to be charged
- 32 by state agencies for services rendered, to raise revenues of
- 33 approximately \$55.7 million for fiscal year 2006;
- House Concurrent Resolution 85, sent to the Senate on March 34
- 10, 2005, which would have allowed the introduction of a new bill 35
- to raise revenue through increasing taxes on cigarettes and other 36
- 37 tobacco products, to attempt once more to raise revenues for
- 38 fiscal year 2006 by a tobacco tax; and
- WHEREAS, if the Senate had adopted these measures, the 39
- 40 increased revenues that would have been raised for specific needs
- would have freed up other funds in the State General Fund that 41
- could have been used to mitigate the harshness of the cuts which 42
- definitely will have to occur if no significant revenues are 43
- 44 raised for the next fiscal year; and
- 45 WHEREAS, on March 22, 2005, philanthropist Jim Barksdale
- offered this state a \$50,000,000.00 endowment, to be placed in 46
- 47 escrow to provide a financial incentive directly to our young
- 48 citizens to encourage them to graduate from high school and attend
- 49 college, on the condition that the Legislature fully fund the
- Mississippi Adequate Education Program and the teacher pay raise, 50
- and the House believes that it is in the best interest of our 51
- 52 constituents to accept this generous offer, which will require
- that additional revenues be raised for public education in fiscal 53
- 54 year 2006; and
- WHEREAS, the House is willing to continue working on any 55
- reasonable measures that would provide additional revenues to fund 56
- 57 the essential services of state government and is committed to
- 58 reducing appropriations to all aspects of state government where
- 59 such reductions can be reasonably made, and we urge our Senate
- colleagues to be open-minded about increasing revenues and join 60

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- 61 the House in adopting such measures, including those that the
- 62 House has already sent to them earlier this session:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 64 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we respectfully
- 65 request the leadership and members of the Senate to take whatever
- 66 actions necessary to adopt measures that will provide additional
- 67 revenues to fund the essential services of state government during
- 68 fiscal year 2006, including measures already transmitted to the
- 69 Senate by the House earlier this session.
