8	SECTION 1. Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

11	peace officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi
12	Highway Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any
13	type of radar speed detection equipment upon any public street,
14	road or highway of this state. However, such equipment may be
15	used:
16	(i) By municipal law enforcement officers within a
17	municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more
18	upon the public streets of the municipality;
19	(ii) By any college or university campus police
20	force within the confines of any campus wherein more than two
21	thousand (2,000) students are enrolled;
22	(iii) By municipal law enforcement officers in any
23	municipality having a population in excess of fifteen thousand
24	(15,000) according to the latest federal census on federally
25	designated highways lying within the corporate limits:

30	1. Under the jurisdiction of the county board
31	of supervisors for maintenance and construction; and
32	2. Located outside the corporate limits of a
33	municipality.
34	(b) all fines for speed violations that are imposed as
35	a result of the use of radar authorized in this subparagraph (iv)
36	shall be deposited into the State General Fund.
37	(2) The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol shall not set up
38	radar on highways within municipalities with a population in
39	excess of fifteen thousand (15,000) according to the latest
40	federal census.
41	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
